History of war flag sought

The Australian Flag Society is continuing extensive enquiries about a New Zealand red ensign which was converted into an Australian red ensign during WWII, that is presently on loan from a kind donor.


The flag (pictured) bears the words "Changi '41 '42" on one star and "Chitty flag" on another.

It is thought to have been at the Changi prisoner-of-war camp during the fall of Singapore as the facility had previously been occupied by NZ forces.

Cudgewa-born Peter Chitty's connection to the flag is yet to be determined, however it is unlikely to have belonged to him personally as his sons have no recollection of a red ensign.

Instead, it may be the red ensign which is thought to have flown over the game of Australian Rules football where St Kilda player Chitty won the folkloric 'Changi Brownlow' medal that is now on display at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra.

Curator, Jane Peek, confirmed there is a Changi survivor on record as saying that the Japanese tolerated the keeping of burial flags and allowed





the prisoners to wash and hang them along fence lines to dry.

Also on loan are five whistles, including one that was manufactured in 1941 by Bell and Rider in Sydney and another that bears the inscription 'Changi football league'. The whistles were discovered inside a leather AFL ball and a basketball bearing the inscription 'Changi basketball league.'

"None of the inscriptions appear to be recent additions and taken altogether; the artifacts are difficult to dismiss as a

long-planned fraud," said Australian Flag Society CEO, Nigel Morris.

"It is my recommendation that these great and glorious relics of the Second World War go on public display in the hopes that amateur war historians can provide further information and materials concerning their provenance."



Community invited to lead the way forward

Applications are now open for this year's Upper Murray Community Leadership Program.

Returning for a third year, residents of the region are encouraged to explore the possibilities of the future and embark on a transformative journey of personal and collective capacity building.

Jo Mackinnon, Chair of Upper Murray Inc. (UMI), said "While the program focuses on leadership development, it is really so much more than that.

"Through the 2019-20 bushfires, we saw so many capable individuals iump in and contribute to the response and recovery process. It was a real case of community-led action, driven by the deep care that we know permeates through the fabric of our townships.

"As we moved through the recovery process, it became clear that if community members could be empowered to develop their capacity from a place of positivity, rather than driven by a negative event, they would be better able to determine their own futures and reimagine the future of the Upper Murray.

"From this viewpoint, we were able to work with various partners including Emergency Victoria to Recovery secure funding for this program. The end result is a win-win for all, because we know communities require so many different elements in order to thrive and this program really focuses on mindset and shared purpose, which are certainly key to that."

"The study tour to Tasmania is a real 'aha moment' for everyone, as it brings together the learnings from the earlier sessions in the program and takes participants on an immersive experience to see the theories in

"This year the tour will explore entrepreneurism, agriculture and innovation. It's an opportunity not to be missed, particularly for those on-farm and with an interest in learning more about what some of our leading producers are doing in their businesses; not only on the books but also their back paddocks.

"The program will also be using systems thinking to open up and explore the tricky nature of succession planning - individually, in organisations and businesses and in the community.'

Graduate of the 2023 program, Adele Miles, Corryong Neighbourhood Centre Youth Worker, said "I was motivated to undertake the leadership program to build on my skills to spread positivity and belonging among young people, especially in and around rural communities like Corryong.

"By being part of the program, I was able to improve my selfawareness and recognise my own qualities as a leader. I was introduced to a whole new way of thinking and encouraged to



use these skills wherever I can take them.

The program will run over 10 days from May through to October and includes a five-day study tour to Tasmania.

The program supported through partnership between Upper Murray Community Recovery Committee and UMI and is delivered by Alpine Valleys Community Leadership (AVCL). The initiative is made possible by major funding from Recovery Emergency Victoria and supports full funding for the program, with the exception of some personal travel costs.

AVCL Executive Officer, Madeline Hines, said "This is a great opportunity for anyone interested in building their own capacity and who might be interested in creating change, be it small or large either at home, in the workplace or out in the community.


"Past participants have

remarked that prior to undertaking the program, they didn't see themselves as a leader but through their experience, this outlook shifted. It certainly isn't limited by age, either. Past participants have ranged from 20s through to their 60s and we can never have too many skilled and capable individuals who want to increase their skills and in turn can contribute to the cause of developing the Upper Murray.



Corryong CBD Update

The CBD Streetscape project isn't just about new wider footpaths and street furniture. We are also replacing the water main that runs underground between the Donaldson and Jardine Street roundabouts.

The water main was expected to need replacing in the next few years. Replacing it now saves us having to dig up and reinstate the newly laid footpath in the near future.

We have worked closely with North East Water to incorporate the replacement of this critical infrastructure into the project and they have also provided a financial contribution for the works.

You may have noticed the contractors digging a long, narrow trench through the parking bays on the east bound side of the street. This is where the new water main will be located. Placing the water main under the roadway, instead of under the footpath, makes it much easier to access the main and reinstate the roadway (instead of the footpath) should it be necessary at any time in the future.

Connection to the new water main is expected to take place shortly after The Man From Snowy River Bush Festival. Businesses and others who may be affected will receive advice on timelines directly from North East Water prior to being moved across to the new water main. Once the connection to the new water main is complete the old water main will be decommissioned in situ.






