Drink drivers dodge gaol

Following a recent crack down by local police several men faced the Corryong Magistrates Court last Friday on drink drive charges.

Four separate matters were heard where offenders with prior convictions for driving while suspended narrowly avoided incarceration and were given Community Correction Orders.

Another man also came

close to imprisonment for drink driving and was fined \$800 with his licence cancelled for 12 months following a car accident.

Another man was convicted for driving while disqualified and drink driving and was fined \$750 and had his disqualification extend by a further month.

a further month. In related news, Victoria Police is warning motorists to take extra care on the roads this Easter with three fatal collisions already recorded in the first three days of April. Operation Nexus,

Operation Nexus, launching at midnight today, will see police ramp up enforcement across the state in an effort to reduce road trauma.

It follows a shocking start to the year which saw 37 lives lost on Victorian roads in January, one of the worst months in recent years.

So far this year there have been 87 lives lost statewide, up 33 per cent on last year. Assistant Commissioner Road Policing, Glenn Weir, said "Easter is a high-risk period on our roads - it's a major holiday weekend that attracts significant travel across the state. "There have been 11 lives lost on Victorian roads over the last five Easter periods - that's 11 lives tragically cut short, instead of enjoying Easter with their families, friends and loved ones."



Clips dig deeper into our history

Corryong local, Vicki Kane, has created a YouTube channel titled 'Hidden History of the Upper Murray' which delves into past incidents and events in th region.

The channel was launched on the weekend and has already had more than 900 views and 25 subscriptions.

"With an increase of tourism due to Easter visitors and The Man from Snowy River Festival I wanted to create some clips that told more about the Upper Murray," Vicki said.

"We have such a rich history. It took resilience and community spirit to survive in this remote area."

Many of the articles focus on the use of horses in the town, such as a serious accident at the Lighthouse Crossing and the notorious hold-up at the Towong Races in 1927.

Popular clips have included war stories, explaining the presence of the Horrie statue and the hard work of the Red Cross in WWI. Of course, there is the newspaper article from the *Corryong Courier* that first reported Jack Riley's death to the world.

"I wanted to include all the sites and many businesses in the clip on Jack Riley since it will be very popular," Vicki said. "It isn't perfect but

in the short time I had to

make the channel I've tried to give a positive and interesting impression of the Upper Murray.

"I hope this will encourage people to explore our district. In the next year I plan on adding more stories and improving my technique to create a more polished finish to the videos."

In the next fortnight visitors and locals will notice posters of the articles with QR codes around te town. They can either read the article on the poster or listen to it via YouTube.

Communities feel a new energy

The North East is Australia's most active community energy region and Corryong is at the forefront of new technology.

Indigo Power is driving a number of new initiatives including building community energy hubs in towns across the North East and Southern NSW. It has partnered with 15

community energy groups, from Albury to Seymour, to deliver clean energy solutions, community energy hubs and local renewable generation and

storage. The loss of power in the Upper Murray during and after the 2019/2020 bushfires placed an additional strain on communities and emergency services and highlighted serious

deficiencies in the system. To address these issues, Indigo Power has partnered with Upper Murray Incorporated (UMI) to deliver the Upper Murray Place Based Power Plan - Energy Resilience and Reliability Project, a combination of solar, battery and generator systems which have been supplied and installed across 23 sites in the region. Three communityscale batteries are nearing completion at Corryong Health, the Corryong Recreation Reserve and Walwa Bush Nursing Centre.

These energy systems include large solar PV and community-sized battery systems.

There have been 20 energy nodes installed which are now providing renewable energy to host sites every day and are ready to supply backup power during the next emergency outage.

For some of the publicly accessible sites, there will also be communications available in the event of an emergency. This will allow communications with a broad range of redundancy including satellite NBN, 4G boosters and localised

communication solutions should there be the need.

Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) has issued a bluegreen algae Red Alert for Mannus Lake and warning signs are in effect at key recreational areas around the facility.

Red alert levels 'bloom' represent conditions. The water may appear green and may have strong, musty or organically polluted odours. Blue-green algae may be visible as clumps or as scums.

Local fire restrictions lifted

The Fire Danger Period (FDP) finished at 1am on Monday in the following municipalities in CFA's District 24:

• Towong Shire Council

Alpine Shire CouncilIndigo Shire CouncilRural City of

WodongaMt Hotham AlpineResort

• Falls Creek Alpine Resort

While restrictions are lifting in these areas, CFA still expects the grassfire risk to remain across the state in the coming months so Victorians need to remain alert and prepared.

CFA District 24 Chief Fire Assistant Officer, Adrian Gutsche, said recent rainfall and easing of weather the conditions means risk of fires has been reduced, posing а suitable opportunity to lift the fire danger period restrictions across the six municipalities.

"We're urging everyone to stay safe, whether you're living in or travelling to high bushfire risk areas," he said.

"Please monitor the conditions on hot, dry and windy days, as we may still see some days of elevated fire risk."

The end of the Fire Danger Period (FDP) will be an opportunity for some landowners to burnoff again, however it's important that residents check that local conditions are safe before undertaking these activities.

"You must register your burn-offs, check weather conditions and follow local council laws and regulations," ACFO Gutsche said.

"Registering your burnoff ensures that if smoke or fire is reported, the incident is crosschecked with our register, which prevents firefighters from unnecessarily responding. "When conducting burn-offs, remain alert
