## New bridge takes shape

The first of three spans of girders are now in place as the basis of the new Towong Bridge deck slab begins to take form.

The first five pre-cast bridge girders were craned into place early this week with each spanning up to

20 metres in length and weighing up to 30 tonnes. The remaining 10 pre-cast bridge girders will be placed next week.

Work is also nearing completion on the Victorian side of the Murray River to erect a

20-metre-long steel and concrete retaining wall.

Once all the girders have been placed, crews will finalise work on cross beams connecti, the first of which are expected to be poured at the end of February into early March.

# Khancoban man awarded top honour

The Snowy Valleys' most inspiring individuals have been recognised for their exceptional contributions and outstanding service to the local community.

The 2023 Snowy Valleys Australia Day Award recipients were announced at a special dinner ceremony last night, with invited nominees and nominators joining councillors and dignitaries at the Batlow Literary Institute.

The awards were presented across four categories:-

- Citizen of the Year - Tom Moss, Khancoban.
- Service to the Community - Jen Vinge, Jingellic.
- Sportsperson of the Year - Piper Duck, Tumut.
- Sports Team of the Year - Franklin Public School's Girls Basketball Team, Tumut

Mayor Ian Chaffey said he was pleased to be able to recognise and celebrate local people volunteering and striving tirelessly for the betterment of their communities.

"On behalf of council and the wider Snowy Valleys community, I extend my congratulations to all recipients for their outstanding contributions, commitment and valued work," he said.

"I also acknowledge and compliment all the nominees on their local achievements and dedication and thank them for their contribution.

"It is wonderful to see so many local people being recognised for the outstanding work they do for our community."

Citizen of the Year, Tom Moss, has volunteered more than 30 hours per week to the following organisations which support the local community - Murray Border Association of Vietnam Veterans, Legacy, Khancoban golf club, Community Drive - and he has served as Justice of the Peace.

Tom has also assisted elder community members with house and property maintenance.

As an engineer, he proudly served the

Australian Defence Force (ADF) for six years during the Vietnam War and in Papua New Guinea's Citizen Military forces.

On leaving the ADF, Tom was employed by the Snowy Mountains Hydro Electric Scheme and was subsequently promoted to the Township Maintenance Manager position at Cabramurra.

On retirement from Snowy Hydro in 2002, Tom returned to Khancoban to focus on his community support.

Jen Vinge has been heavily involved in various positions with the Jingellic Show Society, Jingellic Trail Ride, Jingellic Rural Bushfire Brigade and the Jingellic Hub.

She has been instrumental in the redevelopment of the Jingellic Showgrounds and was the first female fire fighter for the Jingellic brigade.

Following the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires she assisted with establishing and co-ordinating the Jingellic Emergency Welfare

Centre, setting up the BlazeAid camp and has been an active member of the Jingellic Recovery Committee.

Citizen Achievement Awards were made to Mary Hoodless, Danica Peel, Terry Macgregor, Rodney McLachlan, Gemma-Loiuse Bremner, Janet Kendall and Lorraine Oliver.

Service to the Community Achievement Awards were awarded to Erin Louise Nurthen, Robyn Hotston, Rodney

McLachlan, Deirdre Greenhalgh and the Ournie Hall Committee, Lorraine Oliver and Robert Ironside.

The award dinner celebrations were made possible by funding from the National Australia Day Council's Australia Day 2023 grants program.

## Start made on demerger report

The development of the independent report on the advantages and disadvantages of demerging Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) has commenced with the first steps in engaging with the community scheduled for February.

Report author and project lead, Professor Joseph Drew of the University of Newcastle, will meet with representatives of key stakeholder groups, councillors and council

staff to collect information, feedback and individual views on the proposal. Additional community-wide meetings will then be held in March or April.

"Following the initial meetings with key stakeholders, I will return to Snowy Valleys to present my draft report at two community meetings," Professor Drew said.

# Towong's hidden heritage revealed

Strzelecki's story is just one facet of Towong's unsung heritage story which begins at the Towong Turf Club and continues along Towong Hill Road.

The racecourse and the grandstand are among the most picturesque racecourses and grandstands in regional Victoria - no wonder it is often called the Flemington of the Bush. In the walkway beneath the steps leading to the grandstand there are the turf club's 150th anniversary history display boards. Here you will find Upper Murray hidden gems with many stories of colourful characters and events.

