Screening van returns



One of BreastScreen Victoria's mobile screening vans will visit Corryong later this month to offer free breast screens.

The van last visited Corryong in 2020 and people who are due for a breast screen will be invited to attend this important health check. It's recommended that

women aged between 50 and 74 have a breast screen every two years. Regular screening is the best way to find breast cancer early - before symptoms present and when treatment is most likely to be successful.

Breast screens are with female radiographer in a safe and friendly environment and take just 10 minutes. There's no need for a doctor's referral or Medicare card.

Covid-19 safety measures are in place on the van, such as physical distancing, to protect both the community and staff. Unless they are exempt, all clients who screen on the van in Corryong must wear a face mask.

BreastScreen Victoria's CEO, Rita Butera, encourages eligible people from Corryong and surrounds to screen on the van while it's in the area.

"We have two mobile screening service vans that travel around the state throughout the year," she

"Our visit to Corryong is aimed at ensuring women in every part of Victoria have access to life-saving potentially mammograms.

"The vans use the same high-quality digital radiography machines as our permanent clinics so everyone can get the best possible care, wherever they live."

The van will be located at 76 Hanson Street (beside the Towong Shire offices) from 14 November to 25 November, 2022.

Food charity faces further struggles

A plan to locate a portable building on vacant Crown land at the western end of Strzelecki Way, Corryong has met with strong resistance from residents.

Following the demolition of the former Guides Hall in Harris Street in March, work was scheduled to locate a portable 'Commander' building for Corryong FoodShare Services on the site, however the discovery of a sinkhole on the block set back those plans.

The food charity has been operating out of the former Scout Group building at the other end of Strzelecki Way for several years but once the 1st Corryong Scouts Group was re-formed last year, it was forced to find new premises.

The Harris Street block became available but when it was not possible to put the modular building on it, permission was obtained from the Committee of Management for the Corryong Recreation Reserve to temporarily locate it on the former netball courts in Strzelecki Way while a solution was sought to the sinkhole issue.

A subsequent assessment of the Harris Street site indicated that earthworks costing up to \$20,000 would be required before the 'Commander' unit could be safely located on the block.

Following a request from FoodShare Services for assistance, the Recreation Reserve committee then offered a block of land on Strzelecki Way for the location of its new premises.

However, once word got into the public domain, neighbouring residents were up in arms and started a petition objecting to the proposal.

It is understood that FoodShare Services has not submitted a planning application to Towong Shire Council to locate the building on the Strzelecki Way site. the modular building in Strzelecki Way.

Power station milestone marked

"Tumut 3 has been operating reliably and safely for 50 years, with decades more service to come.

"The longevity of this asset is testament to its quality design, engineering, construction and maintenance," Mr Whitby added.

"I would like to thank and express my appreciation to those who have played a part in Tumut 3's history, especially those former workers who have attended the event today."

Visitors to the event enjoyed a range of activities including power station tours, bus tours of the reservoir and penstocks, live music, food vendors, and activities for the kids from Snowy Hydro's Next Generation Education Hub and the NSW NPWS.

Fuel reduction plans not working

I am writing on behalf of the many concerned and disillusioned citizens of the Upper Murray, to relay our disappointment and frustration at the mismanagement of Crown Land and Parks Victoria areas in regards to fuel reduction and fire mitigation works.

The Department of Environment, Land, Water & Planning (DELWP) and Parks Victoria rely on mosaic burnings for so-called fire control. Put simply, this does not work. You would liken this to recovering a vehicle with a chain, with three out of every four links missing. Local input from CFA

and landholders on areas that need fuel reduction is sought by DELWP but only as a token gesture it would seem as the information is often disregarded.

The local DELWP officers are employed to look after the region as they know the area and in many cases were born here and have a vested interest in keeping it safe. It seems ridiculous that they have to answer to city-centred bureaucrats who have no real connection to or understanding of the areas they are trying to control.

DELWP employees are told what days they can do reduction burning and what areas from central control. This is not workable!

Conditions vary from day to day and district to district in Victoria. They have varied micro weather and therefore different preferred times for optimal burning for fuel reduction. A better outcome would be had, if local knowledge was used.

It has been said that fuel reduction burning is too costly to do however the cost pales into insignificance compared to the loss of liveliehoods, livestock houses, and



native flora and fauna as well as the destruction of the environment including waterways, some of which will never be the same.

There is also a community cost with mental health issues and social upheaval as the result of the volunteer firefighter hours involved over the summer months of trying to save lives and property.

