Haines pushes priority budget projects

Independent Member for Indi, Helen Haines, has made the case for significant investment in projects that benefit communities in the electorate in her

submission to the federal government ahead of the May budget.

The key themes of Dr Haines' Indi Budget Submission reflect the widespread concerns of

the electorate right now including increasing regional housing supply, providing cost-of-living relief and improving health outcomes.

She is also advocating for funding for the upgrade of the Benambra-Corryong Road.

"This is a priority of the Towong Shire with \$40 million sought for the delivery of stage one of the project," she said.

Dr Haines' detailed funding proposals have been created in partnership with local councils,

regional development groups and community stakeholders such as Albury Wodonga Health, Alpine Resorts Victoria, Tourism North East and TAFE.

"The federal budget is a critical time for the government to invest in projects that are feasible, have merit and are supported by the community," she said.

"My budget submission makes recommendations for measures that address common needs across the electorate, as well as

projects that would create notable impact in specific regional communities.

"I also call for the federal government to pledge extra funding to the redevelopment of Albury Wodonga Health, to deliver on the single-site hospital our region deserves."

Dr Haines has advocated fiercely for funding to address the housing crisis in regional and rural Australia. In her budget submission, Dr Haines urges the government to establish a \$2 billion Regional Housing Infrastructure Fund to build basic infrastructure needed to support new developments and social housing infrastructure.

The budget submission also contains a suite of measures designed to ease cost-of-living pressures including:-

- substantially increasing the rates of income support payments and rent assistance

Rural lifestyle attracted new doctor

Having moved to Australia, Dr Porter is now pursuing her fellowship with the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners (RACGP) and is a Member of the Royal College of General Practitioners (MRCGP).

She boasts diverse experience as a doctor and GP, practicing in the UK and in Australia.

She also prides herself

on being an approachable and down to earth practitioner, keeping a deep sense of personal dedication to patients, the community and core fundamental values of general practice and medicine.

Her areas of particular interest include general adult medicine, women's health, medical education and emergency medicine.

Since 2018, Dr Porter has spent time working across Victoria, mainly in an Emergency Medicine Registrar capacity - initially in metropolitan Melbourne at the Austin, Northern Health and Frankston.

She then moved to work in regional health including Ballarat, Echuca, Shepparton and Albury Wodonga.

Dr Porter found a love for the rural Victoria



lifestyle and enjoys the sense of community rural general practice can bring.

and walking.

Other measures proposed by Dr Haines include:-

- funding initiatives that reduce energy costs for households and small businesses
- more primary health

care relief to lower healthcare expenses, and fee-free TAFE

"I am hearing from people every day that cost-of-living pressures are mounting," Dr Haines said.

"No-one should

have to choose between putting food on the table and seeing a doctor. The government must do more to incentivise bulk billing."

Each of Indi's nine local government areas are championed by Dr Haines' in her budget submission.

Street works paused for festival



Progress continues on the Corryong streetscape project, with the installation of water mains having been extended from the IGA supermarket to the post office this week.

"As anticipated though, we've identified six underground and abandoned fuel tanks," said project manager, Vilfred Correa

"We're taking steps to decommission these as a matter of both community and environmental safety before proceeding with the Stage 2 concrete work. We will also assess the other fuel tanks as the project progresses.

"With Easter and the Man From Snowy River Bush Festival around the corner, we're committed to ensuring the CBD remains neat and tidy for community and visitors," Mr Correa added.

"The worksite will be demobilised on Friday 22 March which will include the removal of machinery, most temporary fencing and a general cleanup of the site.

"Work will resume on the project from Monday, 22 April and our team will be working hard

to progress the work as quickly as possible."

The project is scheduled to be completed by June 2024.

In other council news, the mayor Cr Andrew Whitehead and CEO Juliana Phelps recently travelled to Melbourne for a Rural Councils Victoria event at Parliament House.

"It was a fantastic opportunity to advocate for priority projects that will benefit our communities and more importantly have face to face conversations with the decision makers on matters that are important to Towong Shire residents," Cr Whitehead said.

"While in Melbourne we also met with the Minister for Regional Development, Gayle Tierney, to present the Bellbridge Boathouse project and request a contribution from the state government to this 'shovel ready' project."

In further council news the mayor and the deputy mayor, Cr Denise Anderson, also joined their counterparts from neighbouring councils along with leading health care professionals,

politicians and advocates at the Regional Health Summit in Wodonga last week.

