Indi will lead renewables

This week's announcement of a \$13 million investment in her electorate to develop Australia's first marketplace for locally-generated renewables is a huge step forward for our region, according to

Member for Indi, Dr Helen Haines.

The funding, from the Australian Renewable Energy Agency, will set up a digital platform that allows households and businesses to sell

electricity services to the national grid.

The Commonwealth government is supporting a Distributed Energy Resources (DER) Marketplace trial project in which households and businesses will be able to buy and sell electricity and grid services through the wholesale electricity market.

Project Edge will create a real-life wholesale marketplace to buy and sell electricity from rooftop solar, household batteries, electric vehicles and smart appliances.

"While these technologies are transforming our energy system and helping to reduce emissions, rapid uptake is impacting how the grid is managed," said Angus Taylor, Minister for Energy and Emissions Reduction.

"This trial will address current limitations of our existing market frameworks."

The trial will initially involve 50 houses but will scale up to around 1,000 residential, commercial and industrial electricity customers.

"We know that locally-generated power from small scale sources can

build energy security," Dr Haines said.

"With this new marketplace, everyday households and small businesses fitted with solar and batteries can start being paid for providing those services.

"When rolled out

nationally, this model, developed right here in Indi, will create a whole new income stream potentially worth billions of dollars to regional Australia.

"This investment shows why my Local Power Plan is so important."

Street Traders Xmas Party

The Upper Murray Christmas Market and Street Trading is set to go ahead on 18 December from 5-9pm at Attree Centre. Hosted by the Corryong Traders Group, there will be markets, the shops will be open late, Santa will make an appearance and there will be a scavenger hunt for the kids. Roadside mowing to commence

Regional Roads Vic mowing crews will be out in early December along arterial roads with mowing to be completed by late December, weather permitting.

Mowing will occur along Benambra-Corryong Road; Murray Valley Highway; Murray River Road; Shelley-Walwa Road; and Cudgewa-Tintaldra Road.

RRV encourages the community to report hazards and any concerns about the condition of the road network by calling 133 778.



Cudgewa Emergency Water Tank

An emergency water tank will be built in Cudgewa after the community pinpointed an emergency water supply, to be used by the CFA to protect town assets, as a recovery priority.

The dedicated 135,000 litre, 8.6 wide and 2.1m high water tank would be built in the park, on the old primary school site, along the Cudgewa Rd boundary, pending a final decision on the location.

The tank is being fully funded by Rosanna and Mooroopna Rotary clubs, including construction, delivery, and fencing.

After extensive discussion between Towong Shire Council,

Bushfire Recovery Victoria, DEWLP, CFA, Cudgewa Park Committee of Management and Cudgewa CRC, the site was chosen for its central, practical and cost-effective construction, and keeps the recreation reserve (safer place in an emergency) free of extra CFA activity.

Spotlight on Towong CRC

Towong CRC is one of 11 CRCs in Towong Shire, with a diverse demographic and relatively even representation of men and women.

The median age in Towong is 58, yet the CRC is largely made up of millennials who are the driving forces behind their progress and projects, along with 23-year-old Local Area Recovery Officer, Eden Cook.

Eden says there is a hunger and passion not just for recovery, but for a future legacy.

"The way young and old collaborate in Towong is integral to the community's sense of belonging and social connectedness," she said.

"The young people's action is bolstered by older residents' knowledge of the land and history. CRC meetings are

a melting pot of respect for old and new ideas and, ultimately, a shared passion for wanting the best environment for this generation and the next.

"The young people want to be vessels of change and positivity and have been assertive in their pursuit."

Hall supporters remain positive

The committee of management of the Corryong & District Memorial Hall Committee is proceeding with its major renovation project despite the trials and tribulations of 2020.

In his report at the annual general meeting, president Austin Nicholas, said it had been a year of sadness and a lot of negative happenings but he reflected on some of the positive achievements the committee has overseen.

"Setting goals for the future development of the hall, working to develop our business plan and having a clear vision of our directions has

been instrumental in our success," he said.

"A concerted effort in fund raising and obtaining grants has enabled the committee to undertake our projects thus far.

"Our major projects have included the new hall roof, acoustic ceiling and sound system, painting of all steel works, foyer and stage and a total electrical upgrade.

"Other works include the kitchen upgrade to commercial café standard, refurbishment of the hall flat, partial renovation to green room and amenities, air-conditioning, replacement of all exit doors to security standards, replacement of tables and chairs, resurfacing of the floor and stage, new lines on the stadium floor to



introduce badminton - a total spend to date of in excess of \$600,000.

