



March shines spotlight on mental health

A Corryong cafè owner will down his apron later this month to undertake a charity walk to raise awareness of veterans' mental health isssues.

Stuart Spratt intends to complete the 130-kilometre trek from Boathaven, near Wodonga, to Corryong via Cudgewa over four days, starting on March 18th.

The 'March campaign is an initiative of Soldier On, a support services provider for defence force personnel, contemporary veterans and their families.

Participants in the 'March On' challenge aim to walk 96 kilometres during the month - the length of the Kokoda Track - to symbolise the courage and sacrifice of veterans and their families. It will also raise funds to support Soldier On's life-changing mental health services and programs so that returned defence force members and their families can 'march on'.

Stuart decided on a longer distance for his journey to raise awareness of mental health issues, particularly veterans' suicide, throughout the wider community.

Stuart has several friends who have served in the defence forces and has seen first hand some of the problemss they have faced.

"Veterans suicide is a major issue and anything we can do to increase awareness of it is for the better," he said.

One of his mates is Laurie Phillips from Wodonga, who spent 26 years in the Australian Navy, and he has encouraged Stuart on his



mission.

"We have got a number of veterans from the Albury-Wodonga area and locally who are supporting us," he said.



Streetscape plans released

Towong mayor, Cr Whitehead, said the draft plans for Corryong CBD have been developed based on community input and feedback captured during consultation in 2021.


"The draft plans are focused around improving accessibility and amenity in the central business district, ensuring safety of the community and visitors and encouraging sustainability liveability," he said.



Trucking timber for 40 years

In the late 1980's, Adam worked at the Corryong mill for 2 years before hitting the bush tracks hauling timber into the mill in one of the company trucks which at the time was a popular choice for many on log haulage. "I started out in a 500 horsepower Mack Value Liner when I was still on red 'P' plates, I couldn't drive a V8 car but was driving a V8 Value-Liner! With a single jinker it was a pretty tough truck, and we also had Super Liners and a W model Kenworth. They then bought a CH Mack for carting woodchips out of Corryong to the port at Geelong, it was a body truck with a quad dog, and

was still going until Dave

passed away."

I did that for three years, chips down and fertiliser back which was a good gig," he said. With the passing of

Dave Blair, the mill in Corryong was shut down, and having returned to Bruthen, Adam has since built the haulage operation up with the trucks carting hardwood timber to a number of mills. The fleet is a mix of T909, C509 and T659 models along with a lone 2001 model T950, with Kennedy the preferred choice for trailers. The company also added a Drake 4 x 4 Deck Widener float to its inventory last year for transporting logging machinery and other heavy haulage duties as needed.

Adam reckons the Kenworth and Kennedy combination for trucks and trailers is a good one, with the specification well suited to their requirements, "The 909's get a flow of air through the cab and keeps the motor cool and with the T659 the turning capacity on that is really good especially with the float, it's a bit shorter in the rails and we can run a 36inch sleeper so the boys can get a good sleep, with fatigue management and so on we have to be across that. We set them up with the air conditioners and so forth so when they run out of their hours they can go to bed," he explained.

Over the years logging

trailers have considerably, from sliding pole jinkers to the multi trailer units common today, with all of Adam's trailers built locally in Bairnsdale by Kennedy's. "We have gone to stag trailers, we run a fold up skel on the truck with a stag behind it, it's not as long going into the landings to load, and they track like a single trailer... if you can get a single trailer out you can get a stag trailer set out - they are real robust, they don't dance around like a bogie so for us going forward we will be running stags - the worst case scenario if its wet up the bush or a bit dicey we just drop the pup off and run out as a single, they are a good set up," he explained.

With the B&C trucks hauling timber out of the Great Diving Range to mills at Swifts Creek, Heyfield, Eden, Geelong and Corryong, the weather, particularly in winter is one of the factors which can bring the trucks to a halt, with Adam preferring to park a truck for a day or two than risk damage to trucks or injury to drivers. "If it comes in wet there's no mucking around, we will just leave the truck at the side of the road - it's a no brainer for us, the truck will be there the next day or the day after, at least you will get the truck back down and won't be six months off work.

