Government lacks bush vision

Indi. Helen Haines, has called out the federal government for its lack of long-term ambition for regional Australians during this term of Parliament.

The comments come after the governmentcontrolled Select Committee on Regional Australia, of which Dr Haines is also a member, released its final report after a three-year inquiry into the state of current government policies and initiatives in the regions.

"After a three-year inquiry, with dozens of submissions and public hearings across the country, producing a 200page report, we are no closer to seeing what the government's vision for regional Australia is," Dr Haines said.

"A person reading this report would still be

left wondering what the government will do to improve regional health care, telecommunications, education, aged care and countless other social and infrastructure opportunities and needs."

Dr Haines did not oppose the majority report of the committee but made additional comments calling out the government for its failure to drive detailed reform for regional Australia.

"Only four pages are spent on regional energy security and environmental issues with no specific recommendations reform," she said.

"It is an alarming omission. especially given the devastating Black Summer bushfires that ripped through many regional electorates just two years ago and the unfolding flood crisis

Dr Haines said the report celebrated the Regional Deals program, despite a lack of progress for Albury Wodonga.

"If regional deals are the government's answer for investment in the regions, they have a lot of work to do," she said.

Dr Haines' additional comments included a suite of policies for regional Australia that would boost the economy, kickstart renewables and provide proper funding for health care.

"I've put forward detailed policies codesigned with regional communities that would ensure regional Australians benefit and own a share in the renewables boom, for

"I've also called on the government to ramp up its investment in critical health infrastructure in the regions, like a new worldclass hospital in Albury Wodonga and permanent funding for smaller rural hospitals, so we can access the care we need close to home.

"The government has failed to act on these calls. and many others.

"Three years is a long time to hold an inquiry. We've had Royal Commissions go for shorter periods of time and produce better results.

"We need benchmarks, year on year, that show in quantitative how investment in regional Australia is improving social, environmental and economic conditions," Dr Haines said.





Skin check van hits the road

The van will provide a free skin screening service to local people and will be operated by fully trained, certificated and professionally supervised volunteers. The unit will

Australia has one of also be a valuable resource for local people to access not only the skin check but valuable and timely information about skin care and self-checking techniques.

> "Early detection of skin lesions potentially saves lives, so this visit will be a timely support and reminder to local people of the need to take care of their skin," Lorraine said.

> Following the skin check, visitors will be issued with a referral to their GP if there are any suspect spots or lesions.

> The unit is not a medical clinic, so diagnosis or treatment requirements are not discussed.

The air conditioned van has three fully equipped screening rooms and an entry foyer, as well as a disabled lift and entry at the rear.






