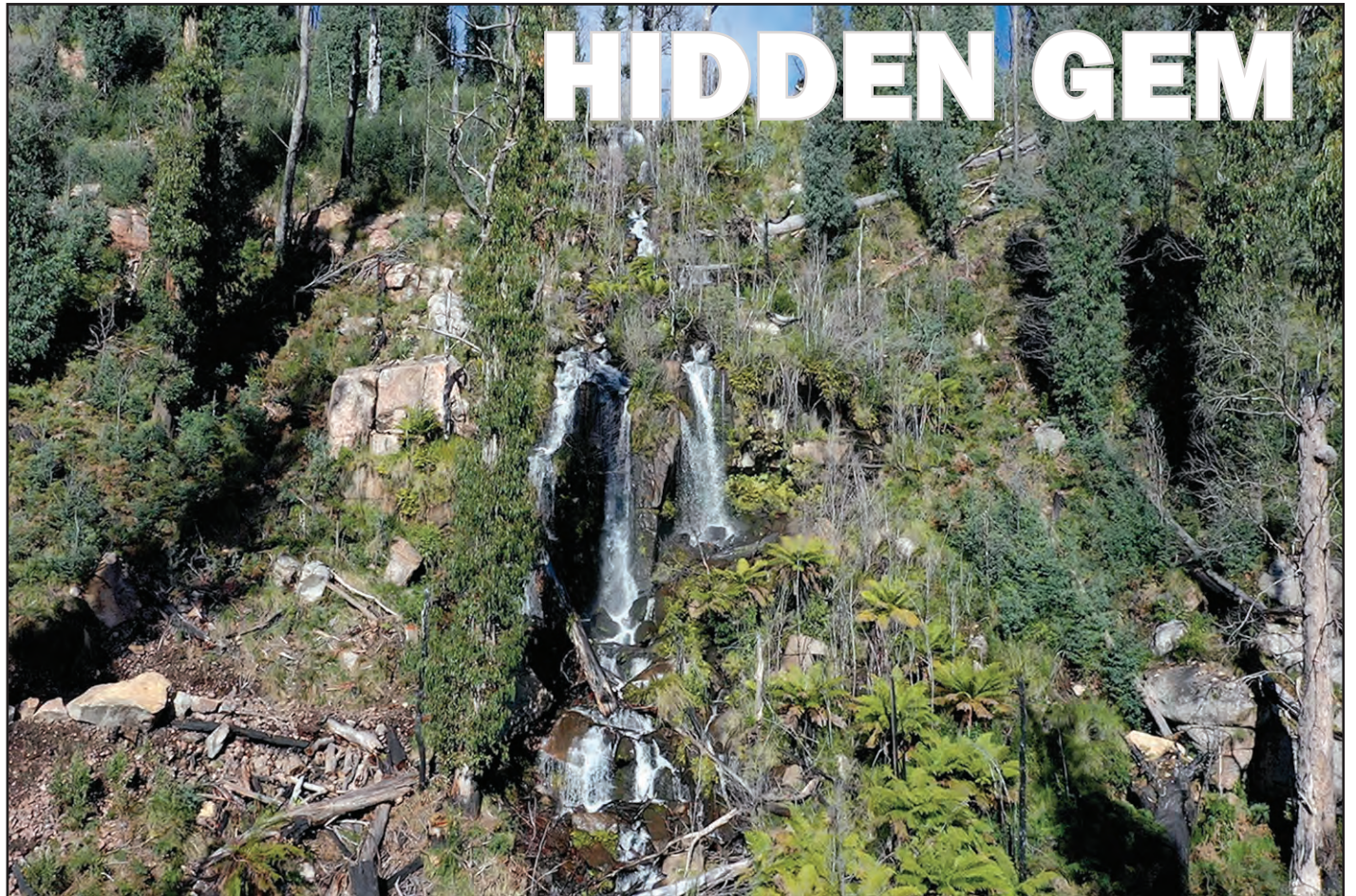

HIDDEN GEM

Region rises from the ashes

A hidden waterfall nestled in the heart of the Upper Murray that emerged from the ashes following the 2019/20 Black Summer Bushfires is just one of several recovery projects now coming to fruition.

