



Help history come alive



The Upper Murray Historical Society, with the support of Towong Shire, is undertaking an interesting project that will highlight the history of Corryong.

The plan is to install a series of historical information boards around the town.

Council recently obtained funding for the signs and has asked the historical society to collect the information.

"The society has a wealth of information and photographs about the early years of Corryong," said society president, John Murphy.

"We identified more than 40 places in Corryong that could have these boards so to make it manageable we have shortlisted ten sites along Hanson Street to concentrate on first."

The locations are Corryong Hotel Motel, Restaurant, Consolidated Corryong

Primary School, Top of Town Takeaway, Roger C Brown's, Corryong IGA, Corryong Post Office, Courthouse Hotel, the Baptist Church and The Man from Snowy River Museum. The sacred indigenous tree in Hanson Street will also be marked.

To highlight the project, a sample poster has been placed in the window of Roger C Brown's, a cornerstone business in the Upper Murray for more than 70 years.

The building originally the Coffee opened Palace. It in1891 and was an important meeting place for locals and the best accommodation in town. Visiting businessmen such as doctors, tailors, lawyers and dentist used these

inquest into his death.

Although a lot is known about the buildings chosen, the Historical Society is also seeking personal stories, forgotten photos or objects from these building.

"The importance of these buildings is not just their age or the long term service they have provided in the district," said publicity officer, Vicki Kane.

"It is also the personal stories that make the history come to life which is why we are asking the public to share the stories they have. This will make the information boards interesting to both locals and visitors."

Project role led to full time job

Corryong firefighter, Cath Davies, will forever remember the night that the 2019-20 Black Summer fires tore through the Corryong district.

Heavily pregnant with her first child, Cath watched as Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMV) crews headed towards Towong to protect lives and property directly in the path of the out-of-control bushfire.

"I remember sitting on the front verandah with a face mask on, watching the crews leave and bawling my eyes out," Cath recalled.

"I felt so hopeless. Everyone was out fighting the fire and if I wasn't pregnant, I would've been with them. It was tough."

On maternity leave but determined to help, Cath went to the Corryong FFMV office and took on the role of radio operator.

"I needed to do something," she said.

"I couldn't just sit there and watch," she

"Everyone was under pressure and doing the best that they could. For me it was nice to be able to come back to work and feel like I contributed in some small way."

A week after the fire was contained, Cath and husband Joel welcomed the safe arrival of their first child, Archie.

"Looking back it was a pretty hectic time for everyone, including us," Cath said.

"I have so much admiration for everyone who helped fight the fires, all the firefighters and the community which rallied together and supported each other."

As part of the recovery program, Cath and FFMVic colleague Nathan Hewatt were appointed as leaders of the Towong Community Recovery Committee.

The committee has led the completion of a range of local projects in the Towong district while also helping to bring everyone back together.

"I think we have achieved a fair bit for our little town obtaining grant funding for a walking track, community barbeque facilities and various events," Cath said.

"If there is a silver lining to the bushfires, it's that it has brought everyone together. It's made us all even more aware of the importance of community, and what can be achieved when you work together."

Cath's journey with FFMV started seven years earlier when she applied to join the Corryong crew as a project firefighter at age 21.

"I was working in real estate at the time and I learnt pretty quick that I hated being indoors," she said.

"I knew a few people who were already on the crew and we were all close mates, so I thought why not give it a go."

After three seasons working as a project firefighter, Cath was offered a full-time role as a Field Operations Officer before more recently joining the district's fuel management program.

"It was good to spend three seasons as a project firefighter and then progress into a full-time role," she said.

As a fuel management officer, Cath helps plan the delivery of the district's planned burning program which reduces the risk of bushfires to Upper Murray communities including her hometown.

While she now spends more time in the office, she hasn't lost her interest in emergency management and is an accredited crew leader and can do multiple roles in the incident management team.

"As a crew leader I love the leadership component of the role, making decisions and having a lot more responsibility, particularly for the people you are leading," she

Cath is the first to acknowledge that being a mum to two young children, Archie and now daughter Billie, while working in emergency management is a constant challenge.

"FFMVic supports me to work from home when I need to and, depending on the situation, I can either work in the incident management team or out in the field," she explained.

The opportunity to live locally and help protect her community from the threat of future bushfires is at the core of Cath's love for what she does.

"For me, being able to look after the forest and the community that has looked after me and my family for so long is pretty special,' she said.

Chip off the butcher's block

The Wodonga Bulldogs celebrated the 100game milestone of captain Ollie Greenhill against Wangaratta on Saturday; matching the achievement of his father David, who played a total of 133 games for the club in the late 1980s and 1990s.

They are the first father-son combination to break the century barrier in the Dogs' 88 years in the Ovens & Murray league.

Universally known as 'Butch', David was acknowledged as one of the most dynamic midfielders in the competition who could pinpoint a pass to a team mate with either foot.

He was drafted by the Brisbane Bears in the 1989 mid-season draft but did not play a senior game with the club before returning to Wodonga.

His career was cut short when he suffered a head injury in a match in 1992.

He was named on a wing in the Bulldogs' Team of the Century alongside fellow Upper Murray recruits Ernie Whitehead (centre) and Jon Collins (wing).

Ollie (pictured) was appointed as Wodonga captain in 2021 at the age of 23 and shows similar skills and traits as his father, leading his team to the brink of finals in 2024.

Des Kick away

With three rounds of the home and away season remaining, Cudgewa has sewn up top spot on the ladder, sitting four games clear of Bullioh.

The Dogs remote chances of overhauling Cudgewa were dashed after losing to the Blues by 34 points in round 8.

The surprise result of the round was Corryong recording a 24-point win over Tumbarumba - it's first victory in 725 days just a week after the Roos caused the first upset of the season by defeating Bullioh.

However, the finals makeup is now set with Tumbarumba to host Corryong in the 1st semifinal on August 3rd and Cudgewa to play Bullioh in the 2nd semi-final the following week.

The Blues and Dogs both bolstered their stocks

prior to clearances closing on June 30th.


