Man charged over former hotelier's death

A man has faced a Queensland court over the death of 61-year-old Crows Nest woman, Krishna Chopra.

The body of the former lessee of the Courthouse Hotel in Corryong, was found in her home at Crows Nest, north of Toowoomba, on Monday January 31.

The victim's son-in-law, 33-year-old Simon Jones, was arrested last Thursday in Warwick and charged with her murder.

Police believe the death was a 'domestic violence matter' and that she died from severe head injuries at least ten days before her body was found.

Mates march on for vets

He may be sore but Corryong café owner, Stuart Spratt, is not sorry he decided to undertake a four-day charity walk to raise awareness of veterans' mental health issues.

Stuart started the trek from Bonegilla to Corryong last Friday and completed his journey on Monday - raising \$7500 for the 'March On' initiative.

The campaign is an initiative of Soldier On, a support services provider for defence force personnel, contemporary veterans and their families.

The funds will support Soldier On's life-changing mental health services and programs so that returned defence force members

and their families can 'march on'.

Stuart has several friends who have served in the defence forces and has seen first hand some of the problems they have faced.

He was accompanied on his charity walk by friend, Chris 'Critter' Campbell, with the pair covering 118 kilometres in four days.

Local veteran, Ray Waters, joined them on day one for a 38km stint and over the ensuing three days the pair covered 22kms uphill to Koetong, 30kms on Sunday and 27kms on the final day.

"Halfway on the home leg was the toughest," Stuart said.

"We just wanted to finish.

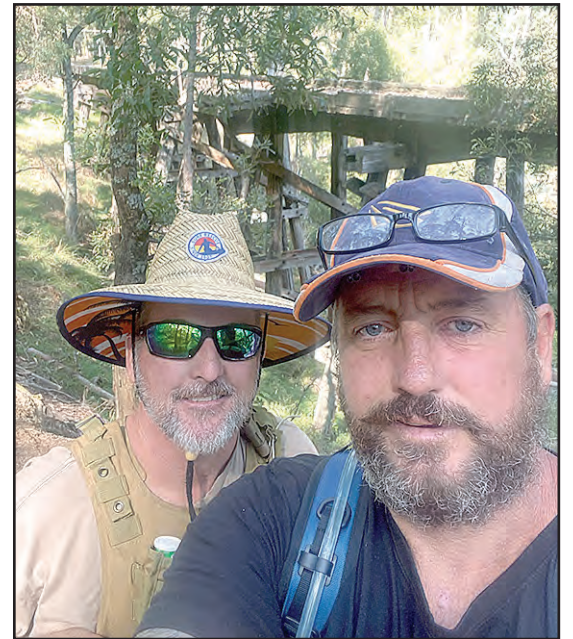
"What we go through

for four days is nothing compared to what a lot of veterans go through in a lifetime."

The charity walk was supported by the Corryong Men's Shed (raffle proceeds \$2500) and Corryong Lions Club (\$1000 donation).

Stuart is a part owner of the Legends on Hansen café in Corryong which has recently become a Bronze Pledge Partner of Soldier On to demonstrate support for veterans, in collaboration with the Soldier On Pathways Program.

Flora and fauna feature on mural

After project delays due to the pandemic, Kirrily Anderson's mural on the wall of the High Country Trading Post in Corryong is nearing completion.

The Man from Snowy River Tourism Association (MFSRTA) commissioned Kirrily to produce the mural to celebrate the flora and fauna of the local Burrowa-Pine Mountain and Mt Mittamatite Parks.

"We wanted to showcase the unique natural environment of

our natural bushland," the association's Cathy Ross said.

"The bushfires of Black Summer 2019-2020 burnt close to 100 per cent of Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park and Mt Mittamatite Regional Park. These areas are characterised by large granite rock slabs and once contained some unique species.

"We know that the bush is regenerating, however we do not know exactly what the long term affects of the fire will be on the animals and plants in these areas.

"The mural depicts some of the different habitats and species found there and is a celebration of this special part of the Upper Murray."

While it is impossible to represent everything that can be found in the bush, the mural depicts 31 different animal and plant species as well as the natural bushland, rugged beauty of the parks and some well known locations such as Bluff Falls.

Iconic species such as the Black Cyprus Pine (from which Pine Mountain gets its

name), river red gums, wildflowers and lesser known animals such as the spotted tail quoll are represented.

"Many locals will be familiar with the stunning spring wildflower displays seen throughout the bush and the incredible number of different birds which can be found at places like Neil's Reserve," Cathy said.

"The mural attempts to capture the essence of the

natural Upper Murray."

There will be signage including a QR code installed to further explain the mural when it is completed.

"We are very excited to see this idea come to fruition," added association president, Ros McKenzie.

"We would like to thank Kirrily for all of her work and for the generous support of Comm Bank for this project.

"We look forward to the official opening of the mural on Monday March 28. Come along and chat with Kirrily and have a close up view of Corryong's newest artwork."

Scott Thompson, from Parks Victoria, will also be at the opening to discuss local flora and fauna.

The community is invited to attend an informal gathering at the site from 5pm to 6:30pm.

Museum adds to heritage collection

Earlier this month, a very valuable and important presentation was made to the Upper Murray Historical Society to be displayed in the Man from Snowy River Museum.

