In an open letter to the sporting community (Corryong Courier, March 17, 2022), the Swans appealed for local support but their plea failed to boost playing numbers.

Poppies represent the individual's spirit

Mural artist, Simon White, was back in Corryong recently to add a mural to the Memorial Hall wall adjacent to the garden - just in time for Anzac Day.

He had prepared himself thoroughly with magnificent concept drawing and he is a fast worker! Two days before Easter he created a striking mural of a field of poppies.

The scene could be a WWI battlefield on the Western Front depicted beneath the slightly misty summer skies of northern France. The mural shows the poignant silhouette of a soldier, standing in mourning before a temporary wooden cross used to mark the graves of the fallen before the Commonwealth

Graves cemeteries.

Rather than the formulaic poppy designs that seem to proliferate at many of our commemorations, Simon has created a quality artwork which encourages people to take inspiration and strength from aesthetic beauty and its relationship to the natural world.

Like military units,

poppies have a similarity but again, just like people, they are all different too, with their petals picking up different currents in the breeze. Some people think this individuality reflects the individuality in mankind and particularly among service personnel.

If some think the images of the poppies and daisies are too large, this is because the mural needs

to be visible from most places in the gardens and from Donaldson Street, thus drawing people in to

The mural could well remind us of the power of Remembrance, not just of our fallen but those from all walks of life and ethnic groups who have served our community faithfully and made us what we are today. The mural might even remind and encourage everyone to believe that their community needs each and every person and their contributions.

For Anzac Day 2022, poppies will bring the unspoken memories into our midst - poppies often embody the memories the unspoken words in Anzac Day commemorations. spirit of Anzac is made up of an infinite number of stories and the number will grow as long as Australian service personnel continue to serve in some of the world's many trouble

Poppies first became associated with the fallen and Remembrance during Each summer WWI. poppies grew in the most unlikely places on battlefields and ruins of buildings and they still do. As well as reminding us of loss, poppies are symbolic of regeneration.

In 1915 the Canadian doctor, John McCrae, in his poem 'In Flanders Fields' drew attention to the link

between poppies and the fallen in the well known

'In Flanders fields the poppies blow, between the crosses, row on row'.

Soldiers used pick poppies on the battlefields and some, perhaps wanting to hold a particular moment in their memories, pressed them between the pages of field notebooks and poetry and prayer books. Others wanting to send something beautiful to loved ones, pressed poppies and or wildflowers between the pages of letters, only to find that once picked, the blooms were fragile and disintegrated.

Local historian, John Murphy, tells a story about Charlie Lebner who, some years after he returned from WWI, found poppies growing in a gully on Mt Elliot. Apparently he attributed the blooms to another ex-serviceman who had picked them on the battlefield and thrust the blooms into his tunic pocket.

Unwittingly, on his return when he was wearing his tunic for warmth, he decided to turn out his pockets and in doing so, scattered the seed!

Possibly Charlie was telling his own story anonymously and that he was the person who had scattered poppy seeds to create a place to where he could retreat with his memories.

Such was the grief

after WWI that in 1922 the Royal British Legion began to make poppies as symbols of Remembrance of the Fallen. The practice soon spread across the Commonwealth.

The carnage of the WWII and loss of life in subsequent conflicts have further emphasised the red poppy's symbolism in commemoration. People have tried to grow poppies in their gardens, only to find that despite the fragility of the blooms, poppies flourish in the most unlikely places.

Some people and particularly our elderly retired service personnel see poppies as free spirits, perhaps those of loved ones, blowing in the breeze. And so it is that poppies inspire reflection and bring comfort to the bereaved and even to those whose minds are troubled as a result of their service or some of life's other challenges.

Remembrance is for all of us. Everyone has a back-story, no matter from what walk of life they come.

Corryong and the Upper Murray's stories are as rich as anyone's. Pick a name from the role of local people who served their country from the Upper Murray and research their

The restoration project was a labour of love for owner and regular visitor to the Upper Murray, Ian O'Brien, who spent 12 years meticulously bringing the classic vehicle back to its former glory.

Donations fund life saving gear



Generous community donations from the 2019/20 bushfires will fund more than 200 breathing apparatus (BA) sets to CFA brigades across the state – some receiving the capability for the first time.

Thanks to the donations, the CFA and Brigades Donations Trust is allocating \$2.25m to purchase this important equipment which improves capability and protects the health and safety of firefighters at incidents.

The overall project cost \$2.75m, with some brigades choosing to co-fund the project, expanding the program by

nearly 20 per cent.

Chief Officer, Jason Heffernan, said the project funded one BA set and in some cases the brigade funded the second set.

"The additional funding support from brigades allowed us to extend the scope from 200 BA sets to a total of 234 BA sets and 468 BA cylinders," Mr Heffernan said.

"These are currently being delivered to 116 brigades across the state which will then be installed into their fire trucks.

"At the end of the rollout, 514 brigades will have BA with 43 of

those brigades receiving the capability for the first time."

"BA provides important protection to our firefighters' airways from harmful products at fires and other incidents," he said.

"This is critically important for their wellbeing and safety and I thank the community for their generosity."

Chair of the CFA and Brigades Donations Fund, Graeme Jilbert, said it's great to see the community donations going towards such an important project which focuses on increasing the safety of our firefighters.

Even in cold and dank conditions, the audience still brought their chairs, oilskin coats and hats to enjoy varied entertainment where everyone is welcome. Poets on 'L' plates shakily read from scraps of paper alongside stars of the poetry world who love to catch up with fellow poets and share their mutual love of rhyming metered verses in the style of Paterson, Lawson,

et al and of course, that wonderful bush poet - Ann Nonymous!

"The festival is a kaleidoscope of bush skills, horse events, utes, re-enactment of Banjo Paterson's poem, art and photography, along with music and verse and it encapsulates and celebrates all which wonderful friendship in Australia and it connects traditional bush skills with modern ones celebrating good, old fashioned values," said poetry co-ordinator, Jan Lewis.





Former Border-Walwa coach, Craig Bosley, takes the reins at Bullioh which also sat 5-3 before last season's halt and the frequent finalists will be prominent come season's end.

The Bulldogs have talent across all lines and their firepower and flexibility is likely to prove too much for the young Demons.
