Tilley blasts lack of future recovery funding

Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley, says the Victorian government should continue to fund bushfire support staff in the Upper Murray.

Speaking in parliament yesterday, Mr Tilley said that funding for staff employed by Towong Shire under the Council Support Fund will be terminated at the end

of June. At its peak it is believed 11 staff were employed for the recovery.

Mr Tilley understands a budget submission to employ four staff for another 12 months was put to the government.

"However, there was no money included in last week's state budget for this," Mr Tilley said.

Fire affected communities get facilities boost

Almost \$300,000 in funding will flow into the Towong Shire from the latest round of the Victorian government's Bushfire Recovery Grants for Community Facilities.

Minister for Emergency Services, Jaclyn Symes, has announced the 25 successful grant recipients in round nine of the grants programs including the Corryong Opportunity Shop Inc. which will use its \$50,000 grant for building renovations.

"We've always said that locals are best placed to tell government what they need to recover and rebuild and these grants help communities achieve those much needed projects," Ms Symes said.

"These projects will make community facilities safer, better and more welcoming to everyone and I encourage more groups to apply to the program."

Local groups get funding for facilities

Other local recipients of recovery grants are:-

- \$50,000 to purchase a tractor and mower for the Walwa Golf Club
- \$50,000 to upgrade to an accessible restroom at the Tintalra Recreation Reserve
- \$49,975 to install an energy system including solar panels and battery storage at the Corryong Historic Machinery Club
- \$49,709 for an accessible toilet and

shower upgrade

- \$48,637 for building renovations at the Cudgewa Hall

Other works in Towong Shire include \$49,307 for repair works to the Tallangatta Sports Centre.

Schools collaborate on mental health project

Students from Montmorency Secondary College from the eastern suburbs of Melbourne who have travelled to Corryong as part of a VCAL exchange program to gain an understanding of rural experiences, have also engaged with their Corryong counterparts in the Blue Tree project.

The schools have collaborated with Corryong Health’s Community Inclusion Project Team, on the project involving the construction and painting of blue trees to be displayed in the community.

The purpose of the Blue Tree project is to raise awareness and begin conversations around mental health.

By ‘spreading the paint’ and spreading the message that “It’s OK to not be OK”, people can help break down the stigma that’s still largely attached to mental health.

“In the aftermath of trauma and tragedy we are made to feel powerless and left devoid of answers,” said Corryong VCAL teacher, Sarah Harris.

“Engaging in the Blue Tree project provides an avenue for us to raise awareness and do something productive.”

“However, there was no money included in last week’s state budget for this,” Mr Tilley said.

“Here in 2022 the funding for that recovery work, in particular council support work in the upper Murray by the Towong Shire, expires at the end of next month.

“As you can appreciate, pandemic lockdowns and limitations around that

significantly restricted the work that was being done and that remains far from finished.

“This community is getting on with life but the scars remain.”

Mr Tilley also questioned the funding approvals recently announced by Bushfire Recovery Victoria and asked that the Victorian government not forget the Upper Murray.

“While the Upper Murray worries about its future, a kennel and dog obedience school in Wangaratta gets \$50,000 for an accessible restroom,” he said.

“It was funny, the federal independent who is all about integrity saw fit to go and get a photo at the kennel. Really, was this the best, most appropriate use of bushfire recovery money?”

Art book honours our service heroes

A recent addition to the Elyne Mitchell library in Corryong is sure to be one of the most requested reads by those with an interest in local war history.

Last week Lt Colonel (Ret.) Mark Auchinleck, Honor Auchinleck and Peter Purss, representing the Corryong RSL, presented a book by renowned Melbourne graphic artist George Petrou - *The Art Of Sacrifice* - to the Corryong library.

Many of the service personnel featured in the book hail from, are connected with or related to families from the Upper Murray.

The *Art Of Sacrifice* is the haunting and poignant product born of a transformative period in George Petrou's life.

The book tells of George's personal story - of his commitment to honouring the service of many of Australia's service personnel, of how this commitment helped him personally through the challenges of chemotherapy and how his work has touched thousands across Australia.

More than 70 portraits, 63 stories, 425 pages and numerous serendipitous moments, George explores

the idea of valour, of courage, bravery and of sacrifice. Using images of the past and stories of today, he connects the past with our present within a unique and powerful environment.

