Towong will suffer from new tax

The Windfall Gains Tax that comes into effect next week is a nail in the coffin of residential development in the Towong Shire, says Member for Benambra Bill Tilley.

"Labor's latest tax - one of more than 50 since they came to power in 2014 - will slug landowners of rezoned land up to 50 per cent of its new value," Mr Tilley said.

"The result is owners of farmland rezoned to residential and assessed to have increased in value by \$500,000 will have to pay the Victorian government \$250,000!"

Mr Tilley said it will affect housing supply and affordability as well as rob small councils like

Towong of additional ratepayers.

"At Towong, the balance sheet looks positive but it's artificially inflated by bushfire and flood recovery money," Mr Tilley told Parliament yesterday.

"Towong is big - 7000 square kilometres with less than 6000 people. It's capacity to generate income is limited.

"One option was to cash in on the growth of Albury Wodonga - rezone its rural land to residential to create affordable land, more housing and additional revenue.

"But the Windfall Gains Tax will scuttle all that," Mr Tilley alleged.

The tax comes into

effect on July 1 and is not applied to rezoned land where the uplift in value is less than \$100,000.

Mr Tilley said it was another case of Labor's vision being limited to metro Melbourne.

"There was no consultation and no modelling for this tax that pundits warned would disproportionately affect housing supply and affordability in regional Victoria," he said.

"It's a disincentive to development and will add to the cost of those who dream of owning their own home.

"This tax does none of that, and sadly, it's also going to rob many councils of potential income."

Confusion reigns over grant advice

Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley, has been asked to investigate a mixup over a grant for the installation of a 30,000 litre diesel tank in Corryong.

Mildren & Coysh

Pty Ltd had applied for a grant under Round One of the Disaster Ready Fund (DRF) 2023-24 to increase the diesel supply for the Upper Murray.

They received an

email on June 6th from Emergency Management Victoria (EMV) advising that the application had been successful for an amount of \$49,950.

Niche pantry products have taken off

A local home business that was born out of the pandemic has been nominated for an Australian Rural Business Award.

The extended lockdowns were the catalyst for Shelley Neale to create her business, The Khancoban Kitchen, which specialises in gourmet pantry products.

Shelley was working from home as a travel agent but in July 2020 her hours were drastically reduced when the lockdowns took full effect.

As someone who loves to cook, she became increasingly frustrated with the scarcity of quality spices available locally and one night when she was unable to get all the ingredients for a butter chicken meal for dinner, she decided to source her own.

"It was cheaper to buy in bulk and I then identified there was a gap in the market I could fill with a quality product," Shelley said.

"Having 12 years experience in the tourism industry, I decided to theme my business and the names of my products around major landmarks,

towns and attractions in the Upper Murray and Snowy Valleys regions to draw more attention to the beautiful area we call our home."

The initial range of five products which was launched in November 2020 and included Cudgewa Cajun, Bringenbrong Burgers and Pine Mount Peri Peri has now grown to fifteen 'make-a-meal' kits and eight seasonings and barbecue rubs.

"The Khancoban Kitchen is a small business dedicated to the simple things in life - good, healthy, fresh food; participating in and promoting our community; and looking after the environment," Shelley said.

"Our products are also 'kid friendly' in that they are not overly spicy, which is a great way to introduce them to different tastes and cuisines.

"We also use environmentally friendly packaging for all our products.

"I am humbled to be nominated for the awards and its nice for The Khancoban Kitchen to be recognised," Shelley said.

Park recovery works continue

In response to a report in last week's *Corryong Courier* about delays in rehabilitating the Bluff Falls tourism area, Parks Victoria has provided an update on works that have been undertaken or that are underway in the Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park following the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires.

"Recovery works across the Parks Victoria estate are subject to geotechnical assessments; approval of draft designs and contractor availability; environmental, cultural and heritage approvals and permits; as well as the availability of insurance funding," explained Chris Derrick, District Manager, Parks Victoria.

