

Haines calls for unilateral anti corruption support

The Joint Select Held Committee tasked comwith scrutinising the constitutional Anti-Corruption (NACC) the Bills has handed down the its report, supporting the passage of the Bill indicated and making six joint the recommendations to the national committee.

Tabling the report in the House of Representatives last Thursday, Deputy Chair of the Committee and Member for Indi,

Select Helen Haines, said the tasked committee had delivered a the consensus report.

"It was clear to the committee that the overwhelming majority of groups and individuals supported the establishment of a national anti-corruption commission and there was broad agreement in relation to a number of core elements of the Bills," Dr Haines said.

"It was important to

me that the committee has a consensus report to support the passage of the Bill. The best decisions are reached through collaboration and consensus. If the NACC is to withstand changes of government and the whims of the times, it needs multi-partisan support.

"It is my sincere hope that this consensus continues beyond the committee and that all members of this Parliament vote as one to pass this Bill."

Despite the committee handing down a consensus report, Dr Haines signalled she would move amendments to the Bill when it comes up for debate.

"This is a good bill," she said.

"The establishment of a National Anti-Corruption Commission is a watershed moment in our nation's history but it can be better."

Dr Haines has made additional considerations regarding the exceptional circumstances test for holding public hearings, measures to increase transparency and independence of the commission's budget.

"The committee did not hear compelling evidence from the government in favour of retaining the exceptional circumstances test for holding public hearings and many experts questioned why it was necessary," she said.

"Together with other members of the committee I have recommended the government consider adding measures to increase the transparency around the budget of the NACC and measures for a special majority of the oversight committee to approve appointments of the Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner.

"These measures would increase the independence of the NACC and protect it against being politicised by future governments."

Dr Haines also recommended 'pork barrelling' be explicitly included in the definition of corruption.

"If we are to ensure the NACC works to restore trust in politicians and government, we must ensure that it covers pork barrelling," she said.



Ballots drawn for state election

The candidate order for for the 2022 Victorian election on November 26 has now been determined, following the close of nominations last Friday.

A total of 740 candidates have nominated for the Lower House and 454 for the Upper House which represents an increase from the 887 candidates at the 2018 State election and a record number of candidates in both the Lower House and Upper House for a State election.

In the Benambra electorate, a field of eight candidates will do battle.

The order in which they will appear on the Lower House election ballot paper is:-

Mike Fuery (Animal Justice Party), Dean Rossiter (Liberal Democrats), Luke Brady (Australian Greens), Jacqui Hawkins (Independent) Janelle Stratton (Family First Victoria), Bill Tilley (Liberal), Mark Tait (Australian Labor Party), Adrian O'Brien (Freedom Party of Victoria).

The gap between the two front-runners for Benambra - incumbent Bill Tilley and Jacqui Hawkins - was only four per cent on a two-candidate-preferred basis after the last election in 2018 and latest polling has indicated a tightening race between the pair.

Both candidates have made health care their priority issue this time round, particularly the need for a new Albury Wodonga hospital.

The submission period for how-to-vote cards closes tomorrow and voters will be able to view them on the VEC website when they are registered.

Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) commissioner, Warwick Gately, explained that how-to-vote cards are a suggestion only and that it is up to voters to decide which candidate receives which preference number – from first choice to the last choice.

"Almost half of informal votes cast are unintentionally informal," he said.

"This can be due to voters repeating or missing numbers or using ticks and crosses rather than numbers.

"If you're planning to vote during the early voting period, have a look at who has nominated for your district and region and start thinking about your preferences. At the voting centre, number your candidates according to your preferences and then take time to check that you have numbered all candidates without repeating or missing any numbers."

The VEC website also features short videos on how to complete ballot papers correctly in 23 different languages.

Early voting opened on Monday and the VEC has arranged extended early voting hours on several days in response to voter feedback.

Voters can view the short videos and early voting hours at vec.vic. gov.au
