Police are concerned that in the past three months they have seized six imitation firearms from residences in Corryong.

The 'gel blasters' or 'toy firearms' resemble a real gun and are considered imitation firearms which are classified as prohibited weapons in Victoria.

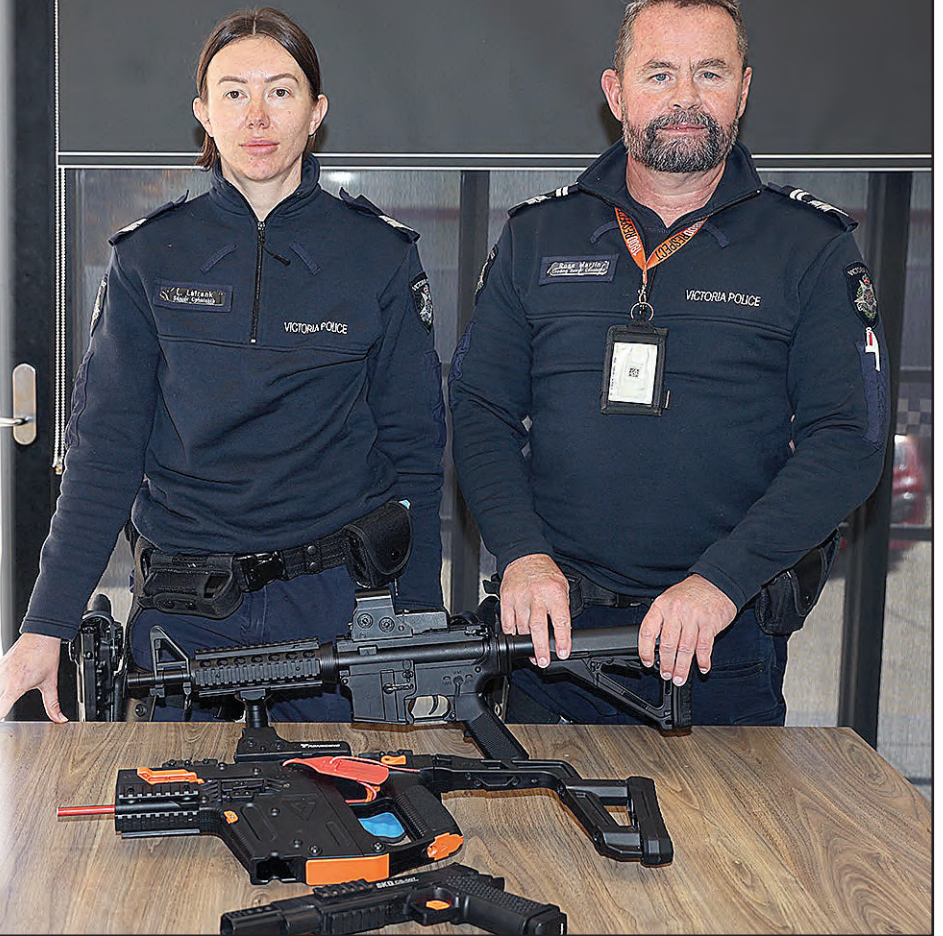
People in possession of prohibited weapons require an exemption to possess, otherwise they are illegal which is an arrestable offence. Having a coloured cap or coloured highlight of some sort is insufficient to classify them as a toy.

"Corryong residents in possession of gel blasters and other imitation firearms are encouraged to surrender them to a Licensed Firearms Dealer without fear of prosecution," said Sgt Brendan Lampkin.

"Always enter the premises initially without the firearm to notify staff of a firearm in your vehicle for surrender, to prevent any apprehension."

If unsure whether you are in possession of a toy or imitation firearm call Corryong Police on 02 6076 1666 to seek clarification.

Local rescue service faces shutdown

For decades, Victoria State Emergency Service (VICSES) Corryong Unit volunteers have provided vital assistance to their local community during flood and storm events, road rescue incidents and by supporting partner agencies in times of emergency.

However, despite a recent recruitment drive, the Corryong unit's membership numbers

remain critical and at present, are below a sustainable operational level.

Currently, road crash rescue capability is being responded to by Tallangatta or Wodonga SES units if their crews are available, pushing accident response times beyond two hours.

Because of the declining membership at the unit, the Corryong

group is asking local community members to come along to its upcoming information night and sign up as a volunteer.

"At VICSES, we want to recruit more members who might never have thought they could be an emergency responder," said Senior Assistant Chief Officer, Ray Jasper.

"Volunteers perform a wide range of roles so, if

you are not comfortable doing something, you don't have to.

"For example, some volunteers may find managing a road crash rescue incident too confronting to assist directly but may still want to provide assistance and help.

"The can control passing traffic or do a 'tool dump' where they set out the tools we need and start

up the generator – all vital roles performed, to help keep the community of Corryong safe.

"Our volunteers are the backbone of our organisation and come from all walks of life, ages and backgrounds," Mr Jasper said.

"Without them the community would not have these life-saving services available to them.

Event shines a healing light

The community is being invited to a gathering tomorrow to support and connect with local families who have endured hardship on different levels in the past few years, particularly those who have been affected by suicide.

The second annual 'Corryong Spirit' event will shine a light into the darkness of grief and guest speakers include James Gallacher from 'Roses in the Ocean' and country singer Melinda Schneider.

As well as performing, Melinda (pictured) will also speak about the mental health issues she has faced and overcome.

Melinda told the *Border Mail's* Jodie O'Sullivan that on Mother's Day 2018, she came home after performing a show and told her now-husband Mark Gable she wasn't feeling right.

