Regions have been left wanting

Two weeks before the federal government hands down its third budget, regional communities are still waiting on funding

promises announced in its first budget in 2022, according to Member for Indi, Helen Haines.

"The government

announced \$1 billion across the Growing Regions Program and Regional Precincts and Partnerships Program in

October 2022 but now, 18 months later, no money has actually been delivered to our communities," Dr Haines said.

"I welcome due diligence and careful, fair consideration in the assessment of applications but this process is taking too long. These funds are vital to deliver housing, health precincts and other infrastructure for regional Australia and we can't keep endlessly waiting.

"The government is preparing to deliver its third budget on May 14, yet they have not delivered much needed funding for regional communities that they committed to in their first budget."

The Growing Regions Program was established to provide new opportunities for regional councils and not-for-profit organisations through an annual competitive grants process, while the Regional Precincts and Partnerships Program was a new funding scheme for larger-scale place-making projects.

"When I meet with organisations across Indi and I hear they need funding for upgrades and developments that will help our communities thrive, I advise them to apply for these programs," Dr Haines said.

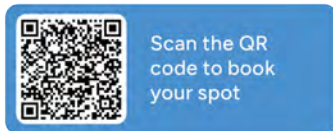

Serving country and community

The guest speaker at this year's Anzac Day service in Corryong provided an insight into one man's experience in WWI and his contribution to the local community upon his return.

Michael Greenham spoke about his just-published book, *'Devotion To Humanity'*, detailing the life of his great-uncle and WWI veteran, Doctor/Captain David Peter Greenham. Doctor Greenham grew up in Dartmoor but spent almost all of his 30-year medical career in Corryong between the two World Wars.

He was much admired by the Upper Murray community for his work, civic involvement and compassion - evidenced by the fact he has a street in the town named after him.

Michael Greenham recalled that he had grown up knowing his great uncle had been 'in World War One, and a doctor at somewhere called Corryong' and he was inspired to learn more about his life.

David Greenham was born at Dartmoor in 1889, the youngest of six children to farming couple James and Margaret Greenham.

He won a government scholarship to a secondary school requiring him to live in Melbourne. After finishing at Wesley College in 1906, he won a further scholarship to study medicine at Melbourne University.

Apart from being a diligent academic he was also an outstanding sportsman. He played 51 VFL games with University and was selected as centre-half-back for the 1911 Victorian side to play in the Interstate Carnival.

'Dr Dave' also competed in the Victorian Athletics Championships in hurdles and long jump, most times finishing second to world record holder for the 440 yard hurdles, Les Davis. He also represented University in a well-credentialed crew at interstate rowing 8-competitions, two seats

in front of Harry Ross-Soden, who competed for Australia in the 1912 Stockholm Olympics.

After completing his medical degree and training he was snapped up by St Vincent's Hospital as a Resident Medical Officer, dealing clinically with several high-profile cases.

Aged 24 in 1913, he was beckoned to Corryong by the local Police Constable William Moore, who prior to his time here had been stationed at Dartmoor, where he knew the Greenham family and had remained in touch.

Constable Moore felt young doctor-surgeon Dave was the type of bloke the Corryong area needed.

For the next 30 years, Dr Dave provided medical services for the district and added to it with a range of civic, sporting and social interests.

In 1914, the year after he arrived, he possibly had his highest profile medical task - to perform the autopsy on Jack Riley, the original 'Man from Snowy River'.

Until he joined the Australian Army Medical Corps in 1917, Dr Dave carried out the medical assessments on local volunteers. He wanted to enlist before that but could not get a locum doctor to take on his job and he didn't want to leave the community without a doctor.

When he did join up he served in hospitals in Egypt, England and later in France, where he was injured badly - rupturing his achilles tendon during a sports carnival when representing his battalion against another while both

units were resting from the front line!

Dr Dave returned to Melbourne in November 1919 where he married Millie Gray and was back in Corryong with his bride a couple of months later, just in time for the 1920 football season.

He had captained Corryong to a premiership in 1915 and did so again in 1921. He was also on the club committee for almost 20 years.