Beside the road to the racecourse is the Towong Soldiers' Memorial Hall listing those members of the Towong community who served in both World Wars. Many descendants of those brave service men and women still live in Towong, Corryong and in the neighbouring districts. Towong Hall is a gathering place for community meetings, social gatherings and in emergencies such as the Black Summer 2020 fires. After the fires the hall was used as a distribution point for the many generous donations sent to help our community and it is where a local child pinned his or her note thanking 'The Fireys'.

A house now stands on the site of the old Towong hotel just before the Upper Murray Highway turns left towards Tintalra. There have been two pubs on the site and like many other contemporary country pubs certainly one of them suffered the ravages of fire. The exact date the last drink was served there seems to have been lost in time.

The pub used to

provided stabling and fodder for drovers travelling with stock grazing the long paddock and also for racehorses and their owners.

Today's owner of the house standing on the site of the former pub told me about the artefacts he has found - bridle bits, stirrups, horseshoes and girth buckles not to mention much broken glass.

Towong's story goes back beyond early settlement with maps showing streets that were never made. Because Towong was swampy and Sydney Grandison Watson had given a block of land near the school to Corryong, the latter was developed as the local town.

The proximity of Mt Elliot's gold mines brought attention to the nearby largely canvas village and also to Corryong. Rumours grew that Corryong's streets were paved with gold! Nonetheless Towong village never died - it was hiding its light while it waited for life to return.

In recent years newcomers have seen its potential and vibrant young people have moved to the area to build their homes and raise their children.

The Murray River is Towong's and the Upper Murray's greatest asset and many stories have been told about the old wooden truss bridge.

One winter a ute skidded on the bridge and broke the railings which then miraculously saved both driver and vehicle from plunging down into the icy river.

Local identity and stalwart of the Upper Murray Historical Society, John Whitehead, who grew up in New South Wales, tells stories of riding his horse and fording the river further downstream at the

Light House crossing and then once Towong bridge was almost finished, riding over the bridge before all the floorboards were secured. If his mother had known she would have had a heart attack!

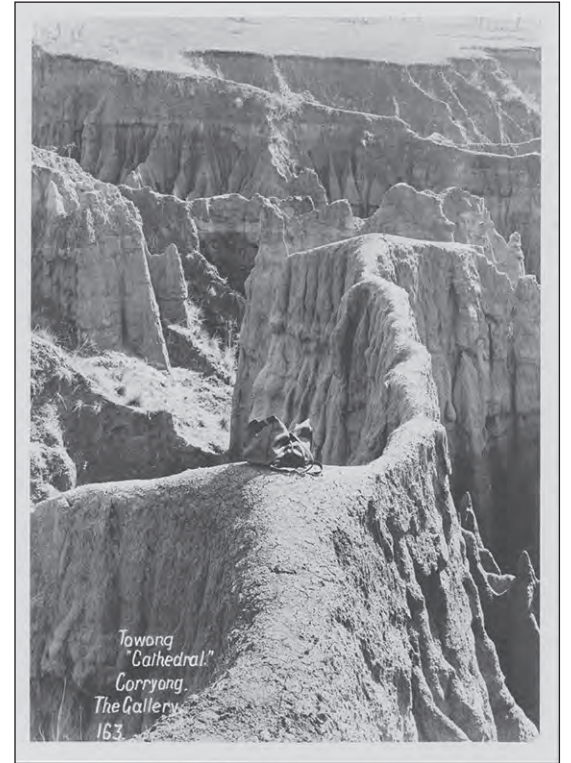
Until the new bridge is completed sometime in 2023, the Murray River cannot be crossed at Towong but there is pedestrian and bicycle access behind the bridge worksite to Towong Hill Road. In good weather walkers and cyclists can enjoy one of the finest views of the High Country lying ahead.

If time allows, walkers and cyclists can continue along Towong Hill Road and Strzelecki's approximate route towards the High Country. The road runs above a billabong or oxbow lake called the Mermaid Lagoon, possibly named for its one time mermaid shape. Some say that there were those who spent a bit long propping up the bar and then were lured by the siren call of the mermaid!

About 2.3kms from Towong Bridge, on a fence line between two paddocks, are the foundations of William Guise's homestead, the first house on the property that later became known as Towong Hill. On the floodplain below the foundations is the well from which the Guises drew their water.

Further on, some 3.3kms from the bridge and on the left side, is The Cathedral - a natural deep erosion gully in which the sides have been sculptured by the weather into all kinds of magical shapes (pictured). The erosion has been formed by springs that seep down, gradually forming over many years from what would have once been a gully into the mini canyon we see today.

