With deer numbers currently at a record high, there is a growing threat to people's lives, according to Member for Benambra, Bill Tillev.

"Twice in recent weeks, cars have been written off after hitting deer on the roads around Wodonga," he said.

"Those travelling the roads in the Upper Murray know only too well the damage and danger they pose."

Mr Tilley raised the matter in the Victorian Parliament last week ahead of the \$18 million, four-year deer control funding program lapsing this Sunday, telling the Legislative Assembly that "the elephant in the room has antlers."

"This is now a deer plague that threatens people's lives," he said.

"I'm told the continued funding may come from another bucket of

this government and its upper house transactional charlatan, aka the Animal Justice Party, will conspire to save Bambi.

"This funding needs to be transparent.

"It must be maintained, and deer need to be controlled."

Deer numbers are widely reported at about 500,000 across Victoria.

Mr Tilley said the past program relied heavily on partnerships but that its future is unknown.

"On one hand we have the East Victorian Deer Control Plan that runs to 2028 and relies on professional and recreational shooters and on the other, we have found that the money for the deer control program lapses on June 30," he concluded.

"We have people in our community, experts in the field, who can carry out major control work in confined spaces, public places using drones and thermal imaging.

"On the urban fringe of Melbourne, the councils take an active role, perhaps it's time our councils got involved," Mr Tilley

Corryong The Surrounds Residents and Ratepayers Group held its first meeting on Wednesday June 19.

One of the key issues shared was the FOGO (Food Organics Garden Organics) bins that have recently been distributed throughout our area. There has been some information on Facebook and some people have received some information in the mail but many felt they'd like to know more.

Here are some of the questions that the group is curious to know more

- 1. What are FOGO bins and what is the process from collection to composted soil?
- 2. How can I be sure I'm putting the right things in the FOGO bin, as well as the other two bins?
- 3. What are the benefits of the FOGO system?
- 4. How is the 'Black Gold' (compost soil) used?
- 5. How do we access that soil for local gardens, parks and schools and will it be free?
- 6. How do townspeople who do not want the FOGO bin say 'no' and get a rebate?
- 7. What are the green liner bags made of?
- 8. How do we access more green liner bags in



future and is there a cost?

9. How do businesses access FOGO bins and are there larger compost bins for them?

10. Why do the new bin maps not include some roads such as Back Cudgewa Road Sugarloaf Road?

11. As there are many keen gardeners in the shire, why are gardeners being asked to use FOGO bins when they're composting already?

12. Communication why didn't Towong Shire take the opportunity to discuss this important project implementation?

It seems like a great opportunity to make the Corryong environment more sustainable through effective recycling and waste management was not used as well as it could have been.

As luck would have it, one of our group popped into the Shire Office on another matter. They found some excellent brochures

Writer proposed for park honour

During the war, she

The author of the renowned 'Silver Brumby' series of books, Elyne Mitchell. has been nominated to have a park named after her.

Wodonga Council seeking feedback on a proposal for the Elyne Mitchell Park to be established in the Kinchington Estate on the southern outskirts of the city.

Chauvel Elvne moved from Melbourne to the Upper Murray after marrying Tom Mitchell in 1935, owner of Towong Station and future Benambra MP and Attorney-General for Victoria.

With her husband being away for extended periods including a period as a prisoner-of-war in Changi Prison during WWII, Elyne helped manage the property and look after their children.

was part of a group nationalist writers who wrote poetry and prose centred on the Australian landscape. In this period, she wrote Australia's Alps (Sydney: Angus & Robertson, 1942) and Speak to the Earth (Sydney: Angus Robertson, 1945). In all, she is the author of 72 works of poetry, autobiography and children's and adult fiction.

However, Elyne is best known for the Silver Brumby series of children's books, the first of which she wrote for her daughter Indi, out of concern about the lack of Australian content in books.

She was also an avid bushwalker, conservation-

and competitive winning skier, Canadian downhill skiing championship in 1938.

She was awarded the Order of Australia in 1990 for her services to literature and the Corryong library was named after her in 2002.

Wodonga councillor, Libby Hall, told the Border Mail that Elyne was worthy of being recognised by having a park named in her honour.

"I think Elyne Mitchell is a well deserving person for the park which will be in the Leneva estate," she said.

Thomas Mitchell has already been recognised in Wodonga after the Tallangatta Road was renamed for him in 1979 and the Thomas Mitchell reserve at Shelley also honours him.






