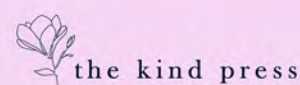

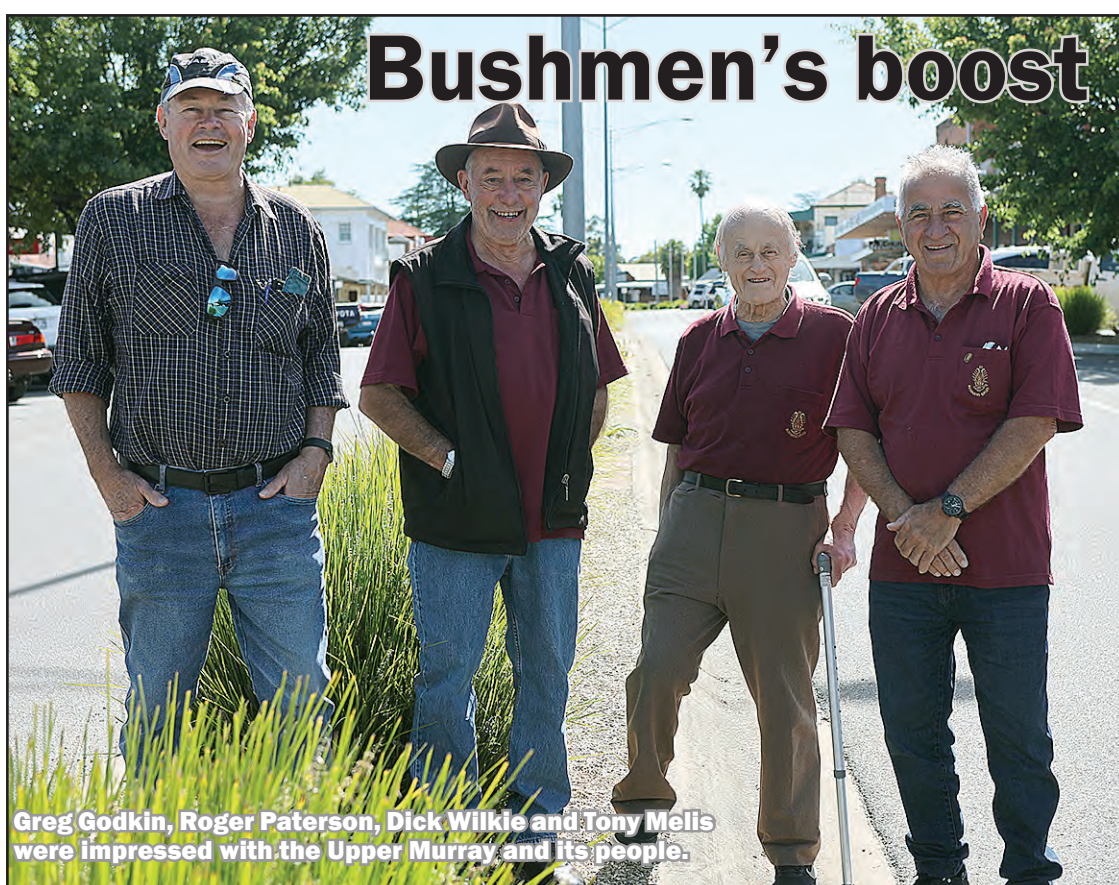

They came, they saw, they ate and drank!

A group of former members of the 22nd Battalion, Royal Victoria Regiment - 'The Bushmen's Rifles' - visited the Upper Murray over the weekend to see the sights and give a fillip to the local economy.

The party of more than 20 arrived on Friday and visited the Man From Snowy River Museum

on Saturday before a formal dinner at Riley's Restaurant where they were regaled with tales of the Upper Murray by keynote speaker Kevin Whitehead and offerings from local poet and raconteur Maurie Foun.

"Kevin was a very interesting speaker and Maurie is a top class bush poet," said Roger Paterson.

On Sunday it was

a visit to the RSL Hall before a barbecue lunch catered for by the local Red Cross unit and a few of them also found their way to The Club Corryong that evening.

"We had a great time in Corryong," Roger said, "and we'll be talking about our trip for months."

"Everyone was extremely welcoming."

The "The Bushmen's Rifles" was formed in

1966 as part of the Citizen Military Forces (later Army Reserve) and was considered a country unit, as most of its members were from rural Victoria.

Former members get together to help out smaller Victorian communities and the weekend visitors had been trying to get to the Upper Murray for some time following the Black Summer bushfires but the pandemic intervened.

New manager hits the ground running

With an annual general meeting coming up and major projects in development, the recently appointed General Manager of Upper Murray Inc (UMI), Jane Saxton, is

ready to drive the region's progress.

Jane has lived in the Upper Murray for 20 years and throughout that time has been involved in community development, both through her work and volunteer activities.

She has developed a network of contacts in tourism, agriculture and governance on both sides of the state border and believes strongly in the importance of cross border co-operation.

"My experience in this field includes being a member of the working group which developed the Snowy Valleys Way concept incorporating several LGAs and cross border communities," Jane said.

She was also instrumental in getting the Man From Snowy River Bush Festival back up and running after the Black Summer bushfires in her capacity as events co-ordinator.

"I'm committed to the Upper Murray and its social and economic development through sustainable practices and I'm very excited to be now working with UMI to deliver these goals," Jane said.

Since its inception, UMI has advocated for the Upper Murray. After the Black Summer bushfires each board member sat on local recovery committees which also ensured representation from both sides of the border.

A major project underway in the Upper Murray is the Community Microgrid and Sustainable Energy program.

UMI will be holding its annual general meeting next Tuesday where guest speaker, Matthew Charles-Jones from Mondo, a subsidiary of AusNet Services, will report on the project's progress and what the future may hold.