We can go through the winter working low volume bush up around Nowa Nowa weather permitting, as the bottom end bush dries out a lot quicker than the higher volume stuff further up in the hills. Winter is also our time for big maintenance - if we need to rebuild a motor, or go over a truck from front to back, we get everything right, so it doesn't affect us in the busy season." With the timber

industry in Victoria facing an uncertain future, B & C has log contracts in place until 2024. The company

will later this year take delivery of a Kenworth SAR Legend which Adam is looking forward to, and hopefully it will see a number of years' service. "We have a good bunch of blokes here at the minute, we have been pretty well on track since the (2019-2020) fires, and we are going pretty well. We will go where the work is, if there's wood to cart, we will go with it. Let's hope it keeps on going for a few more years," he

Track work honours legendary horseman

Parks Victoria's bushfire recovery crews are hard at work clearing Harrington's Bridle Track near Corryong in preparation for this year's Man from Snowy River Bush Festival.

In a combined effort between Parks Victoria, Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMV) and the local community, the track will be cleared ready for Riley's Ride.

Harrington's Bridle
Track runs through the
Alpine National Park for
20kms from Tom Groggin
Station to Bunroy Station.
It climbs over the shoulder
of Hermit Mountain
before following the
upper reaches of the
Murray River through the
renowned 'Murray Gates'.

The track was badly impacted by the 2019-20 fires and later storm events and significant regrowth has made it almost impassable.

The Parks Victoria crews and volunteers from the Riley's Ride organising committee and wider community have carried out days of chainsaw and brush-cutter work to reopen it.

Local horse riders will also help to clear a steeper section of the track, on Hermit Mountain, from horseback.

"Staff have come from Corryong, Tallangatta and Bright to help out on the track, camping at Surveyors Creek and Tom Groggin Station to undertake the work," said Parks Victoria District Manager North East, Chris Derrick.

"Everyone understands the importance of the festival and the ride to the community.

"It's great for us to be working alongside the local community and Forest Fire Management Victoria as by working together we will reap benefits for all park visitors well into the future."

Riley's Ride is one of the bush festival's key annual events and commemorates the life of stockman and Tom Groggin station manager, Jack Riley.

Legend has it, Australian bush poet, Banjo Patterson, penned his poem 'The Man from Snowy River' after meeting Jack and listening to his tales of chasing wild brumbies in the mountains.

In 1914, the track was used to transport a gravely ill Jack Riley to Corryong for treatment. He died at Surveyors Creek on the way.

The ride retraces the last journey of the legendary horseman over three days and culminates with a parade down Corryong's main street.

"The Man from Snowy River Bush Festival is such an important event for the community and we are more than happy to lend a hand to ensure it's a success," said FFMV District Manager Upper Murray, Dave Jenson.

Air crash brings changes


An investigation into a plane crash that claimed the lives of two employees of Albury-based flight company Oberon Aviation Services has resulted in changes to its operational procedures.

Former Corryong man, Tom Sheather and pilot Hayden Bruce were carrying out powerline inspections near Canberra on April 13 last year for Essential Energy when the crash occurred.

In its final report, the Australian Transport Safety Bureau (ATSB) found that about three hours into the flight a sharp turn to inspect a powerline had likely caused the Cessna aircraft to drop and enter a spin that could not be controlled.


"This investigation reinforces to pilots the importance of managing air speed and bank angle to minimise the risk of stalling," said ATSB transport safety director, Stuart Macleod.

Oberon Aviation has subsequently amended its training and checking protocols following the crash. It also intends to introduce a 'manouevre margin' to take into account stall speeds and aircraft will be modified to incorporate 'angle of attack' indicators.

Nancy was born on 24th August, 1929 to Albert and Claire Blundell.

Her parents had very little money during Nancy's early childhood and they managed with help from Claire's family and their own hard work and efforts.

Albert, Claire and Nancy often walked the few kilometres to 'The Old Place' (the home of Claire's parents) to enjoy a good meal. Nancy later said that when she mentioned to her father that there wasn't much money in those times, his reply was that "there was none!"

The time came when Claire inherited her portion of the Jephcott land and the property became known as 'Mandalay'. Claire kept tight control of her holding and treated Albert as the 'hired help' to an extent, so the time came when he had had enough. The couple separated when Nancy was seven years old, later divorcing (not very common in those times).

Albert cared for his daughter but there were times during Nancy's childhood when she didn't see him for years at a time.

see him for years at a time. Nancy was a survivor.

When she was eight, her parents put their differences aside and were together at her bedside when she had a life-threatening mastoid infection of the ear. She had surgery which was successful.

At the age of 10 she had a serious case of appendicitis. Claire's sister Barbara Jephcott (Aunty Bar) was visiting at the time and she and Uncle Roland drove them to Tumbarumba to the doctor. Nancy's appendix

was on the point of bursting and after sobering up the doctor successful surgery was performed!

