WEBB WINS!

Morgan Webb salutes the crowd after his fourth Challenge win.

The 2024 Man From Snowy River Bush Festival attracted record crowds on Friday and Saturday night in a celebration of Australian bush heritage.

In all, 27 separate events provided a range

of entertainment that exceeded all expectations.

Festival chairman, Cameron Jackson, said that it had "returned with a vengeance" after being

impacted by the 2019-20 bushfires and the

pandemic.

"Anyone that comes here for one year knows that they're not going to see it all so they come back year after year," he said.

"We've had a lot of campers but then we've had an extraordinarily high number of day passes purchased as well."

The live concert on Friday night drew an estimated crowd of 8000 while the Wrangler Xtreme Broncs Australia rodeo on Saturday night

was attended by a record 10,000 people.

"People come her to see the best of the best, absolutely magnificent riders," Mr Jackson said.

This also applied to the festival's premier event, the Stockmen's Challenge, with the cream of Australia's horsemen and horsewomen competing for more than \$100,000 in money and prizes.

Another large crowd packed the arena banks on Sunday afternoon to see the Top 10 contestants vie

for the prestigious title in the final two events - the Wild Horse Catch and Stocksaddle Buckjump - worth a total of 200 points.

Three-time winner, Morgan Webb, entered the finals with a 46-point lead over 2023 victor, Travis Bandy.

The defending champion peeled off a score of 81 points in the horse catch but Webb placed second with a 76-point effort, leaving him still in the lead.

The buckjump was an enthralling contest with Bandy posting a 72-point ride to share the event honours with two other locals, Brad Pierce and David Mitchell.

However, Webb also 'beat time' on his bronc to record 65 points and secure his fourth Challenge victory; after first saluting in 2009 and then going back-to-back in 2021 and 2022.

He pocketed \$30,000 cash and almost \$7000 in prizes for his win.

It may have been a 'new' name on the honour board in the Ladies Challenge but after four previous wins Christy Davidson (formerly Connor) made it a fistful of victories.

Davidson held off Alison Mathie and popular local Anna Paton in the last event, the Wild Horse Catch to notch her fifth championship.

Davidson held a slender 10-point lead at the time but her catch was the fastest of the final and ensured her title win.

Davidson won the event in 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2013. However, she has some ground to make up to match the outstanding record of Emma O'Shea who won eight successive Ladies' titles from 2014 but did not compete this year.

A 74 point winning run in the final event was enough for Mackenzie Dunn to capture the Junior Challenge from Bill Phegan who pipped Darcy Dall'aglio.

The Striplings Challenge was won by Jorgie Sturt from Edward Smith and Ryder Pierce, who looks destined for higher honours after saluting in the Mini Stripling Challenge.

“We have a terrific caller who will be nimbly plying his trade and will engender

fluidic movement and spontaneous dance. No previous dancing ability will be required. Just bring yourself and be amazed and enthralled in an entertaining evening.”

Dancing interludes will be filled with old time entertainment and cups of punch for a dollar will be available at these times. A light supper will be served later in the evening.

Council undertakes customer survey

A new community survey is set to gauge community satisfaction with Snowy Valleys Council’s services and facilities.

The telephone survey will ask residents to have their say on everything from waste collection to swimming pools, as well as their interactions with councillors, staff and management.

Independent researcher Taverner Research Group will conduct the phone

survey on behalf of council from 22 April to mid-May 2024.

Approximately 400 residents will be randomly selected to take part in the survey.

Phone calls will be carried out between 4pm and 8.30pm weekdays and 10am to 4pm on weekends.

Locals should watch out for a call from phone number (02) 9194 0715 if they would like to be involved and have their opinions heard.

There is also an online survey that people can access independently via council’s website which will go live on 22 April.

Results from the survey will be benchmarked against results obtained from previous surveys.

The survey results are used to inform and improve operational decision making as well as to meet reporting obligations as part of council’s Integrated Planning and Reporting framework.

