More charges expected to be laid over street melee

Wodonga detectives are continuing their investigation into an affray in Wheeler Street in Corryong last Wednesday involving two groups of people.

Police responded to reports of an aggravated burglary and subsequent assault at a Wheeler Street address when three men allegedly forced entry to the residence around 9.30pm.

Investigators have been told one 20-year-old male was assaulted inside the home and two males were hit by a vehicle in the driveway of the property. Three men suffered minor injuries in the incident.

The vehicle did several burnouts in the street and a front fence of a neighbouring property was heavily damaged (pictured).

Three men are

assisting police with their enquiries

It is understood the alleged offenders and victims are known to each other.

The exact circumstances surrounding the incident are yet to be fully determined and investigations are ongoing.

Integrity not valued by government

Member for Indi, Helen Haines, has claimed that the Coalition government

has failed to deliver on its electoral promise to create an integrity commission.

"The Attorney General admitted what we have known to be true for a long time, integrity is not a priority for the Liberal National government," Dr Haines said.

"For three years they have delayed, distracted and dragged their feet after promising to implement a federal integrity commission and now that promise is broken.

"What the government does prioritise is the ability to spend taxpayer money for political purposes, without proper scrutiny," she said.

Cudgewa School Park Committee of Management was awarded funding for their Cudgewa School Park upgrade under the second round of the Local Community Project Grants program. More work needed on blackspots

A new report has found the federal electorate of Indi is the most successful in Victoria and the fourth most successful nationwide, when it comes to securing federal funding for new mobile phone towers.

The *Connecting Indi* report, published by the Member for Indi, Helen Haines, analysed a decade of government data compiled by the Australian Parliamentary Library since the inception of the \$380 million Mobile Black Spot Program in 2013, the same year that the electorate of Indi elected its first independent MP.

More than 65 new towers have been built across Indi since 2013 from Cudgewa to Kinglake. In the most

recent round, towers were funded in Burrowye, Koetong, Tawonga and Frenchman's Gap.

"By working together as a community, we have had tremendous success under the federal black spot program," Dr Haines said.

"But when it comes to better mobile coverage, there is always more work to do. There are still so many critical black spots that need funding, especially on major tourist and commuting thoroughfares and in bushfire areas where we simply cannot afford to have outages."

Dr Haines also acknowledged areas that aren't considered black spots but have high demands from the growing

population and at peak tourist times, need to be addressed by government and telcos.

"We have some of the best attractions for tourists in all of Victoria but I hear from businesses in towns like Mansfield and Bright, that when they are at their busiest, the internet can't keep up," Dr Haines said.

"It's holding back our local economies."

Alongside the report, Dr Haines announced that, if re-elected, she would work to increase the amount of funding available for new mobile towers from \$500,000 to \$1 million. She identified twenty priority black spots that need funding as a place to start.

"People contact my office every day about



phone and internet issues and the stories are harrowing," she said.

"This week I heard a story where the phone was dropping out during a call to 000 and from an elderly person whose car broke down on a country road with no signal to get help.

"Working with the Indi Telecommunications Advisory Group (ITAG), my office tracks the

location of mobile black spots and we know where funding is needed.

"The real bottleneck is with the government and releasing new funds quickly.

In related news, Dr Haines announced earlier in the week she would be working to secure federal government funding to truly complete the NBN build in Indi.

Former publican found dead

Police are investigating the death of a former lessee of the Courthouse Hotel in Corryong, whose body was found in her home at Crows Nest, north of Toowoomba, on Monday January 31.

Police told *ABC News* last Thursday that the death of 61-year-old woman, Krishna Chopra (pictured), was suspicious after receiving autopsy results and conducting a bushland search.

They are now treating her death as a homicide.

Detective Senior Sergeant Paul McCusker, from the Toowoomba Criminal Investigation Branch, said Ms Chopra was last seen "active in the area" around January 20.

"We're encouraging people to come forward and assist police with her

movements on or about the 20th of January this year, days prior and some days afterwards," he said.

He would not confirm details of Ms Chopra's injuries but said police had received autopsy results.

