During this National Volunteer Week both the CFA and SES have publicly thanked their members for their dedication and selflessness.

In the Upper Murray, the local CFA and SES units go "above and beyond" for their communities and have a long history of service however, similar to other volunteer organisations,

their numbers have been dwindling.

The CFA is asking regional Victorians to 'Give Us a Hand' in an effort to recruit new volunteers to join its 52,000 community-minded members in protecting lives and property across the state.

The call out is part of a new volunteer recruitment campaign, which aims

to encourage selfless Victorians to take up a firefighting or support role with their local CFA brigade.

Whether you're looking to make the most of your spare time, are new to your community or just want to be part of a group made up of like-minded people, CFA brigades have flexible volunteering arrangements and diverse roles to suit anyone's skills and needs.

Chief Officer, Jason Heffernan, said the CFA is a great place to volunteer, meet new people and learn new skills.

"Volunteers are the backbone of the firefighting and emergency response network across Victoria," he said.

"We are calling on all community-minded individuals who are looking for a new challenge to consider joining their local brigade and apply their expertise and knowledge to CFA.

"Whether you want to jump on the truck and respond to incidents or take up a brigade support position, we'll find a role that suits you and your brigade."

Brigades are most commonly looking for people from all backgrounds who have the capacity to take up roles as daytime responders and

are particularly interested in hearing from young people who want to make a difference within their community.

Once you've submitted your expression of interest form online, your local brigade will contact you regarding the next steps.

Yesterday was Wear Orange Wednesday (WOW), a national day of thanks dedicated to SES volunteers across the country.

Held annually during National Volunteer Week, WOW Day encourages the public to thank and acknowledge SES volunteers, for the invaluable contribution and commitment they make to local communities.

Over the last 12 months, VICESSES volunteers have responded to over 35,000 requests for assistance - generously donating their time in support of their communities.

Volunteers also responded to more than 1600 'Assist Police' jobs every year. This includes assistance at searches for missing people, searches for evidence at crime scenes as well as scene preservation and assistance with lighting

towers and marquees.

In addition, volunteers respond to on average just over 1,300 road crash rescues each year and are highly trained to meet national standards and participate in regular capability assessments to ensure they continue to meet these standards.

"Many of you go over and beyond and it is truly inspiring."

New surface offers safe play

The Attree Park Playground in Corryong is sporting a new recycled rubber softfall surface in key access areas thanks to a grant received by a local community group.

The 'Towong Community Bushfire Disaster Relief Fund Program' awarded the grant to upgrade part of the playground to offer an accessible all-weather safer play surface in town.

"It's wonderful that we will now have a playground in town that can be accessed by crawlers and toddlers and those with mobility issues who found woodchips challenging, particularly after rain," said project organiser, Sarah Lebner.

"It also removes the issue of scuffing and maintenance of safe fall surfaces.

"Playgrounds are critical community assets for social activity, mental health, physical exercise, etc. and all of these things help our community better recover in these years after the bushfires.

"The parents of my 11-month-old niece Sadie lost their home in the Corryong bushfires and it feels very rewarding to be part of this project to help her and her family get outdoors for more social and play activity during

these early years."

The project team has acknowledged the local community members and businesses who have put in a huge effort fundraising for upgrades to Attree Park Playground in the past.

"Their hard work was noted in the grant application and I'm certain those efforts played a part in proving the importance and worthiness of these upgrades to our treasured playground," Sarah added.

"Thanks to the Corryong Community Neighbourhood Centre

(CNC) for auspicing the grant, Towong Shire for making the process so easy and co-ordinating site fencing and The Playground People for a great install process. Thanks also to Yolande Szery for helping with the research and application."

Sarah also acknowledged the assistance of Border Trust Community Foundation for Albury Wodonga Region Limited as Trustee for the Towong Community Bushfire Disaster Relief Fund.

Road delays don't pass the pub test

Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley, has called on the Victorian Roads Minister to say when the Murray Valley Highway near Bullioch will be returned to two-way traffic.

Two failed culverts have led to the major route to the Upper Murray reduced to one lane under traffic lights for more than three months.

Mr Tilley said the failure to communicate what was happening was leading to misinformation and frustration.

"I get that sometime this is tricky, that there are other considerations but tell us what's happening and when it will happen," he said.

"We have social media

commentators saying it will take 18 months in the absence of any meaningful feedback from Regional Roads Victoria.

"That doesn't pass the pub test and we need some openness and transparency.

"People contacting my office say the detours

around the culverts is a potential death trap.

"Culvert failures have become systemic across the region."

Speaking in the Victorian Parliament last night Mr Tilley said fixes need to meet modern standards. The Minister has four weeks to respond.

Wetlands woodland is taking shape

Friends of the Corryong Wetlands recently conducted a tree-planting day as part of its native flora re-vegetation project.

“As stated previously, it is our endeavour not only to establish a viable wetlands for Corryong to be proud of but also an open woodland on the

higher ground adjacent to the creek,” said project co-ordinator, John Murphy.