"Hosted by the City of Wodonga it was an opportunity to discuss some of the key challenges facing our health care professionals including the critical need for a single site Albury Wodonga Hospital," Cr Whitehead said.

"Our role as a council in these discussions is to ensure that the new hospital meets the needs of the broader regional community of 300,000 plus people which includes all Towong shire residents and key to this is a single site facility.

"As a council we are on the record as saying, we are not concerned by which side of the border the hospital is on but we are deeply concerned that a single site hospital will simply not be possible with the funding available.

"The result of this is that rural communities like ours are not getting their fair share of taxpayer revenue for the provision of health services and that is fundamentally unacceptable," Cr Whitehead said.



Priority burns planned locally



Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) intends to take advantage of favourable weather and forest conditions across the state to reduce the risk of bushfires on the community and environment.

FFMVic Deputy Chief Fire Officer, Aaron Kennedy, said planned burning is one of the key tools firefighters use to reduce the size, intensity, and impact of bushfires.

“As we have seen already this year, out of control bushfires can have a significant impact on people, property and the environment if started under the wrong conditions,” he said.

“Reducing fuels such as grass, leaves, bark, shrubs and fallen branches

means fires are less intense, slower to spread, and safer for firefighters to control.

“Autumn is generally the best time of the year to undertake planned burns as the weather is more stable and fire behaviour is manageable and predictable.”

This year 111 planned burns covering an area of 56,486 hectares are prepared and ready for ignition in north east Victoria.


Priority burns are planned in state forest, parks and reserves around Koetong, Lucyvale, Corryong, Bright, Tawonga, Beechworth, Mitta Mitta, Marysville, Upper Gundowring, Kinglake, Toolangi, Tatong, Tolmie, Gaffneys Creek and

Jamieson.

“While planned burning is our most effective tool to reduce bushfire risk, in locations where planned burning isn’t suitable we mulch, mow, slash and spray, build fuel breaks and maintain the public land road network to keep Victorians safer,” Mr Kennedy said.

FFMVic is made up of skilled and experienced staff from Victorian fire and land management agencies. Its partners include the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action (DEECA), Parks Victoria, Melbourne Water and VicForests.

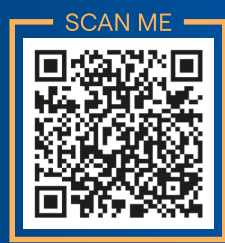

The Corryong Under 16s representative side completed their maiden season on the weekend with a third-placed finish in the Junior Country Championships at Bendigo in Division 4&5.

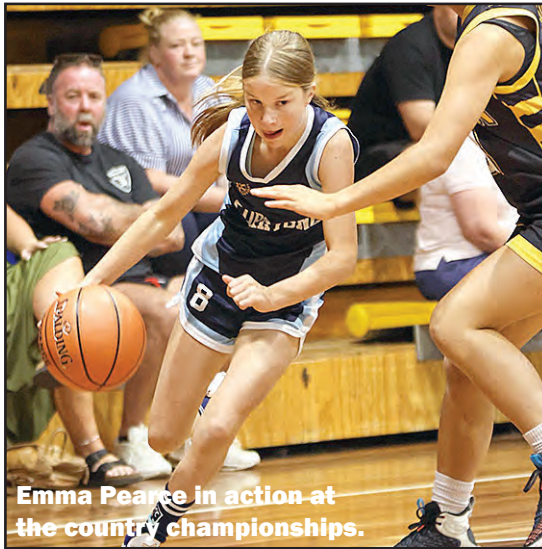
The players took some time to gel early on but the experience of coach Rho Fry quickly moulded them into a cohesive unit which improved rapidly over the season.

The team comprised Marlie McLean, Madi McKimmie, Ella Pearce, Quinn Galbraith, Tess Paton, Ella Grzeschka, Cecilia Paton and Jade Prosser.

Team manager, Jodie Grzeschka, said the team had received great support to attend the championships in Bendigo including Corryong IGA which helped raise \$1,875 from barbecues, which was put towards accommodation costs for the team.

The Corryong News-agency donated \$1000 for half of the new playing uniforms and the coach's tournament accommodation.

The Corryong Basketball Association covered the cost of the registration fees for all tournaments and the championships which included a \$200 donation from Black Sheep), a total

of \$1,450.