The region was devastated by the bushfires and the pandemic lockdowns caused significant delays to the recovery process but replacement housing as well as a host of new projects are well underway or have been completed.

brought to light after the fires is Thowgla Falls, which is located on Marginal Road in the Thowgla Valley.

The falls are now more accessible to visitors following the construction of a new walking trail and viewing platform.

The works, which were completed by Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) crews and local contractors, also includes a day visitor area and toilets.

"The bushfires had a significant impact on the community and the environment," said FFMVic, Upper Murray District Manager, Dave Jensen.

"Creating opportunities for visitors to come back to the Upper Murray is an important part of the community's recovery. Thowgla Falls is spectacular and we're thrilled that we're able to provide more opportunities for people to reconnect with nature.

"The fires helped expose this natural site which was previously inaccessible due to dense forest surrounding the waterfall.

"The new walking track leads visitors through stunning native bushland to a viewing platform offering unparalleled views of the cascading

waterfall. "In addition to Thowgla Falls, several other sites including Walkers Lookout and historic huts such as Wheelers Creek Hut, Gibsons-Pinnibar Hut and Ski Hut have also been rebuilt following the fires," Mr Jensen added.

"It's hoped all the bushfire recovery projects will boost tourism and support the regional economy with visitors now able to experience the natural beauty of the area once again."

The project was funded through the Victorian government's \$110 million Bushfire Recovery Program to assist with building efforts and Victoria's Great Outdoors, a \$106.6 million investment in better walking trails, campgrounds, four-wheel drive tracks and visitor facilities.

Two other local projects have started in recent weeks - installation of synthetic grass greens at the Corryong Golf Club and an upgrade of the outdoor deck at the Corryong Sporting Complex.

Health reins handed over

The Corryong Health Board has appointed an interim CEO to take on the role when Dominic Sandilands departs the position later this month.

Board chair, Nicole Barwick, said "The board is delighted to announce the appointment of Nicole Martin as the Acting Chief Executive Officer of Corryong Health."

"The board was unanimous in its support for Nicole to provide executive leadership of Corryong Health while we recruit a new CEO."

"She brings more than 13 years' experience with Corryong Health in clinical and senior leadership positions including most

recently her substantive positions as Director of Quality Safety and Risk and Company Secretary."

Ms Barwick said that "While the departure of Dominic Sandilands as CEO from Corryong Health leaves a big hole, the appointment of Nicole as Acting CEO will maintain the required business continuity."

"The process of recruiting a new CEO to lead Corryong Health is advancing rapidly, with a recruitment agency already selected and a broad net about to be cast to find the person who will guide it into the future".

Mr Sandilands announced his resignation

in April to take a new position as Chief of Corporate Affairs at Albury Wodonga Health. Ms Martin will commence on May 24th.

Council works on child care options

Towong Council is collaborating with Corryong College to provide after school child care following failed efforts to take over the Peekaboo Centre in Corryong.

"We understand there is some community concern regarding the future of Early Years Learning services in

the Upper Murray," said Towong mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead.

"Over the past year we have been working with Peekaboo in good faith regarding a negotiation to take over the centre to ensure continuity of care to the communities of the Upper Murray."

"We commenced negotiations with the Victorian Department of Education and Training to fund the service and resources required to deliver the services."

"We also undertook a valuation and developed

a draft lease for Peekaboo to review but they did not accept this valuation or lease."

"We asked Peekaboo to provide a counter-offer and despite multiple follow ups they have not provided one."

"We are disappointed that we could not formulate an agreement with Peekaboo and unfortunately, we are not in a position to set up a competitive child care in Corryong without government funding."

"Government funding is only provided if the

child care operator is the only service available," Cr Whitehead explained.

"We have decided to move forward with setting up out of hours school care with Corryong College and look forward to offering this to the community shortly."

"To help us gauge community interest in this service will be releasing a survey in coming weeks and hosting a community meeting."

The meeting will be on Thursday May 25th at the Upper Murray Recovery Hub at 3.30pm.

The synthetic greens will provide a point of difference from other courses in the region and value-add to the local economy through increased visitation.

The works are

expected to be completed the end of the month and a community launch will be held later in the year.

Funding was provided under the Victorian government's Local Economic Recovery grants program.

Funding for the new deck was provided by Border Trust which is administering the Towong Shire Bushfire Recovery program.

