Representatives of three North East councils have called for a new hospital to be built in Albury or Wodonga following a joint meeting this week.

Councils join hospital debate

Serious concerns about the provision of health care services to meet the needs of rural and regional communities across North East Victoria have been aired at a special meeting of Indigo, Alpine and Towong Shire Councils.

Mayors and councillors from the three municipalities held an historic joint meeting in

Beechworth on Tuesday where they voted unanimously to take a united stance to advocate for better health services for the region including a single site hospital built on a greenfield site.

The three councils endorsed several advocacy action items including calling for the governments of Victoria

and New South Wales to pause the current redevelopment plans for the Albury Hospital and redirect efforts towards a new single site facility development in either Albury or Wodonga.

Indigo mayor, Sophie Price, said that with the current health care infrastructure plans, the communities of Alpine, Indigo and Towong are genuinely facing the prospect of substandard health services for decades to come.

"If governments do

not understand that this issue is at the heart of what our communities want us to advocate for, then they seriously do not understand our communities," she said.

"Health services are the most important issue for the communities of all three shires and this is far too important for us not to continue to fight for.

Alpine mayor, Cr John Forsyth, said Albury-Wodonga Health is the third largest health service in Victoria, servicing a population base of 300,000

people and yet the funding being put forward by the Victorian government falls well short of what is required to provide the region with quality health care services.

Towong mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead, gave a personal account of how his young son had to be airlifted to Canberra to get the necessary care required for a broken leg and the impact this had on his family having to travel so far to be by his son's side.

"To not have a trauma centre that is up to the standard of care that he required in a regional centre the size of Albury-Wodonga is not okay," Cr Whitehead said.

Indigo councillor, Sue Gold, told the meeting that now is a critical moment in time in that the decisions being made will determine the capacity to respond to the future health care needs of a growing region.

All three mayors agreed there has never been a greater level of collaboration on a single issue, not only between the three councils but also health care professionals and advocates, surrounding councils and the general community.

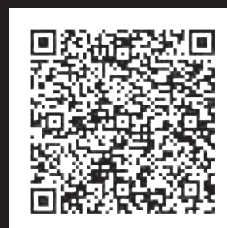

Minister needs to show some mercy

Critically ill patients are being denied a hospital bed and waiting lists for public surgery continue to rise as the Victorian government sits on its hands, according to the Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley.

On Tuesday afternoon, Mr Tilley (pictured outside Wodonga Hospital), called on the Minister for Health to explain the backflip on plans to use 20 beds at Mercy Health as a safety valve to the critical shortage.

It comes just days after Emergency Departments at Albury Wodonga Health were overwhelmed - at one point 50 beds short of what was needed.

Papers obtained from a NSW Parliament Upper House documents motion show Victoria Health seeking NSW's support for leasing the beds at

the nearby Mercy on 19 December, 2023.

The proposal would relocate low risk patients to allow access to more beds.

Mr Tilley said massive delays in public surgery and ambulance ramping was a direct result of the lack of beds.

"I've have been telling the Minister for some time that while the Hospital makeover at Albury is one thing, there's an immediate need for beds," he said.

"The Border Medical Association identified that the lack of beds was limiting public surgery, as did the Victorian Health department.

"We have 2,299 people on the Category 3 waiting list, 50 more than three months ago and second only to The Austin as a general hospital.

"Ambulances are stuck



at the hospital for hours on end because they can't find a bed."

Mr Tilley said the Minister must explain why

this has been dumped.

"It was costed at \$20.8 million over three years, supported by Albury Wodonga Health and

studies done to ensure this was feasible," he said.

"Was it NSW, was it Victoria or have they just run out of money?"

Governments fail to deliver on health deal

Documents revealed under Freedom of Information show the Victorian and NSW Health Ministers have not written to Federal Health Minister, Mark Butler, about the proposed redevelopment of Albury Base Hospital, according to the Member for Indi, Helen Haines.

The surprising lack of advocacy was revealed by Dr Haines in a speech in

Parliament on Monday.

