It is expected that the golf club project will be completed by mid-2023.

It will complement the local lawn bowls and tennis clubs at the Corryong Recreation Reserve which have both recently installed synthetic surfaces.

After the disappointment of being ruled ineligible for the Black Bushfire Summer Grants, the Committee of Management of the Tintaldra Recreation Reserve is thrilled to have received funding for the revitalisation of the community facility.

The improvements will include renovated courts, tennis age-appropriate equipment for under fives and resurfacing of the equine area.

It is expected that the works will begin soon with the courts being completed by summer 2023/24.

A grant of \$183,101 was also announced for the for the Upper Murray Region Community Catering Hub to construct a shed to house catering equipment that


projects that support the recovery of the local economy, building a sense of community pride and connectedness.



Obituary:- Edna Anderson 1.10.1934-27.1.2023

Educator became a local institution

Edna was born on October 1st, 1934 in Auckland, New Zealand. She was the second daughter of Charles and Gladys Godfrey.

childhood Edna's was a strict but happy She was one. born during the Depression and consequently the family, like everyone else, struggled to make ends meet. One of her pursuits was table tennis - something she briefly returned to after her retirement.

However, it was her love of books and reading which lay the foundation for her life long career as an educator.

Being a child of the depression shaped Edna's future. Her parents placed importance on education. In 1954 Edna, having set her sights on a career as a teacher, immigrated to Australia.

Avondale College was home for the two-year duration of Edna's teacher training. Friendships were forged at Avondale that endured for life.

Edna's first teaching position was at Glen Huon, Tasmania, where she taught Prep to Grade six. Next she was posted to Albury for two years then Adelaide. She met her husband in Albury and they married in Adelaide.

However, the marriage did not last. Edna and her son Malcolm moved back to Albury. Her parentsin-law were extremely supportive during this difficult time looking after Malcolm while Edna worked. There were no teaching positions so she worked in the warehouse of Aywon Clothing in Albury.

It was 1964. advertisement placed by the Shire of Upper Murray appeared in the Border Morning Mail seeking applicants for the position of Pre-school Director/ Teacher. Corryong was experiencing a small population boom thanks to the Snowy Scheme. With those workers came their families, many with small children.

Edna was interviewed by Shire Secretary, Greg Tate: Pre-school President. Pat Lines; and Treasurer Nola Hillier and three other committee members. Edna's appointment to the position was the beginning of the time in which most people came to know her.

It was the beginning of a long and rewarding career and her membership of the Corryong community.

Her first year in Corryong was difficult. Edna boarded in town during the week and returned to Albury at weekends where Malcolm was living with his grandparents. Edna's resourcefulness showed through again. Working as a waitress in Albury on weekends was possible using the skills she learnt when saving for her air fare to Australia.

Number 14, Hamilton Crescent, Corryong became their home for the next few years. Malcolm was able to move from Albury and Edna's mother was able to move to Australia. Their next move was to 71 Towong Road in 1970.

In 1973 Edna took on further studies to ensure her ongoing employment. The Department of Education, which had carriage of pre-school education, offered a threeyear teaching degree compressed into one year of full time study. Edna moved to Melbourne for that year and Malcolm returned to his grandparents in Albury.

It was a difficult time as there was little income. Edna secured a position as a student hostel supervisor. For the trouble of ensuring the doors

were locked at night and providing supervision to a group of home economics students, she received accommodation and her meals.

Edna and Malcolm returned to Corryong in

By 1976 Edna was eligible for long service leave. Having saved they were able to take a three month overseas holiday. Their destinations were France. Switzerland, Italy, Austria, Germany, Holland. England. Scotland, Wales, Norway, Denmark, Sweden and Singapore. For Edna this was followed by teacher study tours to Japan, Soviet Russia and England in 1977 and 1978.

Over the following years Edna's mind was never far from further education. Through external studies she completed a Graduate Diploma of Educational Studies, a Bachelor of Early Childhood Education and Graduate Diploma of Special Education.

The Edna Anderson people knew as a teacher and community member was the same as the private person.

"Having known her all my life I am glad to tell a little of her story, the way she lived, the convictions and principles she held and the choices she made," Malcolm said.

"Her devotion to her job and the community were her driving motivations.

"My mother was a person of the highest integrity. Her counsel, professional wisdom and knowledge were sought and respected.