The donation of an original copy of Sir Paul Edmund de Strzelecki's 1845 publication of a *Physical Description of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, was made by Ernestyna Skurjat Kozek and Andrzej Kozek, president and vice president respectively of Kosciuszko Heritage Inc.

They were inspired to find a copy of the rare publication in appreciation of the hospitality they experienced on a visit to the Upper Murray last

year. The book contains Strzelecki's account of his explorations and observations made during his travels through south-eastern Australia and Van Diemen's Land and was accepted by historical society vice-president, John Whitehead.

Kosciuszko Heritage is an organisation with several objectives, principally the promotion of the contributions made by local and international leaders and particularly, Strzelecki and General Tadeusz Kosciuszko, whose name is borne by the highest peak of Australia, Mt Kosciuszko.

The organisation also promotes cultural events in Jindabyne, Cooma, the Upper Murray and other locations recognising the contribution made by inspirational and influential individuals - particularly Polish migrants - to Australia's history and cultural heritage and the preservation of Polish culture and identity for younger generations.

One of Kosciuszko Heritage's projects was to commemorate 180 years since Strzelecki's passage through the Upper Murray and his ascent of Mount Kosciuszko by the unveiling of a

plaque by the roadside at Welaregang.

It was here that Strzelecki and Macarthur and party were hosted for some days in early March 1840 by John and Mary Hay, who then held the Welaregang Sheep Run.

This event was to take place in early 2020 but like many best laid plans, the pandemic caused its postponement. It finally occurred on March 6, 2021.

Some weeks later, Ernestyna, Andrzej and Chris, all of whom reside in Sydney, returned to the Upper Murray and visited the Corryong museum.

Over their few days here they were shown the approximate route Strzelecki and his companions took as they made their way from Welaregang to Towong and up the Swampy Plain River to Khancoban. On this journey the explorers were guided by Jackie a native from Welaregang.

From Khancoban the group passed over the Geehi Wall and descended to the Geehi Flats where they then ascended a long spur - now known as Hannel's Spur - leading to Mount Townsend. Reaching this peak Strzelecki recognised another peak, initially hidden from view, that

stood proud of the others which he was determined to climb. He called this peak 'Kosciuszko' after the famous Polish General and freedom fighter, Tadeusz Kosciuszko.

On the next day of their visit Ernestyna, Andrzej and Chris were shown through the museum and then taken up the Nariel Valley to the foot of the Gibbo Range, again following in the footsteps of Strzelecki and party as they made their way over the Great Divide into only partially explored country. Angus McMillan had preceded him and named the area 'Gipps' Land'.

In appreciation of these few days of hospitality in 2021, Andrzej and Ernestyna sought out and acquired an ex-British

library first edition copy of Strzelecki's sojourn in Australia for the museum.

"This was a very generous and unexpected gift which we hope one day to make the centrepiece of a display recognising Strzelecki the explorer," said historian, John Murphy.

"In March 1840 Strzelecki passed through our district and 182 years later, thanks to Kosciuszko Heritage he, in a sense, returns in the form of his writings."

After receiving the book donation, John Whitehead presented Ernestyna with a print depicting Corryong nestled beneath the Snowy Mountains, a picture taken by his son Mark.

Trail ride wish comes true

Keen equestrian, Sharon Roberts, had always dreamed of doing a solo trip in the bush by packhorse.

She set out to do this in 1989 but after meeting her husband, Ken, the pair became the first riders to complete the newly opened Bicentennial National Trail, leaving Cooktown on the May 12, 1989 and arriving in Healesville on March 3, 1991. Exactly 31 years later, Sharon, who has lived in the Upper Murray for the past 20 years, finally achieved her long held dream.

On March 3, she headed north from Jagumba Station, Maragle with

her two horses and rode a section of the National Trail (recently renamed) through to Wares Yards, north of Lake Eucumbene.

The first day took nine hours and 45 minutes to cover 29kms, climbing over 1000m - the biggest elevation gain on the entire trail.

At Wares yards, Sharon met up with a group of local riding friends who had floated their horses across and spent the weekend exploring the high plains and cattlemen's huts of the northern section of the Kosciuszko National Park.

They resupplied her for the return journey and she headed south, arriving

back at Jagumba on March 18.

"There were many differences to the earlier ride but the solitude, beauty of the natural environment, battle with fatigue and ferocity of the

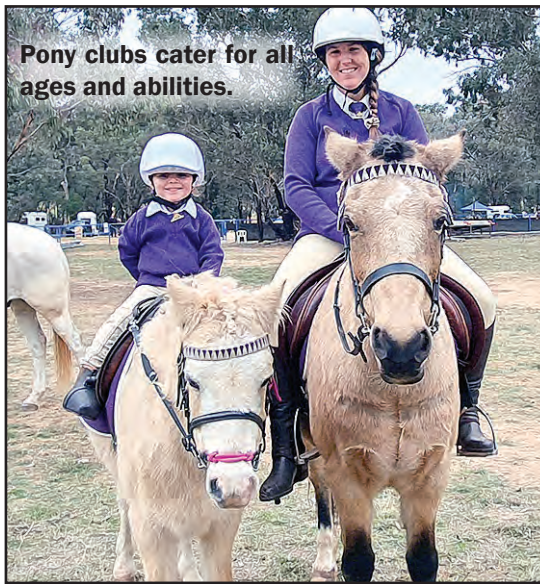
The club will also concentrate on getting the grounds back to their former glory after no activity there for the last few years.