Dr Dave also played one game with arch rivals Federal, a pre-war interleague game against Tallangatta!

His civic contributions included being a committee member of the football, golf, tennis and racing clubs. He was also on church and service club committees and of course, heavily involved in the running of the Corryong Hospital; which he had lobbied and fundraised for to help build in 1917 as a replacement for the small Cottage Hospital that existed on his arrival.

Notably, he was the inaugural president of the Corryong RSL sub-branch and remained so for 19 years. During his watch, membership rose from eight to 120 and years later those members were unanimous that it was solely due to the doctor's "force of personality" that the branch survived and flourished. He was also instrumental in the construction of the Corryong cenotaph, which was built in 1925.

Given what he had witnessed of war, it must have been difficult in his RSL role to farewell local young men off to WWII.

He would often comment that he had "brought them into the world"... most likely with the realistic thought they may not survive.

Dr Dave did not see the end of WWII. He died in January 1945 as a result of pancreatic cancer. He left his estate to his wife Millie, excluding 500 pounds [about \$40,000 in today's value] which he donated to the Corryong Hospital.

"I think you would understand now why the generation of his peers, and their children, thought so much of Doctor David Peter Greenham and why he should be counted amongst your community heroes," Michael said in his Anzac Day address.

"When I visited Corryong a couple of years ago to work on my research, I met John Whitehead at the museum.

He recounted the survival story of his cousin Wilfred Whitehead, who aged 12 in 1936, had his leg mangled in horse-riding accident.

"The nurse assisting Dr Dave in the treatment of the injury, commented that it looked like an

amputation was needed. He replied confidently for all to hear... 'I've saved worse than this on the Western Front' - and he proceeded to do so!"

The book 'Devotion To Humanity', was launched at the Corryong Baptist Church on Anzac Day afternoon, Dr Greenham's former home and medical practice.

