Hall project faces delays

Corryong & District Memorial Hall committee has written to the CEO of Bushfire Recovery Victoria (BRV), Mariela Diaz, detailing

progress the upgrade of the community asset.

The committee was the recipient of a Local Economic Recovery

problems it is facing to (LER) grant of \$390,000 and works were due to start in July 2021.

> A project manager was appointed and preliminary steps have been undertaken including advertising a tender for works resulting in a lack of response.

Farm inspectors detract from firefighting capability

Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley, has called on the Victorian government to come clean on whether Department of Environment, Land, Water & Planning (DELWP) officers will be taken off fuel reduction burns and firefighting to assess camping sites on leased farm river frontages.

In the Victorian Parliament vesterday, Mr Tilley highlighted an internal advertising campaign for DELWP staff to take up the roles for the next 12 months.

"Last year, farmers protested on the steps of Parliament over the massive overreach in the regulations that would have allowed camping on their leased river frontages for up to 28 days, threatened their farm biosecurity and allowed campers to set up toilets and grab firewood," Mr Tilley said.

"Common won the day with the regulations relaxed and potential site assessments reduced to 27 properties and only four rivers – the Campaspe, Ovens, Broken and Goulburn."

Mr Tilley said that had now spread state-wide.

"My mail is up to 32 staff are going to be taken from their normal duties as part of an internal recruitment drive," he said.

"I also understand the conditions of the

secondment, 'quarantine' them from emergency management and fuel reduction operations.

"We know farmers on the Mitta and Murray are now getting letters and emails saying their property is to be assessed, despite the fact those letters still only reference the priority rivers.

"When the farmers made further inquiries, they found that often the assessments had been carried out without their knowledge."

Mr Tilley said anglers and hunters already had access to these river frontages.

"This isn't about stopping that access but if the state truly wanted to extend this to camping they would have adopted a more consultative approach, they would have worked with the leaseholders," he said.

"This jackboot diplomacy does nothing to encourage a good relationship between the fishers, hunters and landholders or indeed DELWP.

"I would hate to think that fuel reduction burns or indeed a major firefighting operation could be jeopardised because of the ideological push that is actually pushing farmers to the brink."

Council welcomes recovery funding

announcement of \$25.4M in national funding for 46 local community projects in the electorate of Indi under the Black Summer **Bushfire Recovery Grants** program, the Towong Shire Council is elated at the news that 26 projects in the municipality have been successful in receiving

"With more than \$22 million being injected into 26 projects across the shire, this is a huge step forward in our ongoing recovery journey," Towong mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead, said.

Three projects put forward by Towong Shire Council were successful through the program including the Cudgewa Avenue of Honour Rejuvenation and Walking Track upgrades, the Walwa Recreation Reserve Resilience Enhancements Project and the Corryong Skate Park upgrade.

"I'm excited to see that three council projects were successful and can't wait to share more about these initiatives with the community," Cr Whitehead said.

Cudgewa's Avenue of

line that runs through the township. Made up of elm and plane trees planted in 1917, it commemorates the district's World War I local heroes. During the bushfires the Avenue of Honour was in the direct line of the fire front and thirty-seven trees were damaged.

"The funding will contribute to the replacement of the damaged trees and an upgrade to the adjoining walking track, bringing this important historic location back to life," said Towong mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead.

The Walwa Recreation Reserve was used as a staging area during the 2019/20 bushfires and funding for its upgrade will involve the construction of additional amenities, provision of undercover storage, installation of a generator and refurbishment of the building's exterior.

"The project aims to build the community's resilience by increasing its capacity to support emergency services and the community during future emergency events,



Cr Whitehead said.

After the 2019/20 bushfires impacted the Upper Murray region, the redevelopment of the Corryong skatepark was identified as a key priority of the local youth.

"The upgraded facility will provide improved park elements, aiming to recreational encourage participation and social connection, particularly for young people and families across the Upper Murray region," Whitehead said.

"I'd also like to say a huge congratulations to all of the successful recipients, as well as a huge thank you for the time and effort you have

put in to continuing to support our recovery process through these important projects.

"I'd also like to thank the Australian government for their ongoing support for our bushfire affected communities."

The grants show how wide ranging bushfire recovery can be, according to Member for Indi, Helen Haines.

"Communities in Indi were devastated by the Black Summer bushfires and the recovery process has been hampered by the pandemic," she said.

"As our communities look to the future, the grants for these projects give hope for the future.

Other factors have been the effects of Covid-19 restrictions in the workplace and a shortage of materials, qualified contractors and

Contractors are also reluctant to cost projects with a wait time of up to twelve months to commence work and the uncertainty over material prices.

The Memorial Hall works were fully costed prior to submitting the grant application, however there was no provision for asbestos investigation and

remediation. BRV funded

asbestos assessment but some of the the grant funding was then needed to cover the cost of remediation leaving a shortfall to fully fund the scope of works. The project manager

has been in conversation with BRV to negotiate a way forward for not only the hall situation but across the board generally. The committee

Recovery funds boost trails


Bushfire Wodonga's Recovery team has active in some high conservation value natural areas in the Upper Murray this summer, supporting the work of local communities in bush restoration and

One of the sites is the remnant bushland of 'The Needles' historical trestle bridge reserve. At this time of year the bush there is full of flowering Bursaria and alive with the insects and bird life these highly

productive native shrubs support.

Work is also underway to target the woody weeds in the reserve, with blackberries threatening to smother the native raspberries and Elm overtaking suckers this otherwise healthy bushland.

This is part of Parklands Landcare Led Bushfire Recovery project, a partnership project with Upper Murray Landcare groups involving refencing of conservation corridors and treatment of



weeds in high conservation areas, supported by the Australian government's Bushfire Recovery Program for Wildlife and their Habitat.

A second project, supported by Bushfire Recovery Victoria's Nature Led Recovery fund, will

finance signage in the four unburnt Upper Murray trestle bridge historic reserves. Wayfinding and interpretive signs will bring local knowledge alive and improve the visitor experience in these unique rail reserves.

Parklands is also

seeking local historians and storytellers to contribute to the signage and help plan a potential mural trail at Cudgewa.

"That dedication resulted in almost three times as many Macquarie perch being stocked this year compared to last,.

"Stocking a record number of 'Maccas' this season is a credit to the cooperation and dedication of several groups.
