Haines launches election campaign

Member for Indi, Helen Haines, launched her campaign for re-election at the 2022 federal election in Wodonga on Sunday in front of hundreds of supporters.

The federal election must be held by May 21 and the Prime Minister is expected to announce a date in the coming days.

Dr Haines laid out

a vision for Indi, of a prosperous regional community where people are set up not just to survive but to thrive.

"We want a community where, when you get old, you know you can get care at home and if you need it, you can find a place in residential aged care, close to home and you know you'll be cared for well

there," Dr Haines said.

"A community where you are not afraid of having no phone reception in a case of emergency.

"A community where we invest in education, local training and local manufacturing, so our kids can get the skills they need to find good jobs, close to home.

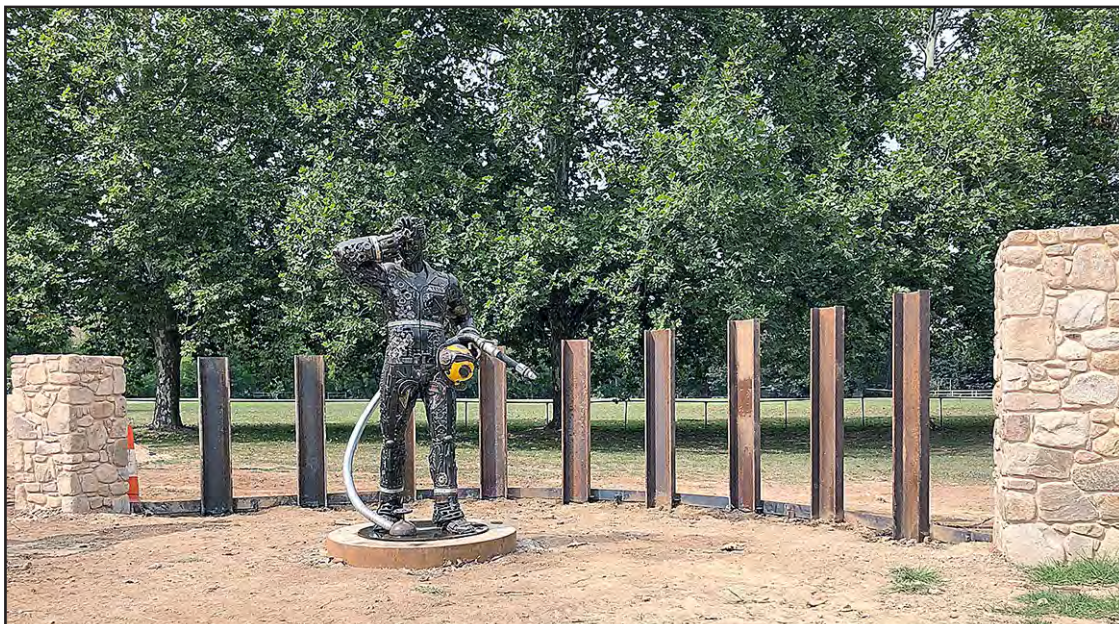

Sculpture honours firefighting spirit

Metal debris from the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires has been used in a sculpture at the entrance to the Jingellic Showgrounds which celebrates the heroism and determination shown by the volunteer firefighters of the district during the disaster.

The artwork - Flamin' Hell - was commissioned by the committee of management from acclaimed scrap metal artist, Andrew Whitehead, to be installed at the remodelled entrance to the showgrounds precinct.

An upgrade of the entrance to provide an aesthetically pleasing backdrop to the sculpture was also an aspect of the overall project.

The Jingellic Showgrounds facility was a major staging point for emergency services and a welfare centre for the community during the bushfires and in the recovery period.

The sculpture celebrates the heroism

and determination of the volunteer firefighters from the cross-border community, so it represents both CFA and RFS members.

The metal used in the sculpture included materials and relics found in the debris after the bushfires destroyed local properties, homes and farms.