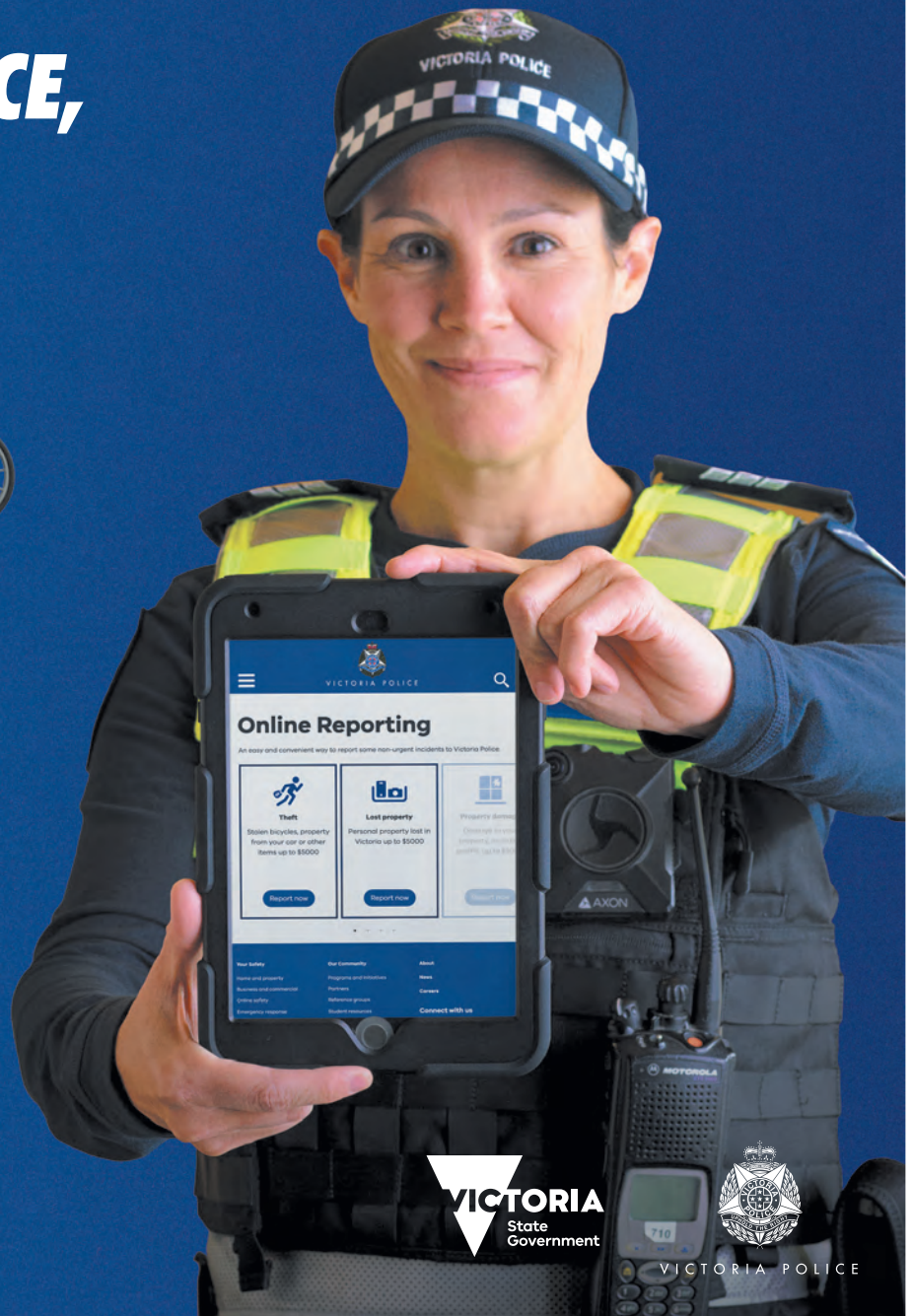

Work Recommences

Work recommenced on the Corryong CBD Streetscape project on 22 April. Two underground fuel tanks have successfully been decommissioned and soil testing around the remaining tanks is being conducted to assess contamination levels, which will dictate any necessary soil removal. With the removal of the two tanks, work has resumed on Stage 2 of the project this week, which covers the area from Legends Cafe, up to the first entry of the IGA.

New kerbside service starts soon

Towong Shire Council has announced changes to its waste collection service, set to take effect from June 2024.

In line with state government requirements for waste management by 2030, council is introducing a new system that separates waste into four categories: recyclables, food and garden organics (FOGO), glass containers and landfill waste.

From June 3, council will implement a 'three bin' collection service, partnering with Cleanaway to manage waste collection operations. Residents will receive a new green lidded bin, along with a kitchen caddy and supply of liners, in advance of the service commencing. A calendar detailing bin collection day will also be provided.

Towong mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead, emphasised the importance of community feedback in shaping this initiative.

"We were keen to understand community priorities for issues like environmental sustainability and financial impact, so that the new service could be aligned with community priorities

wherever possible," he said.

"We believe these changes will not only streamline waste collection processes but also contribute to our community's sustainability goals."

Recognising the diverse practices of rural property owners in managing food and garden organics, council is offering an opt-out option for the FOGO service for residents in the Rural Zone.

"We know that many

rural property owners have practices in place for the onsite management of food and garden organics and as a result, will not want a green lidded bin," Cr Whitehead said.

"Rural Zone residents who wish to opt out must notify council by Monday, 20 May, 2024."

"Opt-out forms can be completed online, returned via email or mailed to the council. Alternatively, residents can provide their response over the phone to the Customer Service

team."

Information on bin collection schedules and waste sorting guidelines will be provided to residents via various channels, including council's website, local newspapers, social media platforms and e-newsletters.

"Applicants spend much time preparing their submissions and then are left waiting for many months to find out whether they have been successful. This creates uncertainty and is a handbrake on regional planning.

"Communities are feeling the pinch of a cost-of-living crisis and a housing crisis. Investments from grants programs boost local economies and accelerate much needed infrastructure projects.

"Another grant program that is yet to deliver promised funding is the Housing Support Program," Dr Haines added.