"It's kind of like my brain is broken," she told him, "... but I wasn't really sure what was going on."

"Mark knew, he sent me to bed and told me



to stay there," Melinda recalls.

"He said, 'You're a workaholic, you never have any time off. Go to bed and watch Netflix, but do not work'."

She stayed in bed for

six weeks.

Melinda first publicly shared the story of her lived experience with depression in October 2020 in a bid to help others.

She is now a passionate mental health advocate and empowering speaker. 'Corryong Spirit' is an opportunity to acknowledge those whose lives were lost in our community and come together by the warmth of the firepits to reflect on our own hardships that we have endured.

The event will be held tomorrow, August 11th from 5pm to 7pm in the Attree Centre.

Bring a chair or picnic rug and warm blankets and beanies. Food and beverages will be available.

"We are holding the community meeting to encourage the locals from Corryong and Upper Murray district to be able to explore a sustainable future for the unit together," Mr Jasper said.

Unit members also prepare the community for adverse weather events, manage radio traffic, complete job reports, fundraise and support the wider region during emergencies.

It provides crucial emergency service response for the community, especially

when providing vital response with road crash rescue operations.

"Volunteering is a great way to learn new skills, keep connected, build personal confidence and be a part of range of life building experiences," Mr Jasper said.

WHAT IS CARBON FARMING AND HOW CAN YOU BENEFIT FROM IT?

Carbon farming is generating increasing interest across the agricultural sector most recently due to the new Labour government's greenhouse gas reduction targets.

With opportunities for farmers to improve their own farming practices to increase carbon storage and reduce their own emissions, what is often not known are the significant economic benefits that may be available to farmers in engaging in carbon farming projects.

What are the basics

A carbon farming activity must be certified and comply with an emissions reduction method by the **Clean Energy Regulator (CER)**, under the Australian Government's **Emissions Reduction Fund (ERF)**.

An approved carbon farming activity generates **Australian Carbon Credits (ACCU)**. An ACCU represents the avoidance or removal of one tonne of carbon dioxide equivalent greenhouse gas (**tCO₂-e**).

The Safeguard Mechanism administered by the CER requires high-emitting facilities and businesses to keep their emissions below an emissions limit (**baseline**). Currently, there are 212 facilities and businesses in Australia omitting over 100,000 tonnes of CO₂ per year that are required to surrender prescribed carbon units to reduce

their net emissions. ACCUs can be used as offsets under the safeguard mechanism.

To generate and sell ACCUs, the ERF has a range of **certified activities** that may be implemented and from these activities, an organisation can earn ACCUs to be traded and return a monetary value to the organisation.

What agricultural methods are available and where is the best place to start?

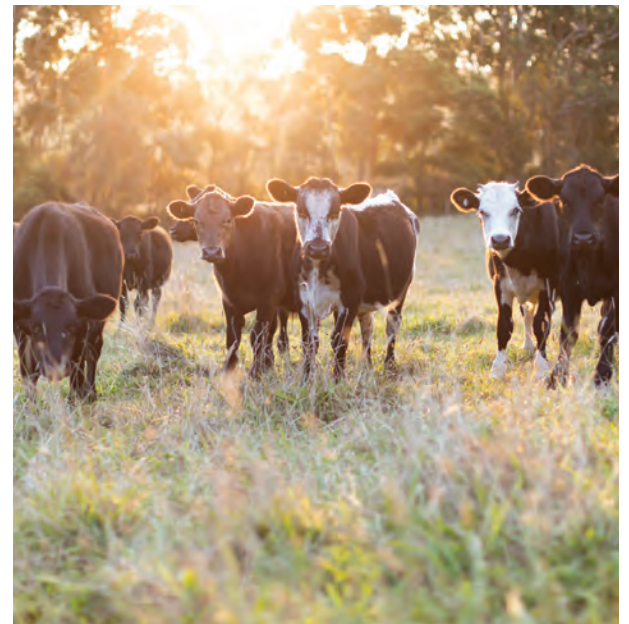
The CER currently has 14 approved agricultural methods that can reduce the amount of methane entering the atmosphere. These include soil organic sequestration methods such as tree planting, irrigated cotton fertiliser management as well as piggery, cattle, and dairy emission reduction methods.

*To participate in the Emissions Reduction Fund, you must first apply to become an Emissions Reduction Fund **participant** and register your project to receive ACCUs.*

Once a project starts generating ACCUs the participant will be paid at the agreed price and ACCUs are traded at auction through the regulator.

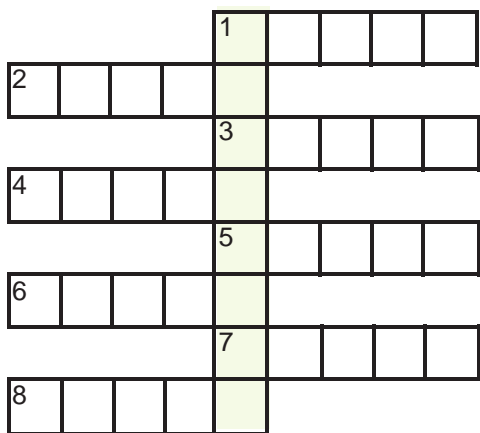

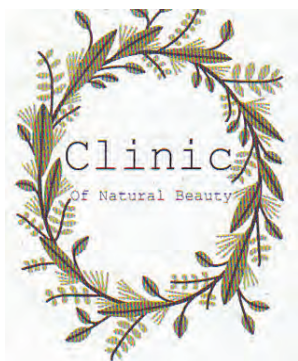