Other projects underway in the Upper Murray include the redevelopment of the former Corryong primary school site and construction of a skate park, development of Playles Hill attractions and facilities, sealing of the Stock Route Road in Corryong, redevelopment of the Corryong Saleyards and the installation of further sculptures on the Great River Road.

Further projects on the Towong Shire schedule include development of the Corryong, Cudgewa and Tintaldra streetscapes; improvements to the Walwa Recreation Reserve; and the construction of the Corryong Circuit Trail which will create a shared, walking and cycling trail in the town.

Council is also seeking feedback on the development of the Mt Elliot Masterplan.

Pioneers remembered on walk

On Sunday the Upper Murray Historical Society conducted a Corryong Pioneer Cemetery Walk, the first since 2018. The society was well-pleased with the community support with attendance estimated in the high 40s.

Six early pioneers were remembered on the walk.

The first grave visited was that of Elizabeth Playle, one of the founding members of Corryong. The Playle family arrived here in 1883 and did much for the social and commercial development of the township. Her life was recounted by one of her direct descendants - John Whitehead. Although the Playle surname has disappeared from this district the high point above Corryong, 'Playles Hill', is a reminder of their former presence. Of course many descendants remain.

The second grave was that of Alf Acocks after whom Acocks Street is named. Marg Jarvis brought notice to Alf's early life prior to immigrating to Australia and the huge contribution - much of it voluntary - that he made to Corryong's early development. Among the many causes Alf was involved in was bringing reticulated water to the town. Before then the water supply was always in a very precarious state, being mainly supplied by well and water tank.

Local teacher, Steve Learmonth, has done much work in researching and highlighting the military history of former residents. He spoke of WWI soldier Albert John Knight. This was a somewhat unique talk in that A J Knight, who was killed in action, is not actually buried in

the cemetery but many thousands of kilometres away in France. However, he is prominently remembered on the headstone of his mother's grave.

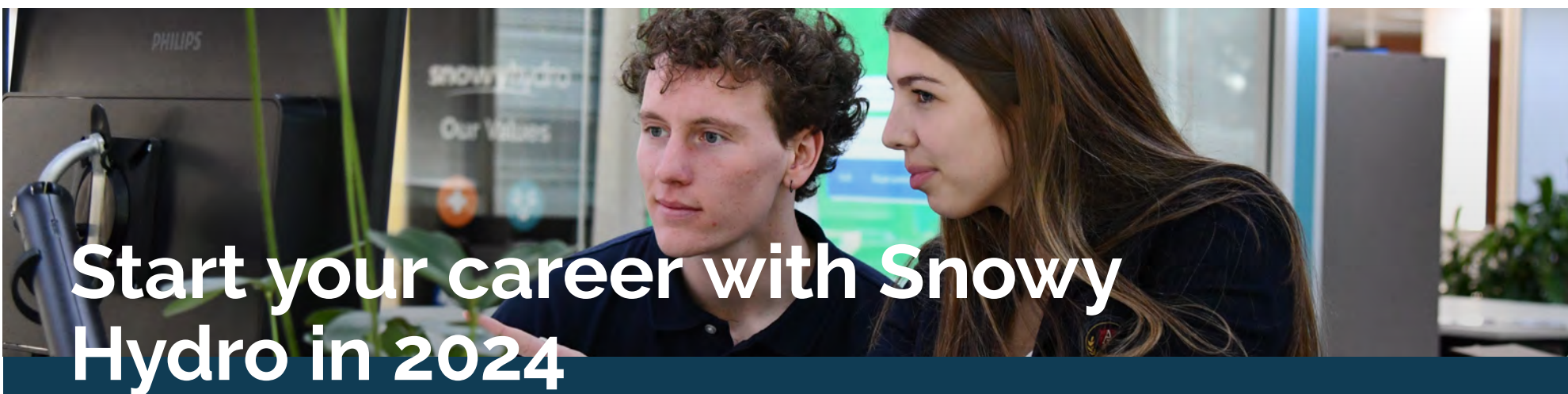
Another local teacher, Vicki Kane, gave a very well researched talk on the Garing family. The Garings were a well-known mining family who arrived from Granya in early 1894 and who, along with Walton and Brown, discovered the rich 'Bread & Sugar' mine on Mount Elliot. Of the three original partners, the Garings were the only ones to remain. During her talk Vicki drew attention to a much under-recognised aspect of pioneering life - the plight of women and the sorrow caused by the high infant mortality of those times.

