

This summer, FFMVic has employed 540 project firefighters to work alongside our experienced permanent crews to keep Victorians and the environment safe.

Students at the Walwa and Talgarno Primary Schools are taking part in an innovative creative writing program.

Parallel Wilds is an immersive a cutting-edge 3D creative writing platform for youth, empowering self-identity in the natural world and a speculative universe on the future of species and wilderness, set in the year 2050.

Featuring mind mapping and creative writing on the future of native species, the

program engages youth using a 360 degree camera and six-foot tripod and sound recording, digital photography and design technology.

The school teams work with Parallel Wilds creative director Craig Dent and Justin Dallinger from Oakley 3D Studios.

Another of Parallel Wilds' mentors is former Walwa Primary student, Mia Bettio, who has completed a masters in environmental science at Charles Sturt University.

She was working

with current students last week on writing a story about the platypus. The students are currently researching for the story which includes a 3D walk-through of the school, using Virtual Reality headsets and playing the 3D Gamify where they save endangered species.

"The program has been a big hit with the schools," Craig Dent said.

Community health crisis demands action

As a Tooma resident and farmer along Mannus Creek, I'm writing to inform the local community about a serious issue that affects us all the toxic blue-green algae in Mannus Dam and its downstream waterways.

This is not just an environmental problem - it's a public health crisis that threatens the wellbeing of everyone who relies on or lives near this water source.

My family's story highlights the urgency of this situation. Our farm is surrounded by the creek and for years, we have worked alongside its waters. But over time, we noticed a troubling pattern - with Red Alerts issued, our health deteriorated.

The escalation of illnesses in my family has been devastating. My daughter has developed Chronic Inflammatory Response Syndrome (CIRS) and Harmful Algal Bloom Syndrome (HABS). These conditions are life-altering. HABS, in particular, is associated with neurotoxins that can cause severe neurological damage, often lifelong consequences.

For my family, the effects on all members became so unbearable that we had to relocate, leaving behind the home and farm

we loved, simply to protect our health.

The problem began after Mannus Dam was constructed. Before that, the water flowed naturally and was safe to drink, swim in and enjoy. Since the dam was built, harmful algae blooms have become a persistent issue and bluegreen algae monitoring - which began in 2017 has confirmed the water's toxicity. This year alone, the creek has been under Red Alert for toxic algae every week except two.

Mannus Dam was originally promoted as a recreational site but how can we enjoy fishing or swimming in a dam that is constantly unsafe? It's time to face the reality the dam in its current state is harming, not helping, our community.

But Mannus Creek is more than just a water source, it is an ecological treasure. It is home to the only population of the endangered Macquarie Perch in the NSW Murray region, as well as platypus that were once abundant in its waters. Now, both are disappearing. If the creek is sick, so too are the animals that depend on it. The ongoing presence of toxic blue-green algae is devastating the creek's ecosystem, threatening the survival of these iconic creatures.

At the Snowy Valleys Council meeting on November 21, 2024 John Williams spoke passionately on behalf of us all, proposing that the dam be restored to its natural state as wetlands. This would allow the water to flow freely again, reducing the conditions that fuel toxic algae blooms and revitalising the ecosystem.

I remember a time when the creek was a source of life, a place where we could drink, picnic, swim our horses and connect with nature. Now, it's a danger we can't ignore. My kids know nothing of the life I once enjoyed along the creek because I constantly must refer to it as poison.

To make meaningful change, we need the community's support. We are forming a support group to advocate for the restoration of Mannus Creek and to protect the health of our community and its ecosystem. Bumper cod season opens this weekend

Some of Victoria's most popular inland fishing spots will be drawcards for anglers this weekend when the annual Murray cod fishing season opens on Sunday.

Cod opening Christmas come early for many freshwater fishers and follows the annual three-month closed season – applicable to most waters north of the Great Dividing Range - which gives the iconic native species a chance to breed in peace.

Fisheries Victorian Authority CEO, Travis Dowling, said while large impoundments such as Lake Eildon, Rocklands Reservoir and Lake Eppalock are now open year-round, summer presents terrific fishing opportunities in rivers, creeks and smaller lakes.

"Cod opening weekend means people flocking to productive waters now that the big breeding fish have had time to lay eggs and rest on the nest," he said.

"These waters are goto spots for families, with riverfront camping spots at a premium, caravan parks packed, people eating

at local pubs and cafes, filling up and buying bait at service stations and enjoying all that regional Victoria has to offer.

"We've stocked more fish than all other Australian states and combined territories

including more than three million Murray cod each year thanks to the Victorian government's Go Fishing and Boating Plan, to make sure events like cod opening are circled in people's calendars."

Mr Dowling said Murray cod could be caught on relatively simple gear and were often found among woody habitat such as submerged logs and fallen trees.

"Cod are readily caught on lures like StumpJumpers spinnerbaits, cast from a boat or the shore," he said.

"Alternatively, fishers enjoy success using yabbies, bardi grubs, worms or just a bit of cheese or chicken.

"Persistence patience are the keys to success when chasing Murray cod, whatever method of fishing you choose to tempt them.

"Our Fisheries Officers will be out across northern Victoria helping people care for their catch with the right handling techniques and ensuring anglers let fish go that are outside the 55 to 75cm slot limit."






Originally built in 1965 as part of the Snowy Hydro Scheme, council took over management of the facility in 1993.