In wet seasons a stream

flows through to feed swampy ground and a dam in the paddock below its mouth. In drier weather water seeps through beneath the surface soil.

The Cathedral created such interest that Walkabout Geographic Magazine: Australia and the South Seas published a black and white photograph on the front cover of its November 1936 edition. For many years similar photographs were displayed in the railway carriages on the Spirit of Progress, the Melbourne to Sydney train.

Elyne Mitchell was so concerned about the erosion in the gully that in 1945 she planted a forest of poplars to hold the soil. In this way The Cathedral played its part in inspiring the articles she wrote for the wartime *Sydney Morning Herald*, which became the foundations of two of the chapters of Elyne's *Soil and Civilization* published in 1946.

A few hundred metres on you pass the turning into

the drive to Towong Hill, the home to which Elyne Mitchell returned with her notebooks to write the books that made her career. The ruins of the mansion stand as a memorial to a fine children's writer, conservationist, historian, keen skier and bushwalker.

Having been fortunate enough to grow up in the homestead, I prefer to remember it how it was. Rather like *The Sleeping Beauty*, the homestead's charred shell is waiting for the future to breathe life back into it.

Venture some 400m further and the Towong Hill stud stables come into view at the bottom of the hill on the left.

This was home to the well-known stallion Trafalgar and foul play was widely believed to have been the cause of the Melbourne Cup favourite's loss to Comedy King in 1910.

Continue uphill to the junction with the B400 running from Corryong to Khancoban.

# Reduced limit to improve safety

The speed limit on Jingellic South Road at Jingellic will be reduced this month to improve safety along this stretch of road.

A Transport for NSW spokesperson said the speed limit on Jingellic South Road was recently reviewed at the request of Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) due to safety concerns.

"The review assessed factors such as crash history, road geometry and usage, adjacent development, traffic mix and volumes, commercial activity generating pedestrians and access points," the spokesperson said.

"The review has recommended reducing the 100 km/h speed zone to extend the 60 km/h speed zone for 590 metres on Jingellic South Road to the southern side of



Jingellic Bridge.

"The reduced speed limit will provide a safer road for all transport users by reducing the likelihood of crashes."

The new 60 km/h speed limit came into effect on Monday

Motorists are asked to adhere to the changed traffic conditions and follow the directions of signs.

Members of the community can sign up at the Safer Roads NSW website to receive

updates about changes to permanent speed limits in their nominated area and to have a say on speed limits.

Directly opposite are the lower slopes of Mt Elliot where before the turn of the last century gold mining began, bringing people and money and ushering a new era into the Upper Murray.

For those wishing to continue following Strzelecki's footsteps, continue on down to

Bringenbrong Bridge. The original ford was located 200m-300m downstream from the bridge and marked with a cream can lid nailed to a post.

Over the years the river's character has changed and the lid has long since disappeared so it is impossible to identify the ford's precise location. However, Strzelecki's trail

doesn't finish there and it isn't necessary to venture as far as the top of the Crackenback Chairlift at Thredbo! Fit and experienced bushwalkers and skiers could do as Tom and Elyne Mitchell did during the winter of 1936 and climb the Hannel Spur.

High Country visitors might also choose to

follow in the trail of the Silver Brumby, taking the Alpine Way to Dead Horse Gap and either walking out to The Cascades or up onto the Ramshead range.

(Note:- Travellers following in Strzelecki's footsteps are asked to stick to the public roads and respect private property. All sites mentioned are visible from roads).

Response to Frank Evans' Letter to the Editor: "Share your opinion on health care" 19th January, 2023:-

Firstly, we would like to thank Frank Evans for encouraging community members to provide feedback to Corryong Health and for highlighting various methods for doing so.

This provides an opportunity to educate our community on the various methods already available for communicating feedback. Most importantly, Corryong Health really wants to hear from you if you have a concern, a complaint, a compliment or a criticism.

Those members of the community who have been willing to bring their feedback directly to the health service have expressed satisfaction with the outcomes. One current example is a complaint resulting in the identified need for more disabled car parks at the Medical Clinic. Works are underway to increase disabled car parks.

The primary method used by Corryong Health to gather community feedback is 'Happy or Not' via a kiosk stationed around each of the services provided by Corryong Health on a scheduled basis throughout the year to ask specific questions relating to services and quality.

The information gathered is anonymous unless you choose to identify yourself. Regular reports are captured and sent to the relevant department group; managers; executive directors; Community Health Advisory Group (CHAG) and the Board. Quality improvement activities are developed from this information and tracked until completion.