“Word was put out but as the day approached very few people had confirmed they would be participating. Therefore, we were greatly surprised and encouraged when 19 turned up!

“We would like to say a

big thank you to everybody who participated.

“The weather was kind and a lot of good work done. The main trees planted and guarded were Red Gums and Victorian Blue Gums (Eucalyptus bicostata), native to our area. Apple box and Blakely red gums were

planted at our first tree planting day in September 2021 - the midst of the pandemic - and they are now mostly thriving.

“Here we would like to take the opportunity thank to David Hass for his valuable advice and generous supply of native species.

“Another of the aims of the Corryong Wetlands Wander is to use the facility as an educational and environmental awareness tool during the project’s development and once it reaches maturity,” John added.

“Recently, the site was visited by a group of senior Corryong College students under the supervision of Outdoor Education teachers Sarah Harris and Bronwyn Lang - all of whom were ‘shovel

ready’.

“Over the afternoon a lot of good work was done, mainly in planting and guarding open woodland trees on the higher ground away from the stream.

“As part of encouraging involvement in this project long-term the students were asked to tag their trees with their names, tree species and date planted in the hope that they will revisit the Corryong wetlands from time to time over the years to check on

their tree’s progress and that of the Wetlands in general.

“We would like to thank both teachers and students for their involvement. It was a great afternoon.

“Plans are in progress for a similar visit by members of Corryong Colleges Junior campus sometime in the near future.”

The wetlands area is situated at the corner of Strzelecki Way and Briggs Gap Road (Parish Lane).

Small towns get makeovers

The Cudgewa Streetscape project, a priority of the Towong Shire Council in its 2021-2025 Plan, aims to revitalise the heart of the township while ensuring its heritage value and history remains in place and central to this is the redevelopment of the Avenue of Honour (pictured).

Preparatory works will commence in mid-July with the removal of 12 hazardous elm trees.

These trees were identified for removal following an independent assessment of their viability after the Black Summer fires. Prior to the selection and planting of replacement trees a planning permit will need to be obtained.

Community members will be invited to share their ideas of species



selection and planting configuration as part of the Cudgewa Streetscape consultation process.

Directly impacted residents will be contacted in advance of works commencing to ensure access to their property remains. Council is asking that community members who don’t need to access the area avoid it during this time.

In related news, delivering a plan for the

Tintalra Streetscape upgrade is also a priority in the 2021-2025 Plan and council has been working with the community to develop designs.

A community meeting has been held and preliminary designs will soon be available for feedback.

New artwork planned for river route

As part of Stage 2 of the Great River Road project, the Towong Council is installing four new large-scale artwork pieces along the touring route.

With assistance from Murray Arts, a community-based panel evaluated more than 35 submissions for the four locations.

Following the panel's recommendation, council commissioned three artists to deliver the sculptures:-

- John Wood - 'Your Journey' sculpture at the Bellbridge Gateway
- Xavier Pinard - Bridge to Moon sculpture at Talgaro
- Glennys Briggs, in collaboration with Xavier Pinard - Lace Monitor sculpture at Pine Mountain
- John Wood - Brolgas sculpture at Towong

In 2016, council developed the Upper Murray 2030 Vision Plan following a comprehensive community consultation process.

The plan identified and explored the implementation of 'game changing' projects for the

Upper Murray including The Great River Road and Town Trails.

The 153km Great River Road stretches from Bellbridge to Khancoban, following the curves and bends of the Murray River. The road offers a superior touring experience of the Murray River with views unique to the Upper Murray mountains and valleys and the spectacular Snowy Mountains as the backdrop.

The Great River Road Project aims to make the route a premier destination for drivers, motorcyclists, cyclists, bushwalkers and campers.

Stage 1 of The Great River Road was completed in 2019 which included the delivery of five stunning and interactive sculptures - the Bogong Moth and Murray Cod at Tintalra, the Murray Cray at Bringenbrong, the Wedge-tailed Eagle at Mount Alfred Gap and the Rainbow Trout at Khancoban.

Stage 2 involves the delivery of eight key projects with most

identified by council's Community Recovery Committees to assist in the ongoing recovery process including additional

wayside stops, walking trails and a marketing campaign.

The project is funded by a \$5 million grant

from the Victorian government's Bushfire Recovery Regional Economic Stimulus and Resilience Fund.

Council offers event sponsorship

Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) is introducing a new look annual Event Sponsorship Program that aims to empower local event creators and allow them to gain council support in a more accessible and equitable practice that includes a transparent decision-making process.

The first program round opened on Monday with event organisers of both well-established and new events able to apply for financial sponsorship for local programs and events set to be held between 1 September, 2023 and 30 June, 2024.

To be eligible events must be delivered during the specified period, inside the SVC Local Government Area and seek to primarily benefit residents, service organisations and/or local groups.

The application process involves filling out an

application form including relevant supporting quotes and documentation.

The SVC Event and Sponsorship team will review eligible applications and a report with recommendations will be submitted to the council for final evaluation, and approval.