The project also sought to engage and build the capacity of local artists to create 'found metal' sculptures, so the committee provided three scholarships to an Andrew Whitehead workshop to Tailla Briggs and Elise Hill in the Towong Shire and Jen Vinge in Snowy Valleys. From this, Ms Vinge was engaged to create a set of artistic gates to the precinct in a format that complemented the sculpture.

Another metal artist has been commissioned to create signage support panels and a signwriter has been engaged to add interpretive signs to detail

the story of Flamin' Hell.

The new entrance, part of the overall project, features stone pillars created from rock spewed off the slopes of the fire devastated mountains and metal uprights which create a supporting backdrop to the sculptural pieces and reflect rebuilding after devastation.

The project was first discussed with the artist in June 2020 and the committee collaborated with and involved community and local firefighters about the style and pose for Flamin' Hell.

However, work was delayed while Andrew Whitehead participated in the 'Making It' reality TV show and pandemic restrictions too effect.

Local Walwa stone mason, Tor Haugen, was particularly impacted as border closures wrought havoc with his schedule.

Construction of the sculpture commenced at the end of May 2021.

By September 2021 the

sculpture was complete but pandemic lockdowns and border issues had halted the construction of ancillary hard landscaping.

Finally, the planets aligned and the stonemason completed the pillars, the gates and the plinth were installed and on March 8th Flamin' Hell was installed on its final resting place.

The final aspects of installing beams as a backdrop for the sculpture and fence and the interpretive signage are expected to be completed this month.

Already, the numbers of visitors specifically coming to Jingellic to view the sculpture have been beyond expectation - even causing minor traffic jams in the small village!

The project was made possible with the assistance of funding partners Regional Art Fund, Border Trust, Rural Fire Service via Jingellic Rural Fire Service, Towong Shire and several private donors.

"A community where you can find a GP or a psychologist when you need one, where our doctors and nurses have everything they need to

care for you quickly and compassionately.

"And a thriving regional economy that builds on the best agriculture, the best forestry, the best local manufacturing, the most vibrant arts and the best tourism industry that this nation has to offer."

Dr Haines pledged to work with the people of

Indi to achieve that vision.

"If we don't work for better mental health support, especially for our young people, after the traumas of the last two years, when will we?" she queried.

"This is the moment to say to the nation that we have a vision for our communities, we have solutions and

opportunities, and we need fair, equitable and transformational investment free from partisan politics and we will vote for representation from one of us, with us, for us."

Dr Haines said in the electorate of Indi, people don't vote against something but for something.

Shaking a tin to make a difference

Threatened species benefit from grants

The Upper Murray Landcare Network was one of more than 60 groups that received funding to preserve threatened fauna species including Regent Honeyeaters, Platypus, Koalas and Greater Bilbies under the landmark WIRES Landcare Wildlife Relief and Recovery Grants Program.

One of the largest donation-driven wildlife grants programs in Australia and launched in April 2020, the program provided \$1.185 million to 49 bushfire recovery projects and 15 drought resilience projects which

were implemented by 64 landcare groups across the country.

More than 5000 people took part in the projects which saw almost 100,000 plants established, more than 1,900 nest boxes installed and 435 biodiversity surveys carried out.

The Upper Murray funding of \$19,000 was used to restore fire-affected habitat by providing landholders with plant remnants and fencing materials to protect it.

WIRES CEO, Leanne Taylor, hailed the outstanding results

delivered through the partnership.

"After one of the worst environmental disasters this landscape has ever known, the progress and results produced by the grants program are indicative of the connection and solidarity the Australian people have with our native species," she said.

"Committed to preserving Australian wildlife, habitat and local communities from the effects of climate change, this powerful union between our organisations represents the

overwhelming beneficial impact working together can achieve for wildlife, particularly threatened species."

Landcare Australia CEO, Dr Shane Norrish, applauded the work of the landcare volunteers and their local communities, saying that it demonstrated the strength of the movement.

