Tintaldra misses out

Federal Member for Indi, Helen Haines, has called on Minister for Emergency Services, Bridget McKenzie, to reverse an administrative mistake that denied bushfire recovery funding to the bushfire-hit community of Tintaldra.

Dr Haines has written to Senator McKenzie after Tintaldra Hall was rejected for funding after mistakenly being classed as a state government entity, despite being a completely volunteer-run organisation.

The action from Dr Haines follows a

similar letter from the National Party Member for Gippsland, Darren Chester MP, who wrote to Senator McKenzie on the same issue, which has affected three community halls in Gippsland that were erroneously deemed ineligible for funding.

"This is a howler from the federal government," said Dr Haines.

"Community halls in Victoria are managed by all-volunteer Committees of Management and they simply use a state government ABN.

"This is a bureaucratic stuff up and if anyone with

common sense had looked at these applications, they would have realised volunteer-run, not-for-profit community halls are in no way state government entities," Dr Haines explained.

"All it needed was a phone call and Tintaldra Hall's application could have been properly considered. It needs to be fixed straight away.

"Tintaldra was in the heart of the fires and the local community is rightly frustrated at this latest rejection."

Dr Haines urged Senator McKenzie to reconsider her decisions given they were based on inaccurate information.

Towong gets ready to race

With the track in superb condition and a record number of nominations, all signs point to a successful Cup day meeting for the Towong Turf Club this Saturday.

The club has endured its share of setbacks in the past two years following the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires which threatened the historical grandstand, cancellation of the 2020 races after 100mm of rain fell on the track and last year's meeting being restricted because of the pandemic.

The 2022 Costello Rural-Life Plan Strategic Solutions Towong Cup promises to be an absolute cracker and to help celebrate 151 years of horse racing the turf club

plans to make it a day not to forget.

There will be roaming 'Fashions on the Field', entertainment and free shuttle buses to get you to and from the track safely, along with a fantastic seven-event race program kicking off at around 1pm.

There will also be musical entertainment following the last race.

The club has received a record 298 nominations for the seven races including last year's Cup winner, Sizzleonthebridge, which returns for another tilt at the main event.

Wantabadgery trainer, Rodger Waters, spent 30 years trying to win the Cup before last year's success and hopes to go back-to-back in 2022.

Final acceptors will be declared later today.

"Everything is looking great for Saturday - even the weather, fingers crossed!" said club manager, Rohan Whitehead.

"We expect the track to be rated a Good 4 and everything is in readiness for a top day out."

Although attendance at this year's race meeting is not capped, patrons will have to show proof that they are fully vaccinated upon entry.

Gates are open at 11am and the first race will be around 1pm.

Mural reflects rebirth of nature

After a number of delays due to pandemic restrictions in 2021, work on a mural to showcase the beauty of the local environment has begun on the wall of the High Country Trading Post in Corryong.

The Man from Snowy River Tourism Association (MFSRTA), assisted by a grant from the Commonwealth Bank, commissioned Chiltern artist, Kirrily Anderson, to create the mural in response to the Black Summer fires.

Local woman, Lizzie Star, managed to arrange time off from her day job to don her artist's gear and has been working alongside Kirrily with the mural preparation and painting.

"This has been a fantastic learning opportunity for me and also great fun to work with Kirrily," said Lizzie.

"It is so exciting to see the mixing of the coloured paints bring this wall to life!"

Kirrily added that she likes to mentor a local person to help with her projects.

"It adds to their skill set which they can also pass on to other community members for other works," she said.

The Corryong mural showcases some of the unique animals and plants which can be found in Mt Mittamatite and Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Parks. There is a great diversity of habitats ranging from the Murray River to moist gullies, rocky outcrops and the high alpine environment of Mt Burrowa.

Plants such as snow gums, tree ferns, river red gum and black cyprus pine (hence Pine Mountain) are featured.

Each environment also shows some of the lesser known plant and animal species such as the feathertail glider, spotted tail quoll, agile antechinus, bulbine lily and native storksbill.

As the mural nears completion, the iconic Bogong moth will make an appearance.

The moth transits through the Upper Murray from its breeding grounds in the plains of western New South Wales to the

cool rocky crevasses of the high mountain peaks in the summer. Once the mural is completed, a sign with QR code for further information will be attached to the wall.

Following the 2019-20 Black Summer fires, Kirrily also created a series of artworks based on her experience of exploring the burnt and recovering landscape of the Upper Murray and Alpine areas which will be on exhibition over the next week.

The artworks in the 'And Tomorrow the Beauty Returns' exhibition have been created using ink, watercolour and paint created from collected charcoal to show the beauty and devastation of the burnt landscape.

"This work was born from a desire to find hope and beauty following the loss of such a vast area of natural environment in North East Victoria following the 2019/20 fire season," said Kirrily.

The Upper Murray community is invited to the art exhibition in Davis Cottage from March 12th to 20th, with the opening

night event tomorrow (March 11th) from 5:30pm to 7:00pm. Register your interest at <https://bit.ly/3Lzh0Js>.