In 2019-20 the wild fire that hit the Upper Murray was unstoppable due to mismanagement of the bush particularly in the Pine Mountain National Park and Wabba Wilderness area

Imagine our despair to learn that there are no plans to burn this area for another 15 years. This is particularly alarming as the area affected by the fire that touched the Nariel Valley in 2003 had not had a fuel reduction fire since and the 2019-20 fire burnt in our estimation at least ten times bigger and was more destructive, with the loss of many houses and irreparable damage

to many areas of the environment. The mosaic burn policy of DELWP and Parks Victoria is not fit for purpose. The environmental laws that

these departments work under and administer have no regards for the safety of rural landholders and the long-term health of the environment.

Land managers should know the three elements of the fire triangle, only

one of which they can control, which is fuel. The other two - weather and topography - are out of their control!

The boundary between Crown Land, Parks Victoria and private land needs a more co-operative approach between government agencies and private landholders in relation to all aspects of fire management, fire reduction, pest control and fence line protection.

This would help landholders protect their assets and livelihood.

Maybe the idea of the 'marginal mile' should be revisited

Nurse undaunted by horrors of war

Part 2

On 5 October, 1916 Ivy Bartlett embarked for England and for her onward journey from Avonmouth in Bristol from where she returned once again to Australia. In Ivy's service records there is no explanation why she was posted to England and then back home. Once again she could have been escorting wounded servicemen returning from the theatre of war.

She was sent again to England in 1917 and the next noteworthy date in her wartime career is November 1918 when like many other nurses and servicemen at the time, she was diagnosed with influenza. After recovering, Ivy nursed briefly at the Australian Auxiliary Hospital at Dartford near London before embarking on her final voyage home to Australia.

Staff Nurse Ivy Bartlett arrived back in Melbourne on 4 January, 1919.

Her spirit was seemingly undiminished by her wartime service, as she sent out a Christmas card showing the print of the ship on which she had embarked for her homeward voyage. Tellingly, the verse reads: Never a Christmas morning,

Never an old year ends, But somebody thinks of

somebody, Old days, old times, old friends.

According to an article in *Table Talk* (Melbourne) on Thursday 15 May, 1919 "Ivy was welcomed home at a successful function in the Corryong Memorial Hall on Friday evening, May 2, when the local branch of the RSSILA (The Returned Sailors and Soldiers Imperial League of Australia) tendered a welcome home social to Nurse Ivy Bartlett, who has returned after having been on active service for three years and eight

months." Table Talk records Ivy as "taking a quiet rest with her sister Mrs J T Simpson of 'The Retreat' in the beautiful valley of Nariel, Upper Murray." In addition to those strenuous months in 1915 nursing the wounded from Gallipoli, Ivy had made nine trips across the seas. It was understandable if the war years had taken their toll. Some nurses never recovered from the horrors of war and the sound of gunfire ringing in their ears.

On 2 September,



It is possible that during her time at Caulfield Military Hospital Ivy assisted with nursing her brother Albert who had arrived as a stretcher case on 23 March, 1919. He died of a carcinoma in 11th Australian General Hospital at Caulfield on 17 September, 1919. Along with their sister

Helen who received a half share in Albert's estate and their father Sidney who received one sixth, Albert bequeathed Ivy a one third share. Albert and Ivy's father died of senile dementia on 9 June, 1922. Following Ivy's return

to civilian nursing, she nursed at 'Lyntor' Private Hospital for the next two or more years.

In 1923 Ivy gave 'Cricklewood House' in Frankston as her address for the despatch of her medals. She was living in Pakenham when on 28 July, 1926 in the Hawthorn Presbyterian Church she married the clever but shy Packenham Shire Engineer, Percival Ferry Thwaites.

Both Ivy and Percival were gifted people who came from talented and well connected families. It was a pity they had no children but their relatives remember them fondly.

Percival and his inventor brother, Ernest, were keen pioneers in the automobile industry and were instrumental in starting the RACV.

Apparently Percival's white hair and long white beard made him look like George Bernard Shaw! Percival Thwaites'

father, Robert Ferry Thwaites, was a successful artist having painted with members of the Heidelberg School and whose paintings continue to command good prices at auction. Ivy died in 1964 in Heidelberg. Both Ivy and Percival had much to offer their community and country and yet little is known of their latter years. By the 1960s and like many of her First World War nursing colleagues, Ivy had almost been forgotten. Many died in poverty.

There is little to remember the Bartlett

family's contribution to Corryong except for the descendants of Ivy and Albert's relatives, a fine tombstone in the cemetery, the Corryong College Honour Board in the Memorial Hall and a street named after them.

Having survived the First World War our blazing nurse Ivy isn't mentioned on our War Memorial, unveiled in

1926.

It is time to commemorate Ivy's nursing service and her talented family's contribution to the early development of Corryong's medical services, culture and news media.

Keep an eye out for Simon White returning to Corryong and the unfolding of another fine local ANZAC story on the wall of the RSL Hall!