"These projects showcase how passionate Australians are about protecting our wildlife and biodiversity," he said.

"An estimated three billion animals across Australia were impacted

by these catastrophic fires and these projects have been one of the first steps toward recovering from the disaster and building resilience for future events.

"Faced with the unprecedented challenges of the pandemic, landcarers across Australia have gone above and beyond to ensure these projects go ahead.

"We've seen a huge breadth of work including habitat revegetation for fire impacted animals to urgent control of post-fire weed growth and fencing of critical ecosystems."

River frontage opened for camp sites



Despite widespread objection, the Victorian government has announced that the first of hundreds of new riverside camping spots are now available online.

The sites are part of a 2018 election promise by the government to increase access for camping on Crown Land, with new sites open for camping from last Friday, with more to be added progressively in the coming weeks.

Up to 50 more will come online by the end of April, with newly available sites to be listed on the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) website once they are identified as suitable for camping. Further sites along the Goulburn, Broken, Ovens, Campaspe, Loddon, and Murray Rivers are currently being assessed for inclusion in the program.

The new sites can be accessed by foot from designated parking areas around the townships of Seymour, Tallarook, Murchison and Molesworth. Future sites may be able to be accessed by vehicles, depending on location.

"The sites are coming online gradually as part of a staged approach, following a comprehensive

consultation process where more than 1,100 submissions were received on draft regulations," said Minister for Fishing and Boating, Melissa Horne.

"Rigorous public land value assessments were conducted by DELWP to ensure the sites are safe and are followed by traditional owner assessments of each site to ensure they are culturally appropriate for camping."

The public can already lawfully access licensed river frontages for recreation such as fishing, hiking, and picnicking.

"The regulations governing camping on Crown Land sites are enforced by DELWP, the Victorian Fisheries Authority and Parks Victoria to ensure the protection of the environment, Aboriginal cultural heritage, farm businesses and recreational users," Ms Horne said.

Licenseses and adjoining landowners are also considered.

A 24-hour hotline (13FISH) is available for the public to report any illegal or antisocial behaviour.

Transformers get a new lease of life

Snowy Hydro is carrying out a large project to refurbish the Murray 1 Power Station generator step-up transformers, a process that will significantly extend the life of these important assets.

Reconditioning and replacement of the bushings will help to increase the lifespan of the transformers by an extra

15 years. Under normal conditions, transformers are expected to operate for 30 to 40 years but thanks to the effort Snowy Hydro puts into maintaining its assets, the Murray 1 Power Station transformers will operate for many years to come.

There have been a number of obstacles to overcome during the course of this project,

including road closures along the Alpine Way due to natural incidents, weather extremes in the Snowy Mountains and above all, pandemic restrictions and the closing of the border between New South Wales and Victoria.

Murray 1 is located near Khancoban and Wilson Transformer Company (WTC), based in Melbourne, which was hired to do some of the important work, navigated a six-week government approval process to cross the border from Victoria to work on the refurbishment through the pandemic.

WTC manufactured a purpose-built dry out tank at its Glen Waverley factory specifically for this major Snowy Hydro project.

The tank is utilised after the team has de-tanked the

core and coils – which are then both put inside the dry-out tank. The team completes welding works and modification of the old transformer tank and lid, before re-tanking the unit into the original body.

There are two more Murray 1 transformer refurbishments and bushing replacements remaining, with the last scheduled to be completed in November 2022.

So far, the project has been highly successful,

with approximately 100 workers involved and no safety concerns or injuries.

Snowy Hydro has extended its appreciation to all those contributing to this project for prioritising safety and health above everything else.

In addition, Snowy Hydro and WTC have worked with many local businesses in the construction including electrical contractors PHE and Roddy Engineering, both based in Tumut.

In these articles Member for Indi, Helen Haines' comments on the federal government's lack of vision for a world class hospital in Albury Wodonga.