Kirrily will be in attendance at the exhibition on Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th March while volunteers will staff the exhibition for the remainder of the time.

"The exhibition was created for display at MAMA in Albury and we are excited to be able to bring this to the Upper Murray," said MFSRTA president, Ros McKenzie.

"We would like to thank Towong Shire Council and the Corryong Community Recovery Committee which have helped to make this possible.

"We would also like to thank Donna Abbenate and Tom Young for their permission to paint the mural on the wall and Greig and Gladys Farrell for access to their block," she added.

River crossing set to get new bridge

After several major renovations, the latest in 2016, the NSW government has decided to replace the Towong Bridge over the Murray River.

The project will remove the old crossing, which is at the end of its life span, replacing it with a safer, smoother bridge for the local cross border community.

The new concrete structure will be 11m wide, 58m long and incorporating two traffic lanes and a pedestrian walkway.

It is designed to withstand current and

future traffic loads while requiring less ongoing maintenance.

The current bridge is an all timber beam structure built in 1938.

Community feedback emphasised the importance of retaining the bridge's historical significance, while also delivering a safe crossing for motorists. During the project's consultation period, 21 submissions were received. As part of this work, Transport for NSW is investigating ways to celebrate the historical significance of the old bridge.

Project team members will hold an information session to discuss heritage options with the community next Tuesday, March 15th at the camping ground next to the bridge, between 10am and 12 noon. Work on the new bridge will be carried out in two parts, with the removal of the existing timber bridge to start in March 2022, followed by the construction of the new bridge, which is expected to take about 18 months to complete.

Art Jammin was a free event, sponsored and made possible via a Community Recovery Grant from the Towong Shire.



Field day focuses on powering up paddocks

Agriculture Victoria is holding its inaugural field day on the new Upper Murray Weed Warriors Producer Demonstration Site at Cudgewa next week.

The Weed Warrior Demonstration Group and site was established to enable producers affected by the 2019-20 fires, to witness the long-term effects of different management techniques when it comes to managing pasture and weeds after a fire.

Agriculture Victoria Livestock Development Officer, Nick Linden, says the benefit of the field day on the Weed Warriors demonstration site is that producers can see first-hand the impact of different management techniques.

"When you visit a one-off activity or field day, you can get information about processes but you can't really be sure if it will work or not," Mr Linden said.

"With this Weed Warrior Field Day, there's the chance to review different management techniques, then follow up and see what impact they had, what worked and what didn't.

"We will be able to see what it has meant for the pasture composition and be able to decide whether it was worth doing."

The inaugural field day, *Power your Paddocks*, will focus on weed control after fires, how to select pasture species, perennials versus annual and grass and legume options.

The event will also

include a demonstration on how to accurately calibrate your spray unit, nozzles, pressures and pumps and ways to improve spraying techniques.

"It's a really practical field day," Mr Linden said.

"If you are going to spend the time and money on seed and fertiliser and resowing or repairing your pasture, it's good to know it will be worth the effort."

The free event will be held on Thursday March 17 from 10am to 12.30pm on the Weed Warriors Demonstration Site at Cudgewa. The property was selected for its pastures, which are typical of those in the region.

Mr Linden will be onsite to provide an

introduction to the Weed Warriors project - run in conjunction with the Upper Murray Landcare Network - and discuss the different techniques involved in managing pasture after a fire, whether it's resowing or restoring.

Corryong agronomist, Graham Martin, will discuss what's been working in the Upper Murray regarding weed and pasture management, while farmer and chemical trainer, Neil Stringer, will provide practical tips on setting up and calibrating a spray unit to maximise efficiency.

Recovery funding targets youth development

A consortium led by Youth Affairs Council Victoria (YACVic) will receive a \$9.93 million, two-year Australian government Black Summer Bushfire grant to drive recovery outcomes for fire-affected young people and communities across eastern Victoria.

YACVic will coordinate the ambitious 'Future Proof: Young People, Disaster Recovery and (Re)building Communities' project, bringing together eight local

councils, two Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations, three Local Learning and Employment Networks and Victoria University.

"Young people and youth workers can play a critical role in disaster recovery and future proofing fire-affected communities," said Katherine Ellis, YACVic CEO. This project will help bring the unique experiences, perspectives and capabilities of young people to the rebuilding of

their communities.

"Future Proof" will also include qualification pathways for 150 local young people to kickstart careers in emergency management and community services."

For the past two years, in partnership with Bushfire Recovery Victoria and the Victorian Department of Education, YACVic has worked with young people in fire-affected areas to understand their experiences, collect their

ideas for community recovery and resilience and develop resources to facilitate young people's seat at the recovery table.

Quinn Obran, a student who was born and raised in Corryong, believes young people should be front and centre in disaster recovery.

"We will be inheriting everything after this so we should be involved," she said. "I am confident that the community would listen to us."




