# **Council offers grant help**

Towong Shire Council has provided additional assistance to communities that were impacted by the January bushfires by establishing a \$750,000 Community Recovery Grants Program.

"The grants program will support communities in the municipality that have been affected by the bushfires and locally led

recovery initiatives," said Towong mayor, Cr David Wortmann.

"The grant program follows on from council's recently delivered rates relief package."

The funding for the recovery grants program will come from the Australian government's Bushfire Recovery Program (\$550,000) and

Community Recovery Package (\$200,000).

"The objective of the grant program is to provide funding for projects and activities deemed essential for the recovery and renewal of our communities," Cr Wortmann said.

"Grants of up to \$5,000 are available to not-forprofit organisations and community groups across Towong Shire including service clubs, community recovery committees and action groups.

"We hope that the grant program will assist community groups to take

the Victorian government's the next steps towards recovery by giving them the funds they need to deliver on their ideas.

"Recovery timelines naturally varies across communities, so there will be three rounds of funding throughout the year; supporting those that are ready to take action now and providing opportunities for groups that need a little more time to establish their recovery



## \$750,000 Community Recovery Grants Program

This week Council launched a \$750,000 Community Recovery Grants Program to support locally led initiatives with grants of up to **\$5,000 to fuel recovery and renewal of our communities**.

The program is open to non-for-profit organisations and community groups including service clubs, community recovery committees and action groups across Towong Shire.

Funded by the Commonwealth Government's Bushfire Recovery Program (\$550,000) and the State Government's Community Recovery Package (\$200,000). Applications are open from July 2020 to June 2022, with **three rounds annually**. The first round of applications will close on **Friday 14 August**.

#### **Short-Term Modular Housing**

Residents who lost their primary place of residence in the bushfires now have the option to move into a quality, **modular home on their property** for up to three years while they rebuild.

The housing will be delivered to the property or another location where agreed, in line with planning permit exemptions announced by the Victorian Government.

The homes will be installed and built at no cost and recipients will pay hiring fees benchmarked to public housing rates.

Hardship arrangements will be put in place if needed to ensure that fees do not exceed 25 per cent of a household's total income.

Short-term modular housing is jointly funded by the Victorian and Commonwealth Governments.

# Health service complies with new rules

Corryong Health continues to work within the constraints of Covid-19 to maintain the safety of both its staff and community members.

The Victroian and Australian governments have put in place restrictions to protect residents and workers in residential aged care facilities which iinclude legal requirements for visitor entry into residential aged care facilities.

"Corryong Health is expected to comply with all legal requirements," said Corryong Health CEO, Dominic Sandilands, "and the restrictions are regularly being reviewed with the changing pandemic.

"We are screening everyone upon entry to the premises including staff, clients and visitors including answering several health questions and undergoing a temperature check.

However, preparation to re-open the gym has continued with the purchase and installation of storage units and some new equipment. More equipment is on order but delivery has been affected by the coronavirus.

It was expected that the gym would re-open at the new premises in late July but an exact date has not yet been determined.

Plans are being developed for how the facility will operate under coronavirus restrictions including which classes can be offered in the initial weeks.

It is expected that the gym will only be open when a staff member can be in attendance, to ensure appropriate social distancing rules are maintained.

Members will also be required to undergo an induction to orient themselves with the new facility.

# **Borders blocked to the invisible enemy**

I never thought I'd see our usually seamless state border with NSW blocked with concrete barriers and checkpoints controlling entry on the main bridges such as Bringenbrong.

The world had turned upside down more than once since the New Year with fires and Covid-19 with its second lockdown.

On receiving the news of the pending border closure at midnight on Tuesday 7 July, we drove to Albury to be in place to have our car serviced the next morning. Before leaving I photographed Bringenbrong Bridge. Like many Ι was wondering when we might be able to drive across it freely again. Bringenbrong Bridge was bathed in winter sunshine but a closer look revealed a NSW police car arriving.

The sight of the policeman doing some reconnaissance for the forthcoming closure reminded me that the border had not always been seamless. My father Tom Mitchell told stories of how before Federation in 1901, there was a duty on cattle crossing from NSW into Victoria with heavy fines for anyone caught smuggling stock. Some border crossings even had their own little

customs houses. The unpopular tax was tough on those in Tumbarumba Shire who were often more reliant on Victorian markets than

they were on the NSW counterparts. The Mitchell

family, which bought Bringenbrong from the Douglas family in 1875, had their own experiences to relate of the smuggling days. The whitethorn on the river flats could conceal mobs of cattle and one of the tactics was to have a quiet, old cow, then someone would take her calf up onto his saddle and ford the river with the cow following. The idea was that the rest of the mob

would follow. This had

to be done without using dogs or whips.