"Work is about to commence on the final stages of the Australian government funded project

- the verandah and balcony roofing and associated streetscape works. More projects are in the pipeline.

"I would like to congratulate the committee members for their tireless

voluntary efforts and the local community for their ongoing support to make the Memorial Hall worthy of being the premier meeting place in the Upper Murray community."

Get a helping hand out of the mire

An agronomist from Queensland who lost two mates to drought-related suicide is coming to Corryong to talk with locals in a way that no-one else can.

Mary O'Brien founded *Are You Bugged Mate?* which helps rural men talk about mental health. Mary says her second language is agriculture and her third is 'bloke'.

She relates depression to getting bogged in the

mud and says rural 'blokes' are facing challenges like never before but it doesn't mean you need to get stuck.

"I have spent my whole life working in rural and remote Australia and always around country blokes, working with them, for them and beside them," Mary said.

"My father was one, my brother is one and most of my dearest friends are country blokes. I have

always worked in male dominated occupations and that certainly doesn't make me special but I believe it has given me a good understanding of rural men and it has definitely given me a deep and profound respect for them.

"So when I see country blokes facing challenges like never before, I need to say something because I know none of them will."

free events in Corryong on Friday December 11 at the Lions Youth Club Hall.

Kids get loose on kart fun

Students at Corryong College and Corryong Kindergarten will experience a Nudel Kart extravaganza next week when Playground Ideas visits the Upper Murray.

A year ago Australia watched in horror and sadness as regional Victoria was devastated by bushfires which prompted Moose Toys to donate six Nudel Karts and deliver them into bushfire affected communities for workshops in schools and kindergartens.

Nudel Kart is a mobile play and learning space, that explodes into more than 200 different research-backed loose parts that children can explore and experiment with in endless ways.

The nature of loose parts play encourages imagination, creativity and experimentation. Specific design features of the kart encourage collaboration, communication, resilience and negotiation.

For an average child in an average suburb in a developed country such as

Australia, loose parts play super-charges the brain in all the skills essential for our complex lives.

For children living with toxic stress and daily anxiety about their future, Nudel Kart creates an oasis of low stress and stimulating play as soon as possible after trauma. That space will help the child get back on the path of normal healthy development.

Nudel Kart is a social enterprise by non-profit Playground Ideas and 100 per cent of the profits go towards creating stimulating play spaces for children across the globe.

Towong Shire Council and Playground Ideas is also organising a community movie 'The Wheels of Wonder' which will screen at the Corryong Recreation Reserve next Wednesday night. Folk festival falls to pandemic



The crowds will be missing at Nariel this new year.

It is with great sadness that the Nariel Folk Festival committee has determined that it will not be possible to hold the event this new year due to pandemic restrictions.

"The committee recognises the importance of this festival to the economy of Corryong and estimates that it brings up to \$1 million into the local economy every year," said festival spokesman, Jamie Molloy.

"In lieu of this year's event the committee will consider holding festival events such as dances, throughout 2021 depending on the easing of the restrictions.

"We are committed as always to supporting local Corryong businesses, local emergency and community services and encouraging people to visit the Upper Murray."

The Nariel recreation reserve will, at this stage, continue to be open for informal camping with visitors encouraged to bring their own supplies including toilet paper, hand sanitiser and fresh water and to implement all the required restrictions such as physical distancing, to

maintain a safe camping experience.

"We are proud to have partnered with the Rotary Club of Corryong in 2020 to distribute \$40,000 from the festival funds and from post-bushfire fundraising events to help support individuals impacted by the Black Summer bushfires," Jamie said.

"We thank the Last Jar hotel in North Melbourne for hosting post-fire fundraising events, Folk Alliance Australia for their donation to the fund, the Victorian Folk Music Club and the Melbourne Colonial dancers for their generous donations and fundraising events and the many individual festival goers who have donated their time and money of their own accord.

"We acknowledge the tremendous efforts that have been made by an enormous number of people to help support those impacted and we continue to offer our support where we can to aid the recovery effort.

Betty gets a belated farewell

When our Mum, Betty Walton, died in May this year we were bound by full pandemic restrictions from having any sort of gathering to farewell her.

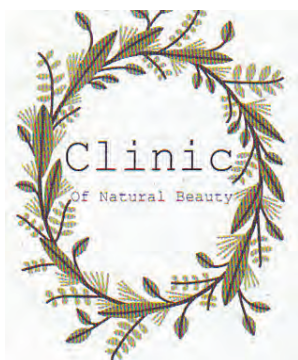
