

A Victorian volunteer collective forefront of invasive pest management has been announced as Community Award winners in the Australian Biosecurity Awards in Canberra.

Partnering Agriculture Victoria, the four Community Pest Management Groups ioined forces to deliver the Weeds and Rabbits project to improve the way pest animals and weeds are managed in Victoria.

"We salute the work of this team of volunteers who've shown exactly what can be done when community is at the centre of invasive pest management," Agriculture Victoria Director Plants, Chemicals and Invasives, Sharyn Williams said.