"Local rangers have restored and improved access to Pine Mountain in the Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park, following the recent completion of recovery works past Rocky Knob to Mad Woman's Well along the Pine Mountain Walking

Track.

"Visitors can now drive to the trailhead to access and enjoy nature on the mountain as it slowly recovers."

The National Park was severely impacted by the 2019-20 bushfires with damaged assets further impaired by flood and storm events in late 2022.

Despite significant regrowth, the heavy rain events caused major erosion creating washouts, undermining culverts and causing further damage to some fire affected areas.

"Works to complete the remaining two kilometres of damaged track to the summit will occur as soon as conditions permit," Mr Derrick said.

"Local staff are also working with engineers and designers to finalise the infrastructure that was damaged at Bluff Falls.

"Parks Victoria recognises the importance of Bluff Falls and the greater Burrowa-Pine Mountain National

Park area to the local community and tourism industry.

"We know it's disappointing that parts of the National Park remain closed but as a responsible land manager we have to take a safety-first approach and close access when there's a known risk to visitors.

"We understand Bluff Falls is a key visitor site and we plan to deliver much improved and safer access for all visitors."

Mr Derrick added that upgrades to the picnic areas at Emberys Lookout and Mittamatite Summit are also complete with the installation of new picnic tables and barbecues.

"With vegetation coming back to both sites, visitors will be treated to a magnificent experience especially if they take the short walk to Emberys Lookout for views deep into the Corryong Valley or around the Tower Loop Nature Trail for a look over the Murray River

floodplain," he said.

"With the winter school holidays fast approaching, we are grateful to the local

community and visitors for their continued patience and priority to keep safe by staying outside of

closed areas.

"Parks Victoria will continue to put the safety of all Victorians first working

alongside traditional owners, communities and the wider Victorian government."

Pub re-opens its doors

Khancoban residents faced the prospect of being without a 'watering hole' after the town's only pub, the Alpine Inn, was shut last week after the manager walked out.

There had been rumours over the past couple of months that the pub's doors could close but becoming a fact blindsided many people.

However, it is understood that the pub was back in business after two days when the owner stepped in.

It was announced on the pub's new Facebook page that the Alpine Inn will be operating under new management following a meeting with the staff last Friday.

"We appreciate the need to reopen asap for both our staff and for the

community," the statement said.

"We will begin a refurbishment straight away and trade through-out."

The venue was purchased by a Sydney-based food and beverage hotelier in May 2022 who announced plans to conduct an extensive renovation on the pub and motel rooms.

The closure of the pub would have left Khancoban without licensed premises while the Khancoban Country Club remains closed.

However, in brighter news for the town, the club's board which was elected last November, will host 52nd birthday celebrations and a member update at the venue this Saturday from 6pm.

It was planned to hold 50-year celebrations but this was not possible because of the pandemic.

Limited bar facilities will be available and of course there will be a cake!

The board has been working through the necessary documentation and processes to re-open the country club in the near future.

In the meantime, a dedicated group has kept the golf club operating and even had a team compete in the 2022-23 Hills Zone pennant competition for the first time in many years.

Another plus for the town is the work being undertaken to upgrade the Khancoban Hall and restore it to its previous status as a place for the community to gather.

Tradie sparks up fellow workers

The Governor-General has announced Australian Antarctic Medals to recognise and celebrate the outstanding service of three Australians - former local Lisa Wilkinson and Robert King and Aaron Read.

Lisa was recognised for her outstanding contribution to the Australian Antarctic Program, particularly through advocacy for diversity and inclusion.

Her award commendation said "her experience as an electrician in Antarctica has her in a unique position to relate closely to the experiences of other trades people on station.

"She establishes a rapport, putting fellow trades people at ease and provides a safe space for them to engage in. This helps tie the technical groups together and forms strong working relationships that may not otherwise develop.

"This is critical at times when there may be an incident to investigate or a problem to solve.

"Ms Wilkinson is an exceptional technical writer and voluntarily developed the electrical safety policy for her

branch. This has been accepted more broadly through the Australian Antarctic Division (AAD). She also delivers related training to all AAD expeditioners.