Her Aunty Bar became a steady, reliable figure in Nancy's childhood.

Rabbit trapping was a feature of Nancy's younger years and before she was strong enough to set the traps herself, she would get her mother to do it. Nancy earned some money from selling the rabbit skins.

When she was nine, Nancy went to school at Ournie, riding her horse Topsy. Her education there lasted only for a year and a half because the teacher was called up to serve in WWII.

After a gap and tutoring from Aunty Bar, Nancy resumed her education, at Woodstock Girls School in Albury, aged 14. She hated it at Woodstock and after three months she became sick with pneu-monia and never returned. She then went to Albury High School where she spent three happy years and achieved her Intermediate Certificate.

When Nancy was 14 she visited her father in Melbourne to meet her stepmother and half-brother and she remained connected with Albert's family, which later included two half-sisters, throughout her life.

After school, Nancy worked in Albury and boarded at the YWCA Hostel in ex-army huts.

Nancy had a number of jobs in her post-school years, all of which utilised her superior sewing skills.

These were happy years for Nancy which was when she met Fred Winfield and they married in 1952 and moved to Tara in Queensland, to pursue



their desire to become farmers.

Fred and Nancy spent 18 months in the Tara region, working on two properties. The housing they were provided with was not luxurious and Nancy told stories of the geckos on the ceiling, the flies that were so persistent that you just removed them from the gravy and put them to the side of your plate and went on with your meal and the snakes that came up out of the cracks in the black soil when it rained!

The couple's daughter Lenore was born during their time in Queensland.

Nancy and Fred next worked for Nancy's mother at 'Mandalay' where they stayed for two years. They then they took up a position working on a large property, 'Glenfelloch', in the Holbrook district, where they remained for the next eight years. Their second daughter, Annette, was born at Holbrook soon after this move and Heather was born in their last year there.

In the second half of 1963, the family moved back to 'Mandalay' where they lived in the second to Nancy's uncle, Keith Jephcott. They turned these two large paddocks into a small dairy farm.

In 1968 Nancy again had a brush with a serious health issue when she underwent surgery for breast cancer, which never recurred.

In 1977 Nancy's mother, Claire, passed away and Nancy inherited 'Mandalay'. She and Fred successfully ran the property for 30 years. These were happy years during which their 10 grandchildren came into the world.

Nancy had many interests including sewing

and knitting, keeping chooks from a young age, gardening and birdlife and she always liked to have a house cow, which she milked by hand. Other interests included steam trains and aeroplanes. She also had definite opinions on world affairs and poli-

Fred died suddenly in 2006 and in 2008 Nancy reluctantly sold the farm and moved to the Corryong Retirement Village, where after a taking six months to settle in, she lived happily for 13 years.

Her love of gardening was evident by the flower beds established around her unit and she received many compliments from passers-by. She was also a keen member of the Corryong Garden Club.

Nancy also enjoyed walking regularly up the street to do her shopping and having a chat with friends on her way home.

Last July, Nancy became seriously ill and was taken to hospital. Although she rallied, she was unable to return to her beloved unit and had to spend nearly six months in the 'chicken coop', as she called the nursing home.

Nancy passed away in Corryong on January 18th,

Firewood collection season has started

The Autumn Firewood offences, with an option Collection Season for 2022 commenced on Tuesday and will close on Tuesday 30 June.

"Firewood can only be taken from designated collection areas in state forests or parks during approved times for personal use only," said Aaron Kennedy, Director Forest and Fire Operations, Hume region.

"People should note that collected firewood cannot be sold.

"Collection limits are in place to prevent stockpiling of volumes of firewood, which is important to ensure there's enough firewood on public land for people who rely on it to stay warm over winter.

"Be sure to check local weather and forest conditions before heading out to make sure it's safe before collecting firewood in your area," Mr Kennedy warned.

Collection limits include taking a maximum of two cubic metres per person per day and a maximum of 16 cubic metres per household per financial year. The felling of trees and cutting downed hollow logs for firewood is also prohibited.

The Conservation Regulator, FFMVic and Parks Victoria conduct routine, random and targeted patrols of forest areas, and authorised officers issue on-thespot fines for firewood to take people to court for major offences.

In further news, visitors from the Hume region and other parts of Victoria will no longer be able to access domestic firewood from state forests in Central Victoria. Only residents of specific shires will be able to collect domestic firewood from designated firewood collection areas.

An interactive map showing designated collection areas is available at www.ffm.vic.gov.au/ firewood. Any information the community may have about the illegal removal of firewood for sale can be reported to DELWP on 136 186.