The meeting will be held at Corryong Brew at 7pm on Tuesday November 30.

Pandemic creates business boom

A new TAFE NSW study has revealed Covid-19 hasn't dimmed the entrepreneurial spirit of the state's businesswomen, with 46 per cent of them using the pandemic as a stepping stone to start a new business.

One of the new impressarios is Khancoban businesswoman, Michelle Foxcroft, who recently launched her 'slow fashion' business - The Fox's Croft Collective - after she enrolled in the TAFE NSW Women in Business program.

She said the program had been "hugely beneficial" in helping her navigate the complexities of establishing a new business.

"It really gave me the confidence to get started," Mrs Foxcroft said.

"The unit about applying for licences and permits was particularly helpful and everything was explained in such an easy to understand way."

TAFE Digital General Manager, Lyn Rickard, said the research coincided with more than 13,000 female business leaders turning to the TAFE NSW Women in Business program since the start of the pandemic to learn how to get their business off the ground. With a third of Australian small businesses now headed up by females, the Women in Business program is designed to provide women in every corner of NSW with access to fee-free online training on how to start or build a business," Ms Rickard said.



A TAFE course gave Michelle Foxcroft the confidence to launch her new business.

"The TAFE NSW research tells us that women starting a new business face a number of common challenges, such as not knowing how to get started, finding funding sources and managing their work-life balance."

"Depending on what point women are at with their business, they can cherry pick topics from the Women in Business program to suit their needs - whether it be starting with business planning and sourcing grants, or growing sales with social media and putting wellbeing strategies in place. The perception businesswomen are somehow disadvantaged by operating in regional areas also no longer applies," Ms Rickard added. "The TAFE NSW research confirmed that 57 per cent of female business owners don't believe a remote location

is an issue."

Some of the state's most successful regional businesswomen such as Pinnacle People Solutions CEO, Bronwyn Pearson, who operates from Armidale, share their advice to participants as part of the program.

"Regional areas are home to some of the most innovative small businesses in Australia and the TAFE NSW Women in Business program is ensuring more female business owners have the skills to kick-start their business or adapt to the changing economy," Ms Pearson said.

Locals learn more about saving lives

Ambulance Victoria has thanked the Upper Murray community for embracing 'Shocktober', with a number of locals learning CPR and registering as GoodSAM Responders.

GoodSAM is a life-saving smartphone app that connects Victorians in cardiac arrest with people willing to provide hands-only CPR and defibrillation (if available) in the first critical minutes before paramedics arrive.

Only one in ten people will survive a cardiac arrest, however when bystanders call Triple Zero (000), begin CPR and use an AED the chance of survival increases by 72 per cent.

Corryong local, Dara Pilli, received a 'Shocktober' showbag for her workplace, Costello Rural.

It prompted her to register as a GoodSAM Responder.

Dara said signing up was a no-brainer.

"Being in a small community, we all pitch in wherever we can and I'd be willing to help another person in need," she said.

"Here at work, I'm just across the road from an AED which is accessible 24/7 and that's another reason that I thought 'why not'?"

Throughout 'Shocktober', local paramedics and first responders educated the community about the location of

public AEDs.

In the Upper Murray, AEDs are accessible at the Corryong Memorial Hall, High Country Trading Store, The Club Corryong, Towong Hall and the Corryong Airport.

All are registered with Ambulance Victoria and ready for community members to use when needed.

Throughout 'Shocktober', more than 1000 Victorians registered as GoodSAM Responders.

If you are interested, simply scan the QR code located next to AED cabinets around the Upper Murray. Information and demonstration videos are also available online at ambulance.vic.gov.au.

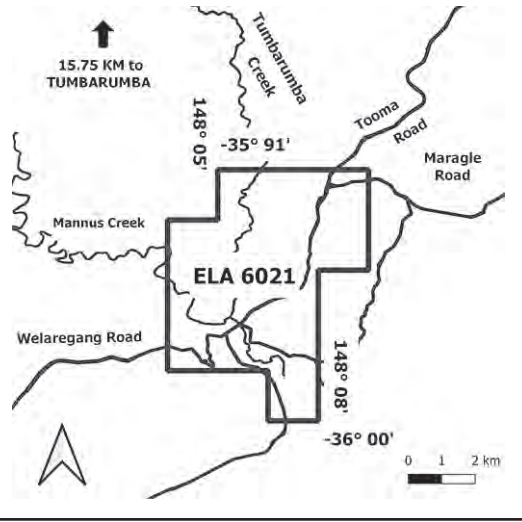

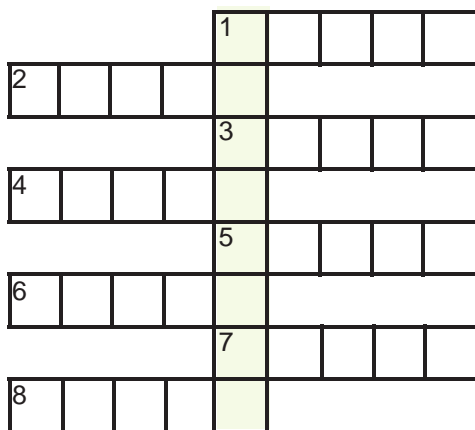

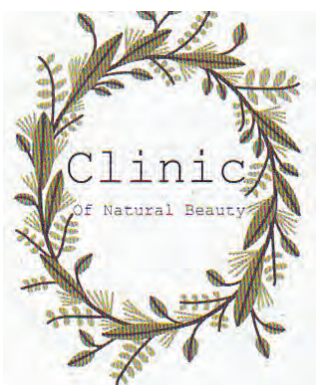