Bushland behind Ms Chopra's house on Park Road was searched earlier last week by Emergency Services personnel.

Senior Sergeant

McCusker said Ms Chopra moved to the area last year and lived alone.

"A friend of hers attended the address, couldn't raise her, returned to the address a number of days afterwards, still couldn't raise her and contacted police," he said.

"We've conducted a lot of doorknocks through the area, spoken to a lot of people."

Low-emissions timber boosts industry jobs

The Australian government is increasing support for construction businesses to use low-carbon timber and deliver jobs in forest industries across regional Victoria, according to Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction, Angus Taylor.

The government, through the Clean Energy Finance Corporation (CEFC), is investing \$300 million in the Timber Building Program which will finance the use of low-carbon engineered wood materials in apartments and office buildings to reduce construction emissions.

“Increased use of low-carbon construction materials like wood products will help achieve our target of net zero emissions by 2050,” Minister Taylor said.

“The production and delivery of building materials account for 28 per cent of emissions in the construction industry globally.

“Australia’s Long Term Emissions Reduction Plan sets out the approach the government is taking to help industries reduce their emissions, through research and enabling technologies.”

“Forest industries make an enormous contribution to rural and regional communities across Australia and employ more than 65,000 people,” added Assistant Minister for Forestry and Fisheries, Jonno Duniham.

“Our National Forest Industries Plan is reducing barriers to investment

in our plantation estate, improving Australia’s value-adding capability and delivering opportunities for better returns on investment for our foresters.

Nationals Senate Leader and Senator for Victoria, Bridget McKenzie, said the new investment would support local jobs across the regions and lead to lower emissions from the construction industry.

“This investment will help our industries to make more innovative forest and wood products right here in regional Victoria and create more jobs,” Senator McKenzie said. We know the Australian forestry industry is the ultimate renewable resource. It’s sustainable and managed using globally best practice and best science.

“The program will also help to develop local skills and experience that will lead to more low-carbon timber-based building activity in the future which will contribute to the net zero task as we store carbon.”

The Timber Building Program will finance eligible projects Australia wide on a case-by-case basis, which includes construction projects in office, retail, industrial, health care, education, residential, seniors living, hotels and student accommodation.

“That is what we will see again in the upcoming budget and election campaign,” Dr Haines said.
“We knew a government that sees no difference between taxpayer money and Liberal National party money wouldn't value integrity but now they have proven it.
“The only Bill for a robust federal integrity commission with teeth to be developed in consultation with legal experts in this term of Parliament, is my Australian Federal Integrity Commission Bill.
“As an independent I have tried to work with the government to progress a federal integrity commission with teeth but the admission of failure by the Attorney General shows the only way Australia will get such a body is with my bill, coming from the crossbench.
“I know the majority of MPs who do value integrity are ready to vote on my bill.
“There will be consequences at the ballot box for MPs who talk a big game on integrity but take no action in Parliament.”

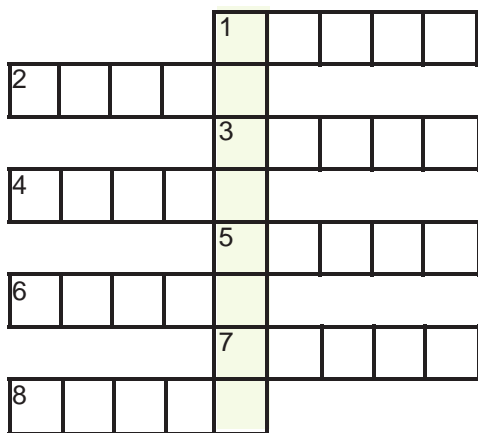

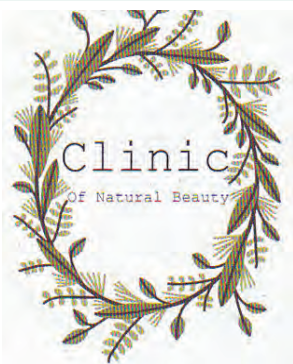