"Following my meeting with Prime Minister Albanese in August last year, he announced the Housing Support Program, a \$500 million funding program that enables local housing developments to get started.

"This program only opened for applications in March and is critical to addressing the regional housing supply crisis. We must see money flow from this program soon."

Tilley sees red over traffic lights

Almost half a million dollars has been wasted on traffic lights rather than road fixes, according to the Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley.

In March, Mr Tilley asked the Roads Minister for the cost of maintenance and operations of temporary traffic lights on the Beechworth-Wodonga Road, Murray Valley Highway at Tallangatta east, Granya Road and the Omeo Highway at Tallandoon.

All six locations were or still are reduced to a single lane controlled by traffic lights for close to and in some instances more than 12 months.

A bridge on the Beechworth-Wodonga Road was recently reopened, while works are underway at two sites

on the Murray Valley Highway near Old Tallangatta. The bridge project had been delayed by heritage assessments.

Mr Tilley said a more immediate response could have seen the money used on the roadworks to improve safety as well as reduce travel times and frustration.

"Most people will be wondering why it has taken so long to get any of these roads fixed and the cost of these temporary traffic lights just adds insult to injury," he said.

"This is the real cost of a cash strapped state that can't pay for what should be urgent repairs.

"\$474,000 has been wasted while these roads were reduced to one lane.

"As anyone who

was caught in the three-kilometre traffic jam on the Beechworth-Wodonga Road on Easter Saturday can attest, it's not good enough."

Mr Tilley fears the upcoming budget will be even worse for our roads.

"Despite a record \$2.5 billion from vehicle registration last year, this Labor government continued cutting the road maintenance budget," he said.

"It's slashed 45 per cent from that budget since 2020 and last year the Department of Transport fell 25 per cent short of its own road repair target.

"Instead of fixing dangerous roads, this government reduces speed limits and puts up traffic lights."

Corryong CBD Update



Last week, two underground fuel tanks were successfully decommissioned, paving the way for construction to recommence on Stage 2 of the project.

This week, contractors have been conducting additional soil testing at the sites of the remaining fuel tanks, positioned in front of the IGA and the leather store, to evaluate contamination levels. This testing is expected to continue until Friday.


During this period, to accommodate the movement of machinery for drilling, four car parks in front of the IGA and leather shop will be unavailable, and the right-hand entrance to the IGA will be temporarily inaccessible. However, access to the IGA will remain available through the left-hand entrance and also through the hardware store.

Spawning rules now apply

Recreational fishers are reminded that the annual trout fishing spawning stream rules commenced yesterday in the Snowy region's two declared spawning streams.

NSW Department of Primary Industries (DPI) Program Leader Fish Stocking & Enhancement Operations, Jim Harnwell, said the annual trout spawning stream fishing rules apply to the Thredbo River and its tributaries and the Eucumbene River and its tributaries (upstream of the backed-up waters of Lake Eucumbene and including Providence Portal).

"While this is a great opportunity to target trophy trout in those rivers, there are some special rules in place to



provide protection for spawning trout," Mr Harnwell said.

"A minimum size limit of 50cms, daily bag limit of one and possession limit of two trout applies to the Thredbo and Eucumbene rivers from Tuesday this week through to the end of the King's Birthday long weekend on Monday, June

10, 2024."

Mr Harnwell said fishers can only use one rod and line at a time, rigged with up to two artificial flies or lures and they can possess up to three rods, rigged with artificial flies or lures; however the use and possession of handlines is not permitted.