Applicants will be notified of the results by the end of August 2023.

"Council has a long history of supporting local events and has previously provided financial support to help cover costs of items including delivery and collection of garbage bins, road closures, traffic management and ground hire fees," said CEO, Ken Gouldthorp.

"This updated annual sponsorship program ensures council now has a fair, transparent, and equitable application process for everyone."

Power check nets bonus



The Victorian government has helped ease the cost of living for more than one million Victorian households with \$250 going directly into their pockets through the fourth round of the Power Saving Bonus.

The latest round of the program has seen 40 per cent of applicants find a better energy deal – with thousands of Victorians choosing to switch and save by changing their energy deal through the Victorian Energy Compare website.

In the Upper Murray, only around 200 households have applied for the bonus.

The Victorian Energy Compare website is an independent comparison tool, making it easy to find a cheaper offer.

Applications for the payment can be made through the Victorian Energy Compare website, where customers can quickly and easily find the best energy offers in their

areas. For those without internet access, over-the-phone and in-person support is available through the Corryong Neighbourhood Centre (CNC).

Victorians can also save on their household energy bills through the \$1.3 billion Solar Homes Program. Households that accessed both solar panel and hot water rebates saved up to \$1,500 on their annual energy bill.

“Victoria has cut its emissions by more than any other state, tripled the amount of renewable energy and created thousands of jobs but there is more to do, with an ambitious renewable energy target of 95 per cent by 2035,” Victorian premier, Daniel Andrews, said.

Changes to the Sustainable Forests (Timber) Act 2004

NEW LAWS RELATING TO ILLEGAL PROTEST ACTIVITIES IN TIMBER HARVESTING SAFETY ZONES ARE COMING INTO EFFECT FROM 20 MAY 2023.

The changes have been made to deter illegal and dangerous protest activities in timber harvesting safety zones and make them safer for workers and protestors. Under the new laws penalties for existing offences will be updated and new offences introduced.

From May 2023 the following changes will come into effect:

- The maximum penalties for most offences related to timber harvesting safety zones will increase. Maximum penalties for some offences increased to 120 penalty units (\$21,000+) or 12 months imprisonment.
- PVC and metal pipes added to the 'prohibited things' list. Regulations can be established to add further items if required without legislative change.
- Banning Notices can be issued to protestors engaging in dangerous activities. Banning them immediately from one or more timber harvesting safety zones.
- Authorised Officers will have increased Powers of Search in timber harvesting safety zones.
- Clarification that individuals who interfere with timber harvesting operators or their machinery in timber harvesting safety zones may be found guilty of an offence.

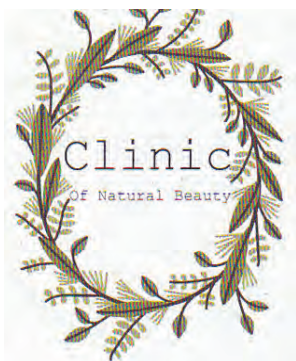

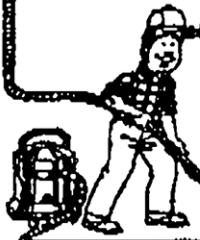

Clubs rewarded for safety commitment

The Transport Accident Commission (TAC) will give thousands of football and netball clubs across Victoria an opportunity to share in \$600,000 for kicking road safety goals this season.

The program is a key feature of the TAC's 32-year partnership with AFL Victoria and rewards grassroots football and netball clubs with up to \$10,000 for their efforts to promote road safety in their clubs and local communities.

The range of initiatives funded includes facility improvements, the purchase of new equipment, training for members and offering safe transport from club events.

Minister for Roads and Road Safety, Melissa Horne, said the TAC's partnership with AFL Victoria provided an invaluable connection with thousands of communities that travel hundreds of

kilometres to games and training every year.

"Victoria's grassroots football and netball clubs have strong community connections and a culture of looking out for their teammates," Minister Horne said.

"This partnership allows us to reward clubs that proactively promote road safety throughout the season, injecting much-needed support for club initiatives, while they help to keep our roads safe."

Ms Cockfield said this year's TAC Club Rewards Program would encourage clubs to start conversations about the dangers of distracted driving and the importance of remaining focused on the road.

"Too many people have died on our roads this year and we know that distracted driving is a key and prevalent issue among young to middle-aged drivers, thousands of whom spend many

hours at local sporting clubs every week," Ms Cockfield said.

"Victoria's football and netball clubs are often at the heart of their communities and prioritising road safety within local clubs could be the reason someone gets home safely, instead of a tragic alternative."

Rumbalara Football Netball Club received

\$10,000 through last year's program to provide a driver mentor program to help members gain their licence and offers road safety education to junior members.

"Our footballers can cover hundreds of kilometres on the roads every year as they travel to and from training and games, so road safety is something that we all need

to be thinking about," Mr Kavanagh said.

Last year, 150 clubs from across Victoria received a share of \$500,000 through the program.