The 2024 'Artist of the Year' prize was awarded to Gayle Lee (pictured).

Corryong CBD Update



Preparations are underway to resume work on the Corryong CBD Streetscape project from Monday, 22 April.

Our first priority will be decommissioning two underground fuel tanks. While this is underway, we'll also be conducting soil testing around the remaining tanks to assess contamination levels, which will dictate any necessary soil removal. For safety reasons, pedestrian access will be restricted in these areas during the testing and decommissioning phase. Once the tanks are decommissioned, work will continue on Stage 2 of the project.

We're also getting ready to begin work on the east bound side of Hanson Street, from the Memorial Hall to the Man from Snowy River Arcade. The updated plans for this side of the street, which incorporate increased parking bay depth, are currently with VicRoads for review and approval. We are planning to commence demolition work in the coming weeks. We will confirm the start date of this work for affected businesses as soon as possible.

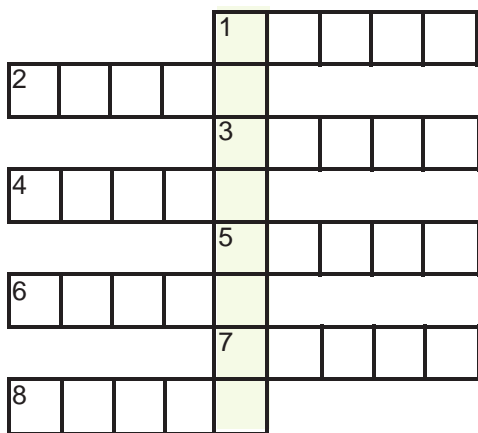

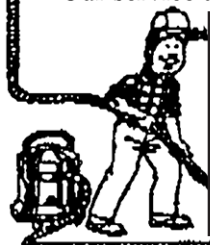

Blues chase back-to-back flags

Defending premiers Cudgewa will start as favourites when the 2024 Upper Murray season starts on Saturday.

The Blues have retained the bulk of last year's team that went undefeated through the 2023 season including a 94-point demolition of Bullioh in the grand final.

League best and fairest winner, Josh Bartel, has taken over the co-coaching role with Dayne Carey while former mentor and key forward, Drew Cameron, has left the club.

Clever goal sneak Jason Bartel has returned to his former club Kiewa-Sandy Creek in the Tallangatta league and best and fairest winner, Darcy McKimmie, has transferred to Mitta.

Offsetting those losses has been the recruitment of Cameron O'Neill from Barnawatha (pictured), a four-time Tallangatta league best and fairest

winner, who will be a sensation at the lower level.

The Blues still boast the best forward line in the competition, spearheaded by the winner of the 2023 *Corryong Courier* goalkicking award, Adam Prior, alongside Nick Brockley and the long-kicking Bartel.

This firepower, combined with a midfield that runs deep and a miserly defence, means Cudgewa could conceivably post consecutive undefeated seasons.

Bullioh will be the Blues' closest rivals again but it is difficult to see the Bulldogs making up sufficient ground to depose the Blues as flag favourites.

Clint Brunnemeyer will lead the Dogs and early signings included

Joe Bolton, Jordan Peters, Jack Wilson and Jye Hodgkin from Mitta plus a key defender in Rick Thompson. Gun forward Ash Murray has also committed to pull on the tri-colours in 2024.

Tumbarumba, under the guidance of premiership players Jim Waters and Wade McPherson, will be keen to atone for a disappointing 2023 season after winning its second senior premiership the year before.

After a winless season in 2023, Corryong still made the 1st semi in the four-club competition but suffered a 145 point thrashing from Bullioh.

New coach, Dan McCarthy, has his work cut out for him in the Demons' quest to climb the ladder.

McCarthy won the



league's best and fairest award in 2017 when playing for Border-Walwa and is expected to bring several players with him from other district leagues. *Netball preview - page 6. R1 20/4/24 Cudgewa v Bullioh Tumbarumba v Corryong*