"She regularly extends beyond her duties for the benefit of others including joining the diversity and inclusion working group. She has been a staunch advocate for women's participation in the Australian Antarctic Program and participates in the Department of Education's STEM Professional in Schools program, inspiring the next generation.

"During her seasons south she initiated and encouraged community spirit through a range of social activities. She was always willing to lend a hand and help out when someone needed support.

"Ms Wilkinson assisted delegations in discussions with the station leader and articulated their concerns without prejudice or malice. She is a strong supporter and advocate for current expeditioners and their mental health and wellbeing.

"It is her unique personality and approach to life and work that

defines her as an exceptional expeditioner and employee."

Mr King was recognised for his outstanding contribution to the program, particularly through innovative research in marine biology.

Mr Read was acknowledged for his outstanding contribution to the program, particularly through the establishment and leadership of the Wilkins Ice Runway Aerodrome in East Antarctica.

In congratulating

the three recipients, the Governor-General, David Hurley, said "Each has made an outstanding contribution to Australia's Antarctic endeavours and this recognition is an opportunity for the nation to celebrate them.

"Australia has a long and proud connection to Antarctica that is made possible by the hard work, scientific expertise and passion of the people that work there.

"The Australian Antarctic Medal is an important part of our

Honours and Awards system, and a way that we as a country can say how much we appreciate their work and the impact they have."

working since early 2020 to rejuvenate the park and make it an attraction for locals and visitors alike.

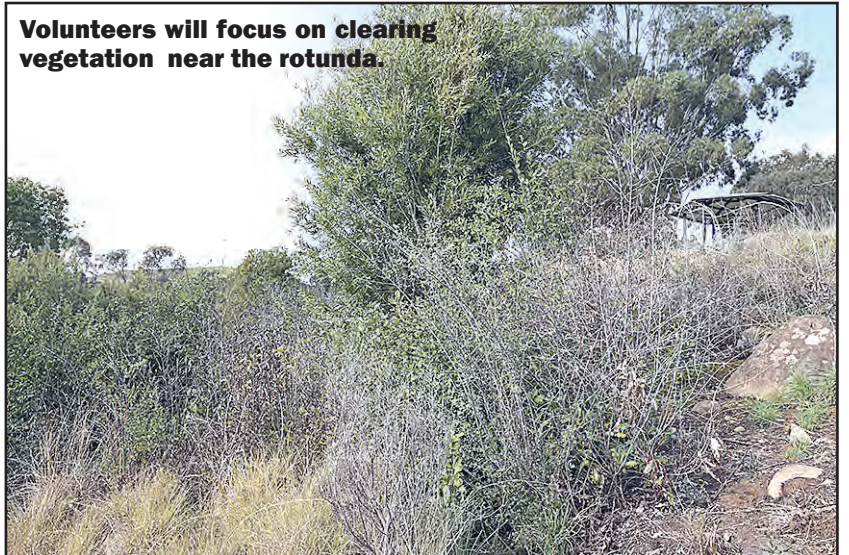
The focus areas for this working bee will be the clearing of invasive