Federation in 1901 brought an end customs although it didn't achieve the same result with cattle 'duffing'. Tom was born after Federation in 1906 so it must have been his father and uncle Jack from Khancoban and perhaps some of the other 'old hands' who told him smuggling tales and warned him about cattle duffing.

Until the first wooden bridge at Bringenbrong was built in about 1906, there was only a ford marked by a cream can lid nailed to a post further down stream from where the bridge is now and where the river was shallow. If you had to cross the river other than on horseback, then you needed to fetch old George Evans, the boatman, who lived at Bringenbrong. Naturally you needed to have your transport organised for your onward journey. In just over a century the river has changed and the post marking the ford no longer exists.

This winter the river is running high and cold and with a strong current. Few in their right minds would think of fording

the river, even with the best boatman in the Upper Murray.

Tom wrote of how one of his earliest recollections of 'inter-state brotherly feeling' was in 1919 when the NSW police suddenly appeared and barricaded Bringenbrong the Bridge with logs during the Spanish influenza epidemic.' Tom explained that in the late summer and autumn of 1919 the river was low and the family found a convenient ford a mile higher up stream. Meanwhile, the local policeman was able to fish peacefully from the bridge! The thought of freshly caught trout for dinner clearly had some persuasive powers for keeping an eye blind!I don't think our policemen would be quite so relaxed now.

In those days there was no danger of hooking carp from the river!

In the 1960s there was a manned (during working hours) fruit fly checkpoint on the Victorian side about a kilometre from Bringenbrong Bridge. Honest people handed over their fruit and the iInspector had the power to search people's cars if he suspected them of being dishonest. The fruit

was then thrown in a bin beside the inspector's hut. The bin could be a good source of apples for our horses if we happened to be riding that way outside the inspector's working hours. He was a decent man and there wasn't anything he could have done anyway.

For those with fruit in their cars and who were hoping to cross from NSW into Victoria, one could always drive to Towong Bridge where there was no inspector and a bin was provided in which travellers were meant to leave fruit. I never heard of anyone doing so.

Of course, Covid-19 is in a totally different league to fruit fly.

This time the roadblocks are very different and just like the 1919 flu pandemic, the enemy is invisible but it is so much more complex and threatening.

On Towong bridge heavy concrete barriers have been used instead of the tree trunks. The border closure is inconvenient to those who work or have business, or family to care for or rely on medical services on the other side

of the state line. In some cases in other areas, the border closures might break some of the very businesses we need to help feed the population and to keep the country on its feet. I would like to think common sense solutions are being found for local cross border traffic.

Our driving licences have our addresses and should identify us as being local folk and speed up the process. I understand Tintaldra Bridge has opened again.

Apart from the impact on families and businesses, the closure of the border is a measure of the seriousness of Covid-19. As I write this, the virus is making another chapter in our local history and no doubt with many stories to match.

Meanwhile, we can only imagine the relief we will all feel once we're virus-free, restrictions have been lifted and the borders are open!

*Footnote:* (1) Local historian, John Whitehead, recalls that in 1938 as a seven-yearold, the border was closed because of a major polio epidemic and all children had to be checked by the local doctor and then undergo home schooling.

*Footnote 2:-* A virus of a different type caused the closures of the NSW and Queensland borders in 2007 when Australia's horse racing industry was disrupted for four months by an outbreak of equine influenza.



Rural areas urged to play it safe

Regional communities are being warned not to drop the ball when it comes to remaining safe from the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Rural Doctors Association of Australia (RDAA) and Australian College of Rural and Medicine Remote (ACRRM) said that, while most of the recent COVID-19 cases have been in metropolitan areas, there is significant potential for new cases present in rural to the communities in coming weeks.

"With the recent reopening of some state borders, increased school holiday travel and ongoing freight operations between states and into regional areas, it is reasonable to assume coronavirus could spread into more rural communities in the weeks ahead," said Clinical Lead for RDAA and ACRRM's COVID-19 Rural and Remote Response, Dr Adam Coltzau.

"Indeed, some new COVID-19 cases have already been confirmed in a number of rural

communities in Victoria and NSW.

"We have also seen this week that some people who visited the Crossroads Hotel at Casula, in outer Sydney, have now presented for testing in Queensland – so clearly there is potential for the virus to quickly move long distances as people do.

"A key message from governments is that anyone showing any symptoms, however mild, should get tested for COVID-19, as this can greatly assist in tracing transmission of the virus.

"We urge rural Australians to ensure they are doing this and please, if you haven't already done so, download the COVIDSafe app to make contact tracing easier."

Dr Coltzau said it is critical that rural Australians continue to maintain social distancing of at least 1.5 metres, regularly wash their hands, cover their mouth and nose if they cough or sneeze and self-isolate and get tested if they are showing any flu symptoms.