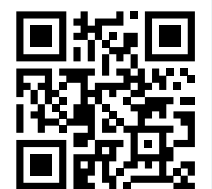

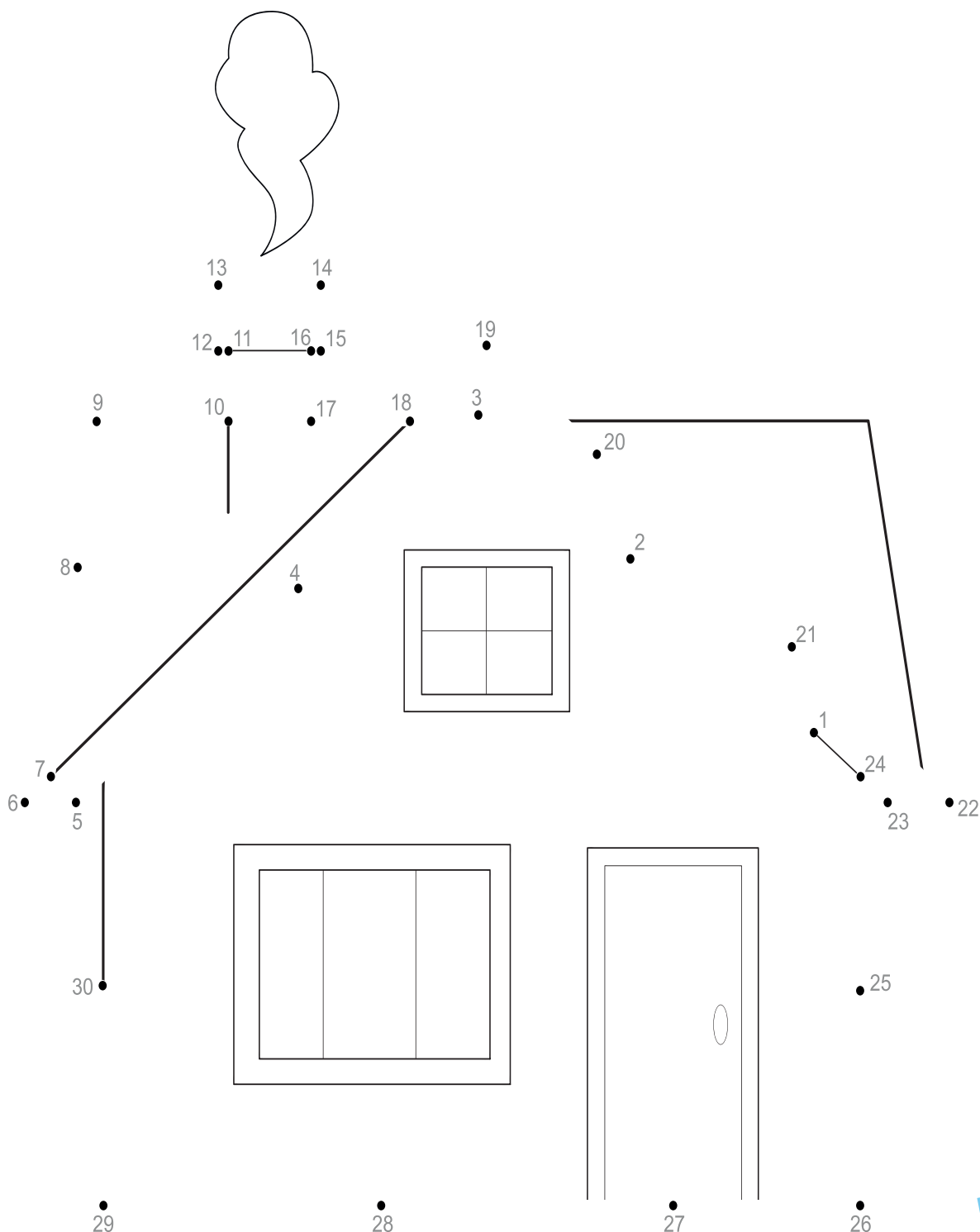

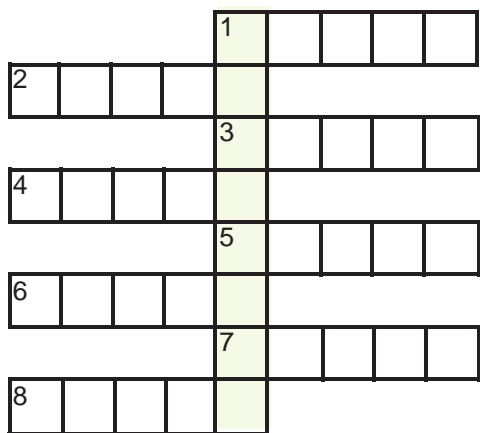
