



# **Sport likely to return**

Following the announcement of an easing of lockdown restrictions by the Victorian government yesterday, the Upper Murray Football Netball League (UMFNL) is preparing to resume the 2021 season on Saturday.

Club delegates were meeting yesterday afternoon to finalise arrangements for the resumption of competition with the scheduled round nine to be played.

The league made all the attempts to return to play last Saturday however, with no change in the directives regarding use of

change rooms and a venue limit of 150 people, it became unviable for clubs to operate on game day.

The latest changes to restrictions now permit crowds of up to 1000 people to attend sporting events in regional Victoria.

The lockdown had caused the postponement of UMFNL rounds seven and eight which were originally re-scheduled to the bye weekends (June 12 and July 3).

As matches were not possible last weekend, club delegates will decide which round will be rescheduled to July 3.

They will also have to consider what options are available if only one round can be re-scheduled. These include abandoning the round and awarding all clubs two premiership points or extending the season by one week to accommodate the extra round.

The round nine draw is:- Bullioh v Cudgewa and Tumbarumba v Federal with Corryong having the bye.

Any late changes will be posted on the league's Facebook page and the Corryong Courier website.

### Couple rescued off mountain

Corryong police and local emergency services were involved in two rescue incidents on the long weekend which were fortunate not to end in disaster.

On Saturday afternoon at around 3pm the alarm was raised that two people were stranded on the top of Mt Pinnibar after the pair's 4WD vehicle became bogged in a snow drift.

Sergeant Liam McMahon of Corryong police said the rescue mission was an extensive and delicate one but with the assistance of Department of Evironment, Land, Water & Planning (DELWP) personnel the Wodonga couple were evacuated from the mountain at around 10pm.

Corryong police were also involved in another rescue on Monday with their NSW counterparts when a jet skier was injured on the Murray River at Bringenbrong.

The man and three acquaintances from the

Albury Wodonga area had set out from Jingellic by jet ski and travelled up upstream.

The experienced quartet, who were wearing helmets and safety gear, had entered the Swampy Plains River when one of the riders collided with a tree branch, rendering him unconscious.


His friends got him out of the water and following a multi-agency emergency response, he was transported by ambulance to Albury Base Hospital.

#### **Grants give rural** communities a step up

Corryong & District Memorial Hall is one of 112 recipients

that will share in funding of \$1,589,612 to help to strengthen smaller remote, rural and regional communities throughout Victoria, including those recovering from 2019/20 bushfires.

funding has been allocated by the Foundation for Regional Rural Renewal (FRRR) through its Strengthening Rural Communities (SRC) program.

The Memorial Hall committee has been successful in obtaining several grants in recent years since embarking on a major renovation project and the latest funding of \$25,000 will be used to increase local pride and connection to place through repairs to the hall's historic staircase.

The SRC program is collaboratively funded and its broad scope enables smaller remote, rural, and regional communities to receive funding for a wide range of initiatives that are led by local people and address local needs.

This round of SRC includes funding across three streams - Small & Vital, Larger Leverage and Bushfire Recovery grants.

For regions continuing to recover and renew following the 2019/2020 bushfires, grants range from \$2,500 to \$25,000.

Natalie Egleton, CEO of FRRR, said this round has seen rural communities across Australia seek funding for inspiring initiatives that build community resilience and support individual and community health and wellbeing at a local level.

"Many communities have been impacted multiple disasters,

including the flooding in NSW and parts of QLD," she said.

"For these regions, economic recovery from the disasters has been severely challenged by Covid-19. For community organisations, pandemic has hampered fundraising efforts and their capacity to provide services. Understandably, local volunteers are pretty worn out.

"As gathering restrictions ease, we are seeing more requests for work on outdoor spaces community events, as people come together to strengthen community engagement and participation," Ms Egleton said.

The Small & Vital grants stream provides funding of up to \$10,000 for local initiatives that enhance the wellbeing, strength and resilience of rural communities. This round of SRC has seen 52 projects in places across all States and Territories sharing in a total of \$356,342 in Small & Vital

Larger Leverage grants provide funding of up to \$25,000, generally for remote or very remote parts of Australia. The larger grants are intended help overcome logistical barriers that can limit the opportunity for multifaceted projects in these regions. A total of \$595,362 has been awarded to 27 projects through the Larger Leverage stream.