BACASH'S EMPORIUM

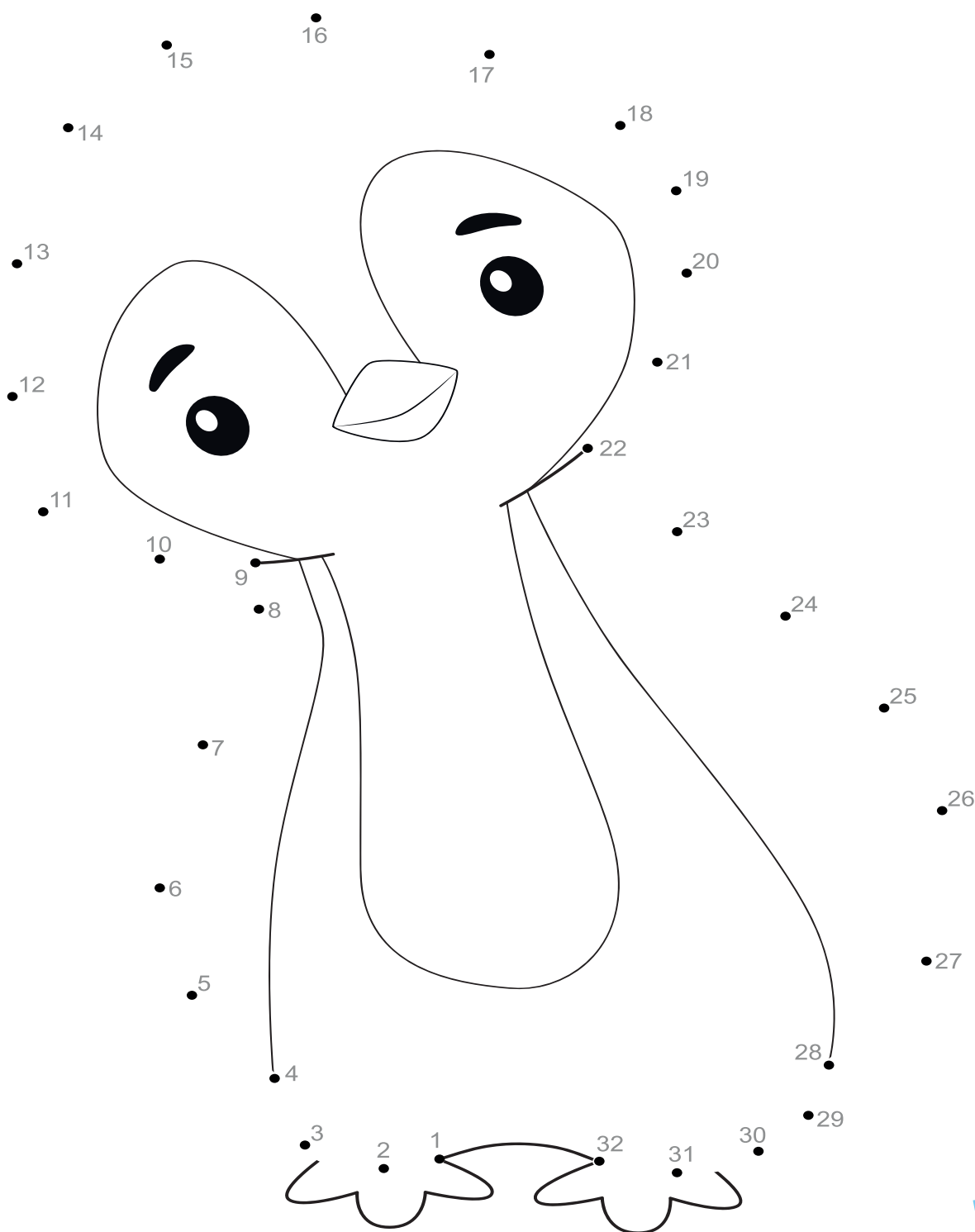

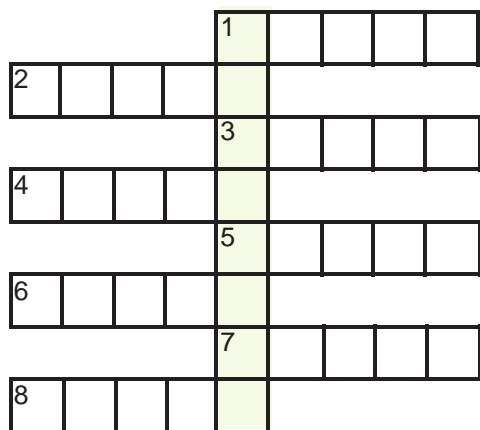