I would like to remind Helen Haines that hospitals are a state matter not federal.

For her information and that of your readers, I supply the following quote made by Bill Tilley, MLA for Benambra, which he made on March 28, 2022:-

"In Parliament last week, I called on the Premier to explain why the Victorian government hasn't turned a sod on the redevelopment of Albury Wodonga Health's Albury campus emergency department despite having \$30M of NSW's money for the project for more than two years. I also asked why the Master Plan that

determines the health service's future will not be made public.

"My colleague in the Upper House and Shadow Minister for Health Georgie Crozier also asked why the Victorian Health Minister refuses to visit Albury Wodonga Health. Georgie visited a few weeks back and heard firsthand some of the challenges for patients and medicos. We need action, we need the Victorian government to make their intentions clear - either they support Albury Wodonga Health or, as I fear and spoke about last year, they want to walk away."

It seems that in her zeal to appear effective Helen Haines overlooks a basic premise of Federation, that hospitals are a responsibility of the states.

In Victoria we have a Labor government who is currently responsible for such matters. Given that Labor gave Helen Haines their preferences in the last election, perhaps she is treading carefully.

Many of her traits will live on through them.

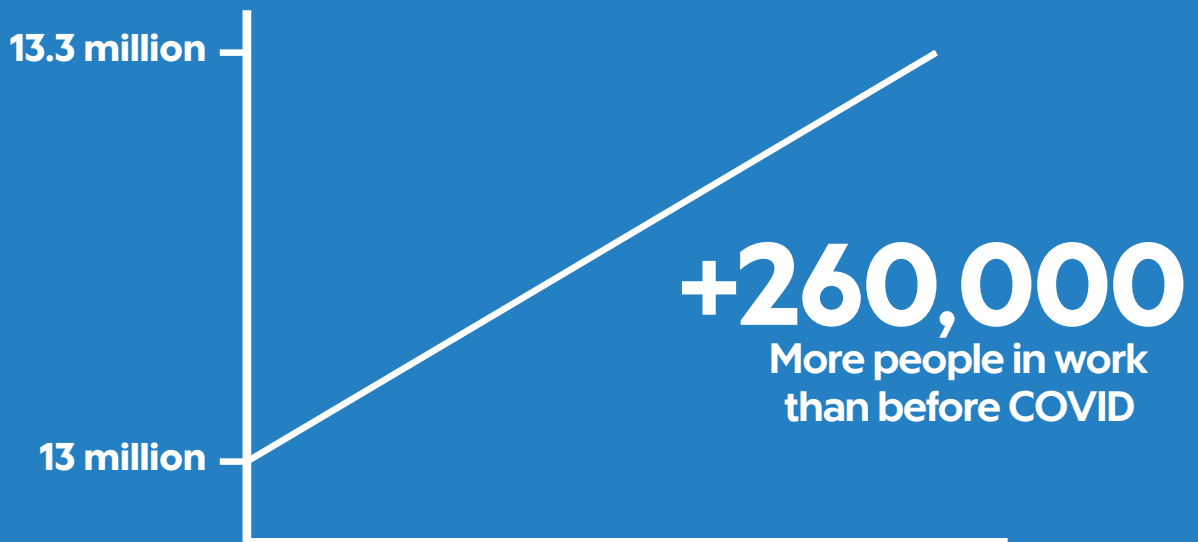

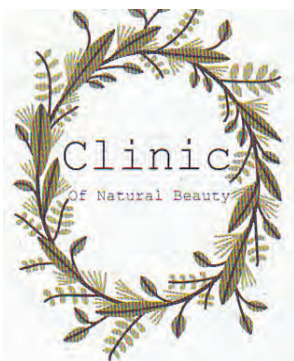

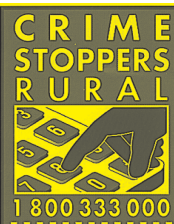