This round the Bushfire Recovery stream awarded a total of \$637,908 in grants to 33 initiatives designed to help seed and strengthen recovery of communities impacted by the 2019-20 summer bushfires. Further information on these Bushfire Recovery projects is available on

FRRR's website. The current round is accepting applications until 24 August, 2021, with funds to be awarded in December 2021

# Budget survey shows people want to see change

After the Federal Budget was handed down on May 11, the Member for Indi, Dr Helen Haines, ran a survey to hear what the people in the electorate think about new funding announcements and if it would make a difference to their lives.

"An astounding 1,402 Indi residents took five minutes to respond to my call," she said.

"The survev respondents were diverse. It included everyone from young school leavers in Wangaratta, to aged care workers in Bright and retired veterans in Wodonga. One third of respondents live in Wodonga (14 per cent), Wangaratta (10 per cent) and Benalla (7 per cent). The remaining two-thirds came from smaller towns and regions.

"The overall feedback was clear. Big budget announcements mean nothing until there is real change on the ground that

people can see.

"The results show that overwhelmingly, people in Indi believe the government should be doing much more on renewable energy and climate, integrity in politics, the housing crisis and health," Dr Haines said.

"While people in Indi welcome new funding for aged care and mental health, they generally have very low confidence in the ability of the government to ultimately deliver real change."

The report shows that of the Indi residents surveyed:-

- 81 per cent believe the government should do more on renewable energy and climate;
- There aren't enough aged care workers to meet community need;
- Respondents had very low confidence in the government's ability to actually fix the aged care system (their average

confidence level was 3 out the of 10); actual

- 69 per cent of people who've tried to access mental health services in the past 12 months experienced major barriers including lack of services, cost and wait times;
- Respondents had very low confidence in the government's ability to fix the mental health system (their average confidence level was 2 out of 10);
- Two thirds believe housing prices in Indi are too expensive and that more should be done to help people in regional Australia buy a home;
- 50 per cent of respondents with children said the new \$1.8 billion child care package would not change their ability to take up child care;
- Respondents were very concerned for women's safety and economic security (the average concern level was 8 out of 10) and the same people weren't convinced

# the government can actually effect change (the average confidence level was 3 out of 10).

"As an Independent I listen to my community and put their views first," Dr Haines said.

"The results of this survey will inform my work over the coming months in Parliament, including how I vote on Bills and upcoming meetings with Ministers and the Prime Minister."



## **Energy grants help lower power costs**

Up to \$67,700 in grant funding is now available for community groups in the Indi electorate for small-scale renewable energy projects to improve energy efficiency, lower energy use, save money and reduce emissions.

Member for Indi, Dr Helen Haines, has called for not-for-profit community organisations to submit their expressions of interest for the new Powering Communities Program grants before 5pm on Friday 2 July, 2021.

Grants between

\$5,000 and \$12,000 are available for small-scale renewable energy projects, including:-

- Upgrading equipment to reduce energy consumption;
- Investing in energy monitoring and management systems;
- Investing in on-site renewable energy and solar-connected batteries; and
- Undertaking energy management activities and assessments.

This can include purchasing and installing solar PV or batteries,

upgrading air conditioning or hot water systems, LED lighting, cooktops and refrigerators and conducting energy audits. Up to 12 projects will be funded.

Dr Haines encouraged all community groups to check out the eligibility criteria and consider applying.

"Electricity bills can be one of the biggest costs for community groups, particularly when winter comes around," she said.

"Many community groups want to reduce energy use but don't have the funds to take the next step.

"These grants will give them a boost and means they can spend less on power and more on meeting the needs of their communities."

Expressions of interest can be lodged online at www.helenhaines.org/resources/grants.

Expressions of interest will be assessed by a grants consultative committee in mid-July 2021.

Successful applicants will then be invited to make a full application for funding.