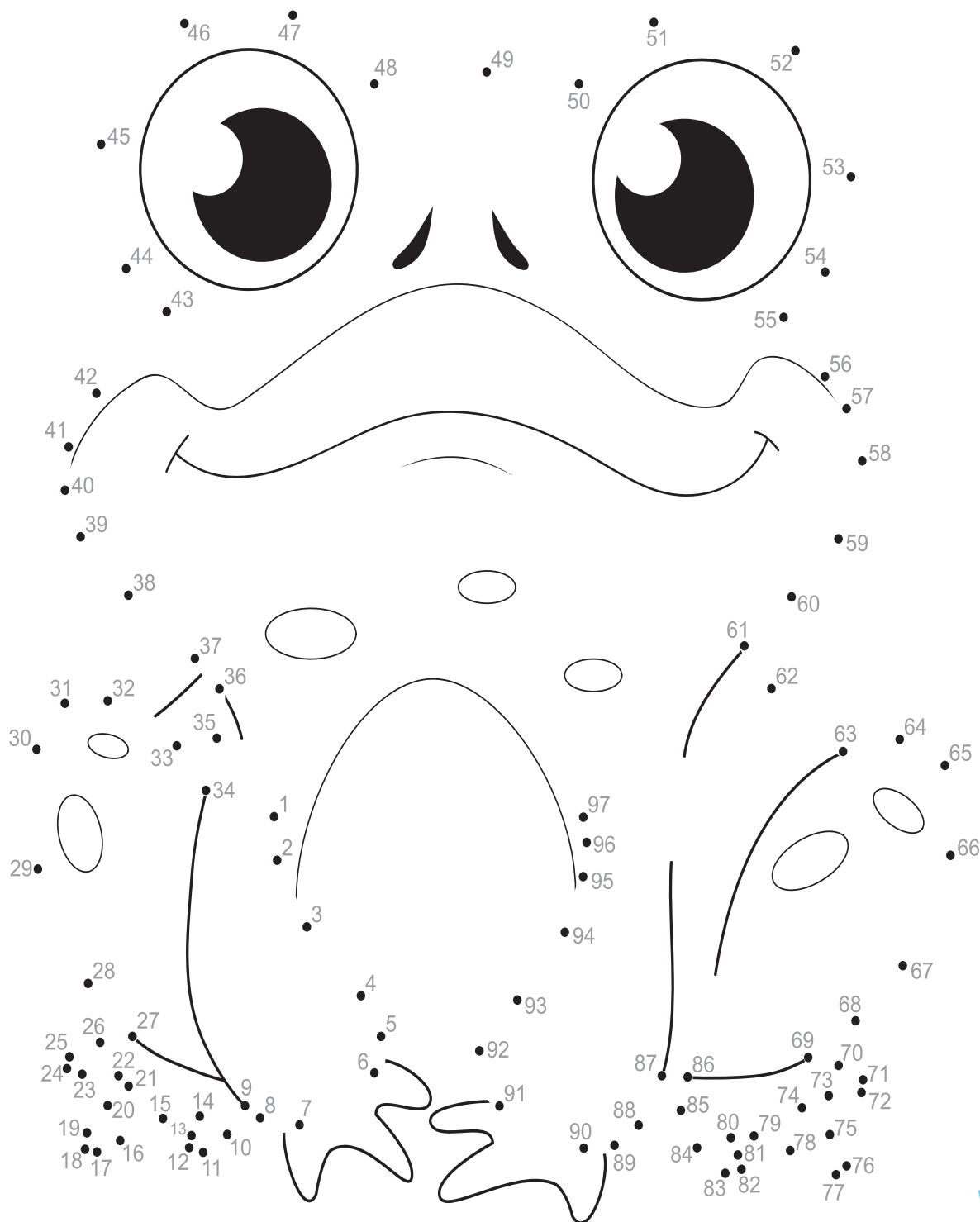

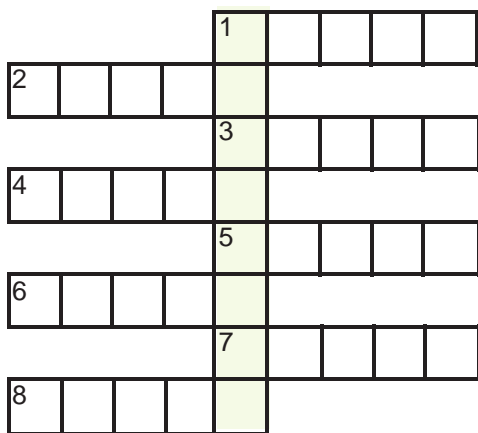

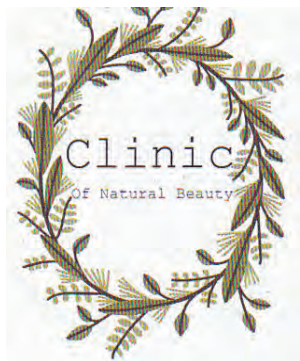