"My mother was always interested in substance over appearances. She could relate easily and authentically to anyone. with a genuine interest in the important things in life, be they large or small. She had an enduring capacity for friendship and loyalty and an endearing honesty about herself.

"Her trademark was her directness but it was rarely without warmth; never wavering from her quiet insistence that the whole issue be considered. It was one of the ways she respected the dignity of those she encountered. To listen to other points of view, to imagine yourself in the shoes of others.

"For Edna respect had to be earned. It was not given by virtue of another's position or authority but how they exercised those things.

At the core of my mother's amenable character were values she did not even know how to compromise. She had nothing to gain by asserting them – it was just how she was. An earthy person, with the courage - often tested - to put forward her point of view if the situation demanded

"Her values were ones that connected her to the community around her. It is a good way of summing up how she saw the world. In her view that world was never small. It always had purpose and meaning.'

Many of the children Edna taught loved their time at pre-school. And in many cases so did their children too.

Edna's retirement in 2002 did not mean retirement from life. She et about finding outlets for herself which, in her unchangeable way, ensured she continued to contribute.

Receiving the Citizen of the Year award and nomination for Senior Citizen of the Year in 2007 came as a great surprise and meant much to her.

"We will continue on with our lives but so will the memory of my mother continue on," Malcolm said.

"In her own practical fashion my mother would

not have wanted any great fuss. For her there was always hope and a sense of looking forward to what each new day would bring.

"It is my hope that her

memory and the respect she held can be seen in the contribution she made to people's lives.

"A beautiful person. A life well lived."



Government blasted over regional roads

The Liberal Member for Northern Victoria. Wendy Lovell, has used the first sitting week of State Parliament to blast the Victorian government on the current condition of roads in regional Victoria.

Speaking during the adjournment debate to the new Minister for Roads and Road Safety, Melissa Horne, Ms Lovell described the condition of Victoria's regional road network as "deplorable" and laid the blame squarely at the feet of Labor's chronic underinvestment in road maintenance over the last eight years.

Ms Lovell said that

the government never prioritised maintenance and safety of regional roads, evidenced the scrapping of the Liberal Nationals Coalition's Country Roads and Bridges Program upon winning government in 2014. The program provided \$160 million to 40 small regional councils and shires to maintain and repair local roads.

Ms Lovell said the poor condition of regional roads had even caused high-ranking public servants from Victoria Police and the Department of Transport to publicly speak out.

In a Weekly Times article 'Broken roads dated 25 frustrating' January 2023, Victoria Police Road Policing Assistant Command Commissioner, Glenn Weir, was quoted as saying "officers were constantly alerting road authorities

or local councils to the parlous condition of Victoria's road network".

In the same article, Chief, Regional Transport for the Department of Transport, Paul Northey, was quoted as saying "there was a current shortfall in money available for regional road repair."

Ms Lovell called on Minister Horne to unveil her plan to fix Victoria's regional roads and match or better the Coalition's election commitment of at least \$1 billion a year for the next ten years to complete the intensive maintenance program required.

"Road users must ensure their cars are roadworthy but sadly our roads are not roadworthy because of the chronic lack of funding from the government since their election in 2014," Ms Lovell added

Warning issued to rural drivers

latest police intelligence shows that there were 24 lives lost from collisions on rural roads as of 30 January, a 64 per cent increase on the five-year average for fatal regional collisions in January.

Assistant Commissioner Road Policing, Glenn Weir, said "It is a common misconception that it's not locals losing their lives on country roads but that couldn't be further from the truth.

"The reality is, people residing in regional areas make up the majority

Eighteen of those collisions occurred within 100kms of the deceased's residence.

More than 85 per cent of rural fatalities occurred on high-speed rural roads, with speed limits between 80km/h to 110km/h.

"Distraction basic road user error is significantly contributing to regional lives lost," Assistant Commissioner Weir said.

"It just shows a simple lapse in concentration can have catastrophic consequences.

all road users remain alert, particularly when travelling on high-speed

Police are urging

regional road users to take more care as the state enters another particularly high-risk period.

"It's been a terrible start to the year on our roads, and we're entering another particularly highrisk period. Please don't be complacent and think that road trauma can't happen to you, because a split-second of inattention is all it takes," Assistant Commissioner Weir said.

"Police will be doing everything they can to reduce road trauma during this high-risk period but we need everyone to do their bit."