George has a prior connection with the Upper Murray, having donated his portrait of Banjo Paterson to the Man from Snowy River Bush Festival in 2020 to raise money for bush fire recovery.

"This was generosity that warmed our hearts in a year from hell," Honor Auchinleck said.

"This year the festival is privileged to be conducting a silent auction of this masterpiece of the young bard during the event in early April 2023.

George's talent was well established when he painted two series of portraits - the first commemorating Australia's Victoria Cross winners and the second commemorating prominent Australians and exhibiting both series in regional cities such as Albury and Dubbo.

Remarkable for his generosity, in 2019 George gave his extraordinary likeness of the well-

known Second World war humanitarian surgeon and prisoner of war 'Weary' Dunlop to his home town Wangaratta to be auctioned to raise funds for the Totally and Permanently Incapacitated Ex-Servicemen and Women's Association of Victoria.

In June 2020, George was awarded an OAM for 'Services to the Visual Arts and to Veterans' and in the same year he released his book *The Art of Sacrifice*.

George brings his own remarkable story to his art. George and his wife Zola's origins are Greek-Cypriot. Undoubtedly their deep rooted experience and family stories of fires and the political and social problems that have plagued the island, have given George and his family the ability to see suffering and need in their adopted county.

George's portraits are represented in museums in France, Government

House, Canberra, military institutions around Australia and many private art collections.

With a reserve set at a snip of \$5,000 for the Banjo Paterson portrait - as befitting the spirit of the festival - bidding is likely to be fast and furious so join in the fun!

The proceeds are going to a good cause to help the festival recover when like so many people and events it has done it tough over the last two years.

Street name change proposed

At the April meeting of the Snowy Valleys Council (SVC), it was decided to consult further with the Khancoban community over a proposal to re-name a street in the township.

Council staff proposed renaming the western end of Mitchell Avenue, from Scott Street to the intersection of Douglas Street and Chisholm Street, as Wallaby Avenue.

There have been several instances of historical addressing irregularities of properties along Mitchell Avenue, some of which have impacted the ability of emergency responders,

utilities and delivery services to provide timely service to residents.

Confusion also arose over property addresses during the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires.

The proposed name for the road is included in the list of pre-approved names that form part of council's Road Naming Policy.

Council also decided to defer a decision on selling vacant land lots in Khancoban to a future meeting.

The meeting began with a notice of motion to waive fees already charged to community, sporting

groups and schools for utilising council's open spaces.

While the motion was not supported, councillors did agree to consider changes in income and expenditure as part of the June adoption of the 2022/23 Fees and Charges and other documents in the Integrated Planning and Reporting (IP&R) suite.

A second notice of motion was then put forward that council request the establishment of a Royal Commission into the handling of all aspects of Covid-19, which was supported.

SVC mayor, Cr Ian Chaffe, summed up the meeting by saying "It was an interesting day, we had some interesting issues to debate and one thing I think about it was that the outcome, whilst it might not have been to the benefit of everybody or their greatest wish, I think we've come to a reasonably acceptable outcome for the day's activities."

The next Ordinary Meeting of council will be held on Thursday 19 May 2022, starting at 2pm (agenda and business papers available later.)

Polish exploration plaques unveiled

An important commemoration recently took place in the Kosciuszko National Park on the flats at Geehi.

A ceremony was held to mark two important events in this country's history - firstly, to celebrate 50 years since the official establishment of diplomatic relations between Australia and Poland and secondly, to

recognise Paul (Pawel) Edmund de Strzelecki's ascent of Australia's highest peak in March 1840 and how this peak obtained the name 'Kosciuszko' from Polish and American freedom fighter and national hero, Tadeusz Kosciuszko.

Among prominent people present were Polish Ambassador

Michał Kołodziejcki; Mayor of Snowy Valleys, Cr Ian Chaffey; NSW National Parks & Wildlife (NPWS) representatives Kyle Williams, Chris Darlington and Matt White; and Ngarigo elder, Aunty Iris White.

In opening proceedings, Ambassador Kołodziejcki spoke of Strzelecki's contribution

to the early exploration of Australia and also stressed the importance of the strong and enduring ties formed between our two countries, particularly in these troubled times.