Marilyn Clydsdale spoke of her husband Neil's ancestor, John Clydsdale who emigrated as four-year-old with his family from Scotland during the 'Clearances' which caused the Scottish diaspora to all the corners of the globe. The Clydsdales arrived in Sydney as part of an extended family group consisting of the McLaurins, McMeekins and Patons on the ship 'Brilliant' in January 1838.

Rather than turning to the land as his cousins did, John chose mining

at Zulu Creek, Sassafras and the Saltpetre diggings and ended up the poorer for it. This resulted in him being buried in the Corryong Cemetery in a pauper's grave. His final resting place was lost but eventually rediscovered and through the work of Marilyn and Neil a fitting marker has been placed over his grave.

John Murphy recounted some of the life of Cheong Keong also buried in a pauper's grave. Cheong arrived in Australia along with many other thousands of Chinese during the Great Australian Gold Rush, eventually finding his way to the Upper Murray. For 20 years he worked for James Findlay on Towong Hill Station then returned to his former profession but this time mining tin at Koetong. After a short stint as a selector at Granya he returned to the Upper Murray in late 1894 and set up a market garden on the Back Thowgla Road, adjacent to the bridge. He supplied both Corryong and the Mount Elliot diggings with fresh fruit and vegetables for more than a decade. Sadly, in October 1905, Cheong was drowned at Bringenbrong Ford while attempting to visit a friend working for the Mitchells at Bringenbrong Station.

Some spotlighting is permitted, when part of an authorised deer control program.



Strategic water rights purchasing to bridge the gap to deliver Murray-Darling Basin Plan outcomes

The Australian Government, represented by the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water, is seeking to purchase permanent water rights of up to 44.3 gigalitres per year (GL/y) across six catchments in New South Wales and southern Queensland to help deliver the Sustainable Diversion Limits (SDLs) in the Murray-Darling Basin Plan.

Eligible catchments and recovery targets:

Queensland	
Condamine-Balonne:	14 GL of surface water and 3.2 GL of groundwater
New South Wales	
Barwon-Darling:	1.6 GL of surface water



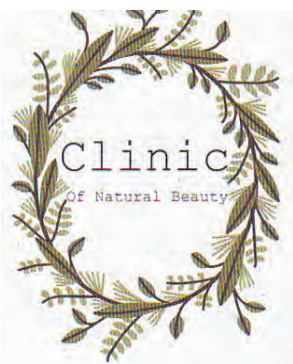

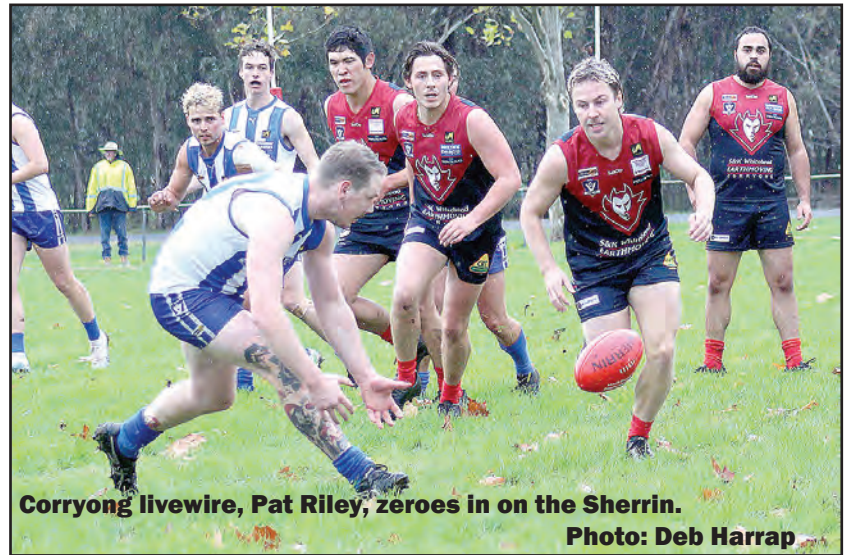