Dr Haines recently made the FoI request to Mr Butler's office asking for documents relating to the redevelopment of Albury Base Hospital and/or infrastructure at Albury Wodonga Health, including correspondence and briefing notes.

Speaking in Parliament, Dr Haines said the states were lacking in their

efforts to get a better deal for people on the border.

"In making this request, I wasn't hoping for a 'gotcha' moment for the Minister but to understand what representations the NSW and Victorian governments had been making on the only cross border health service in the nation," Dr Haines said.

"What these documents

show is a lack of effort by the Victorian and NSW governments to get a better deal for people on the border."

"The case is clear, we need a new hospital on the border," Dr Haines said.

"So it would make sense to me if the states were asking for the federal government to invest in this project - I certainly am!"

Large print or braille ballot papers are available for voters who are blind or have low vision - please register by 5 pm Tuesday 10 September. To register, call 03 8620 1314 during business hours.

Early votes

If you will be away during the voting period (7-25 October), you can go to your local election office to vote in person, from 10 am on Wednesday 18 September.

How to nominate as a candidate

To nominate as a candidate, you must:

- be an Australian citizen and enrolled on the voters roll for Towong Shire Council AND
- be eligible to become a councillor should you be elected AND
- have completed the mandatory candidate training before lodging your nomination with the election manager.

To nominate, complete the nomination form and lodge it with the election manager together with the \$250 nomination fee. Nomination forms can be lodged by appointment during business hours from Monday 9 September until 12 noon on Tuesday 17 September at the election office.

Visit vec.vic.gov.au for more information and to pre-complete your nomination form using the online Candidate Helper. The online Candidate Helper will be available from Tuesday 20 August.

If you use the online Candidate Helper, print your pre-completed form and make an appointment to lodge it with the election manager along with the nomination fee.

Call the election manager from Monday 9 September on 131 832 to make a nomination appointment.

Corryong CBD Update



Last week, we completed Stage 3 by saw-cutting an ashlar pattern for the footpath and backfilling the pavement in the carpark. Stage 3 carparks in front of the IGA are now open to the public. We also setup a fence for Stage 4, commencing works between the WAW Bank and the Australia Post loading bays. In Stage 5, on the south side, we completed up to Roger C. Brown's store with tasks including installing drainage pits, tree vaults, electrical conduits, and replacing damaged awning posts. Additionally, planting for both Stages 2 and 5 have been completed.

This week, we'll continue Stage 4 works, which include demolishing the kerb and footpath and preparing drainage pits. We are aiming to complete stage 5 up to Roger C. Brown's store with works including footpath concrete pour, saw cutting ashlar patterns and backfill the pavement in the carpark.

To ensure the safety of community members and site workers temporary fences will be installed around work areas.

Defender wins top gong

Cudgewa backman, Grady Nigsch, has surprised himself and most pundits by winning the Upper Murray league's senior football best and fairest award, which is usually the domain of midfielders.

The agile defender is often the springboard into attack where the Blues' powerful forwards benefit from his pinpoint passing, a trait he showed in a stint with North Albury in the Ovens & Murray league.

He had polled 11 votes to lead at the halfway mark of Saturday night's count from team mate Jack Gilbee, favourite Fynn Debono from Tumarumba and Bullioh's Marcus Roberts.

Nigsch got the three votes in round nine to lead on 14 and although Gilbee was best-on-ground in round eleven to get to 11 votes, he did not play in the final game for the season.

Nigsch came to the Blues this season to honour one of his best mates who died four years ago and dedicated his award to him.

"I was good mates with Sam Hill who sadly committed suicide up there a few years back," Nigsch told the *Border Mail*. "I'm also really good mates with his brother Jake."

"So I wanted to help raise awareness about suicide and decided to head to Cudgewa this year and hang around the people that mean a lot to me."

Blues make it a double

In an exciting count for the A Grade netball award, young Corryong star Jasmine Shanks held a slender lead at the halfway point on nine votes, one ahead of Bullioh's Kirsty Hodgkin with three others sitting on seven.

However, Cudgewa gun Malory Nankervis finished strongly over the latter part of the season to share the best and fairest