The commemoration was made possible due to the co-operative and consistent efforts of the Polish Embassy, the dedicated staff of the

Kosciuszko branch of the NSW NPWS and members of Kosciuszko Heritage Inc.

During the proceedings a number of official speeches were made, poetry recited, gifts exchanged, ribbons cut to unveil two separate plaques commemorating both events and 50 trees planted to represent the

close ties between our two countries over the past 50 years.

The morning ended with an informal and very tasty lunch kindly provided by Kosciuszko Heritage Inc. and catered for by the Pickled Parrot Providore, Khancoban.

The day proved to be an interesting and enjoyable mix of three cultures -

the First People of the Monaro, the Australian Polish Community and Australians in general.

The trees planted during the morning were carefully chosen by the NPWS - a mixture of Black Sally, Mountain White Gum, Ribbon Gum and Mountain Swamp Gum - all native to the area.

Proposed Budget 2022/23

Seeking Community Feedback

About the Budget

Towong Shire Council has released its Proposed Budget for 2022/23 for public feedback and is calling on community members to share their views.

The Budget is based on the resources to support the Council Plan 2021-2025, which reflects the aspirations of our communities as expressed through comprehensive community engagement undertaken in 2021.

Highlights include a capital works program estimated at over \$12 million for the year ahead.

Key projects include:

- Continuation of Great River Road upgrades to secure its status as a premier touring route
- The Corryong CBD upgrade
- The Dartmouth Splash Park and Pump Track
- Continued development of our walking trails across Eskdale, Bellbridge, Walwa and Corryong

The Budget proposes a rate increase of 1.75% for 2022/23, in line with the Fair Go Rates System, which caps Victorian council rate increases in line with inflation.

This level of rate rise ensures that Council can strive to meet the rising costs of providing facilities and services to our communities.

The Budget also proposes a 10% increase to our kerbside waste collection charges due to the increased costs we are subject to, such as fuel and waste disposal costs, in providing this service. The waste facilities management charge will remain at the same level as in 2021/22.

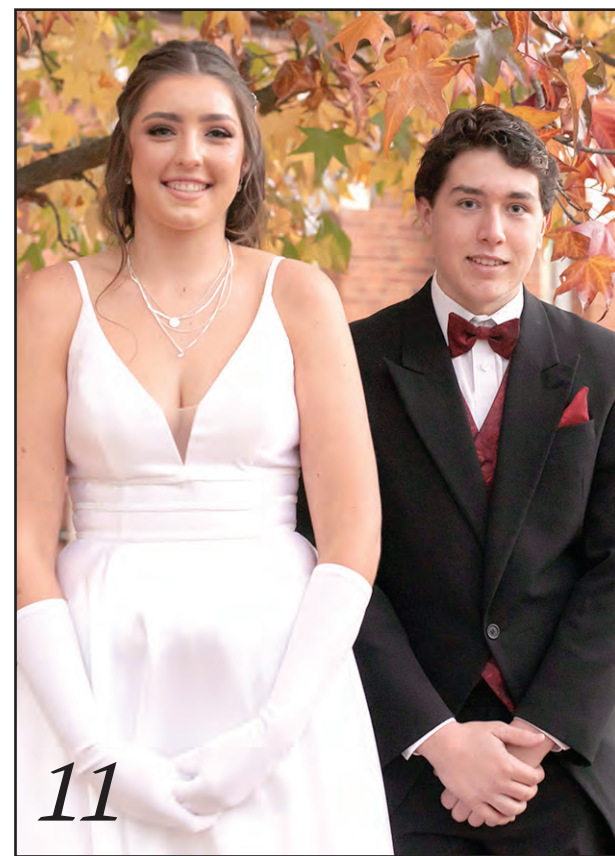

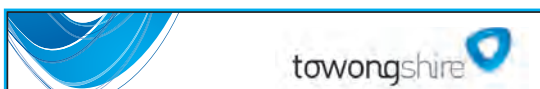

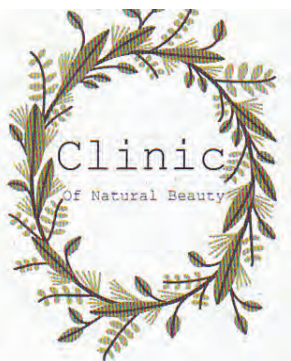
