Opinion:- We must pursue our duty to veterans

The decision to serve your country is a momentous one. Whether in peacetime or in war, our servicemen and servicewomen put the safety, security and prosperity of our nation before their own.

Whether you serve on the frontlines or not, defence service is dangerous. The wounds go far beyond the physical and we now know the significant mental toll our veterans and their families face.

The Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide is a watershed moment in our nation's history. The stories were harrowing and the release of the final report is a sombre moment for all Australians.

This must be the moment where we say is enough is enough and commit - as a country and as a Parliament - to do better by our veterans and their families, and the wider community.

Recent legislation responding to the first recommendation of the Royal Commission was introduced by the government to fix the veterans entitlement system.

The Royal Commission found this byzantine system is so complex, so convoluted, so prone to delays, that it contributes to the distress and suicidality of veterans. This sentiment is reflected in the many interactions I have with veterans across

The stories I hear from veterans in Indi are distressing - veterans who feel abandoned within the complex and confusing entitlement system. Veterans who lose access to services because the Department of Veterans Affairs fails to pay invoices on time. In turn, the service providers are put under pressure because of delayed DVA payments.

I support simplifying the system to make it easier and quicker for veterans to receive support and care and to end the secondary trauma for veterans who are forced to prove, often on multiple occasions, that their condition is service related.

This government and all future governments, must respond to the Royal Commission with more action and more funding to help veterans. Doing better by veterans cannot happen in two years' time and not after the next election but now.

In the 2021 Census, more than 5000 people in Indi said they had previously served or were currently serving in our defence forces.

Knowing these deep links to the defence force, when I became the Independent Member for Indi I made a concerted effort to grow my knowledge of what it means to be a serving member of the defence force and the issues facing veterans. This includes taking part in the Defence Parliamentary Force's Program, joining Operation Resolute with Australian Border Force last year.

Throughout my time as the Independent Member for Indi, I have worked closely with our veteran organisations, including the RSLs, through the Tim Fischer AC Veterans and Families Hub in Wodonga, the Goorambat Veterans Retreat, just to name a few.

Our RSLs play a vital role in hosting ceremonies on Anzac Day and Remembrance Day, managing dozens of volunteers, maintaining local cenotaphs and honouring the service of servicemen and women. Remembrance Day pays respect and gratitude to all who have served. On the days that follow, we must pursue our duty to provide veterans with the care and support they deserve.

Burn off cleans up park



CFA crews burnt off large tracts of scrub and weedy areas at Playles Hill Park.

Crews from the Corryong and Nariel CFA brigades recently spent two weekend days burning off 10 large heaps of vegetation around the

steep hillside area near the bike track at the Playles Hill Park.

"It is steep, rocky country and the effort needed to access and

work there cannot be understated," said Thea Newton from the Playles Hill Project Group.

"A big thank you goes to the crews who did such a magnificent job."

This is the next step in achieving the aim of the group to remove invasive, woody scrub and weedy growth from the park.

After four years of slow, laborious work to remove vegetation by hand, this year the group was successful in receiving a Tiny Towns grant., enabling the employment of contractors to do the bulk of the difficult work to remove the vegetation

from along the roadside and beside the bike path.

"The recent burns have removed much of the vegetation cut back by the contractors," Thea said.

"Over the next few months, work will continue to control regrowth via chemical spraying.

"It is hoped to have the areas ready for replanting with local native shrubs next autumn, winter and spring."

Fire restrictions come into effect

The Fire Danger Period (FDP) will begin this coming Monday, November 18, for a number of municipalities in CFA's North East region including Towong Shire Council.

After a drier-thanaverage autumn and winter, communities are facing an increased fire risk leading into summer with substantial amounts of dead and dry plant material in forests making it easier for fires to ignite and spread.

District 24 Assistant Chief Fire Officer, Brett Myers, said "There is a great deal of fuel out there and we're predicting a summer of grassfires.

"We're asking people to keep an eye out on the VicEmergency App and CFA website, to be aware of the fire danger ratings and to know what their plan is should a fire event arise

"If you can take the time to finalise preparing your properties, we strongly suggest you do so, whether that is reducing vegetation around your property or clearing your gutters."

CFA's 52,000 members are poised to respond and support communities this bushfire season and they're urging people to use common sense and take responsibility for preventing fires.

Those conducting

burn-offs must notify authorities online at the Fire Permits Victoria website (www.firepermits. vic.gov.au), or by calling Triple Zero Victoria on 1800 668 511.

"By registering your burn-off online, you allow emergency call takers to allocate more of their time taking calls from people who need emergency assistance immediately," Mr Myers said.

"No burning off is permitted during the FDP without a permit which can be applied for through the Fire Permits Victoria website.

"There are very strict conditions attached to these permits and the liability sits with the permit holder to ensure they always act safely."



Towong Bridge temporary closure November 2024

Transport for NSW will carry out road sealing work on Towong Bridge in November to provide a safer and smoother crossing over the Murray River.

A final seal will be applied to the concrete bridge deck and will provide a stronger and more resilient road surface for motorists.

We'll be working at Towong Road on the NSW side of the Murray River near Towong Bridge camping reserve from **Friday 22 November to Saturday 23 November 2024**, weather permitting. Work will be carried out between 8.30am on Friday and 2pm on Saturday.

The bridge will be closed across the two days and will re-open from 2pm on Saturday 23 November, weather permitting. The shared pathway will also be closed for the safety of workers and the community.

The campground on the NSW side of the bridge will remain open but is only accessible from Towong Road on the NSW side of the river.

Detours will be in place with motorists advised to cross the Murray River via Bringenbrong Bridge to the south or Tintaldra Bridge to the north, adding about 20 minutes to journeys.







Swish is for control of Stable Fly (Stomoxys calcitrans), House Fly (Musca domestica) and Lice (Bovicola bovis, Linognathus vituli and Haematopinus eurysternus) on beef and dairy cattle.

For control of synthetic pyrethroid susceptible Buffalo Fly (Haematobia irritans exigua) for up to 3 weeks and for control of Stable Fly (Stomoxys calcitrans) for up to 1 week on horses.
