A fundraising event following the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires continues to provide support for local recovery initiatives.

Luke and Jo Humphrey were the driving force behind the *Rise from the Ashes* concert at Cudgewa in February 2020, immediately after the bushires.

On Sunday, they travelled to Corryong to meet with Kate Wheeler (Corryong Health Mental Health Nurse) and Dominic Sandilands (Corryong Health Chief Executive Officer) to hand over a \$5000 cheque to the mental health department.

"This donation from the proceeds of funds raised is intended to help people in Corryong and the Upper Murray who may be going through a tough time," Mr Sandilnds said.

"Since the bushfires, the topic of mental health has been discussed on a regular basis. The need for the whole community to be able to access help when needed has been at an all-time high.

"Not only introducing more regular community gatherings big and small but having someone and somewhere safe and private to sit and talk with someone is a must.

"The donated funds will be used to develop a casual, relaxed and private setting on the hospital grounds overlooking the magnificent Mt Mittamatite to enable counselling sessions in a less clinical environment.

"This spot will soon become the home of a custom gazebo for mental health or counselling sessions.

"Stay tuned for a possible community working bee in the near future as plans are drawn up for the development," he added.

"This generous donation from Luke and Jo and the *Rise from the Ashes* funds is very welcomed, as is the concept and opportunity to creat different settings to suit the variety of needs our community has.

### Police are blitzing all roads

Local police have been involved in Operation Compass over the past week, one of the biggest road blitzes ever carried out.

Assistant Commissioner Road Policing, Glenn Weir, said it is "a highly visible, highly active police operation."

Victoria Police have been patrolling Victoria's main roads and highways under Operation Compass, which continues this week.

Police have been

warning drivers to "take extra care" on Victoria's roads following the easing of lockdown restrictions.

"It's no good surviving the pandemic if you end up dead or seriously injured in a car crash," Commissioner Weir said.

In 2021, 190 people have died on the states roads, which is well above 2020's 178.

Following the end of lockdown last year 11 people died, and at the end of the recent regional

restrictions four people died in a five day period on regional roads.

Commissioner Weir said "Many of us haven't driven long distances for months. Our skills have deteriorated and there's going to be an enormous amount of traffic as people escape the city and head to regional Victoria.

"Please, help us make this time memorable for all the right reasons and don't become an unnecessary statistic."



"Ovens & Murray AgBiz Alliance has received this funding to deliver events that bring people together who are involved in agriculture," she said.



## The enemy can come in various guises By Honor Auchinleck

Change and challenge or challenge and change has been the common theme ever since the first Remembrance Day on November 11, 1919 which commemorated the first year after the guns fell silent on the Western Front.

Since that date, changing circumstances have had different impacts on the way Remembrance is commemorated. The post WWI influenza pandemic and the Wall Street crash were followed by the austerity of the 1930s and the polio epidemic in the late 1930s.

The challenges of WWII and subsequent conflicts in Korea, Vietnam, the Balkans, the Gulf, Iraq, Afghanistan, East Timor and other hot spots in which Australian Defence personnel have served have added more conflicts to the list of those we remember. Each generation brings its own poignant memories to Remembrance.

I recall a Remembrance Sunday 1989 Service at the Commonwealth War Graves Cemetery for fallen soldiers and prisoners of war at Becklingen on the Lüneburger Heide in Germany. That year Remembrance Day fell a day after my husband Mark and I had seen that the guard towers were empty on the border or 'fence' between the two Germanys.

Although we had just moved to Fallingbostel between Hannover and Hamburg in North West Germany, we sensed that change was coming quickly. Many of us were concerned there would be reprisals against those attempting to bring the Berlin Wall down.

As the bugler played The Last Post and The Reveille and the Scottish piper played Flowers of the Forest, on the road outside the cemetery there were steady streams of little East German cars or 'trabbis'. A week earlier journeys into West Germany would have been unthinkable.

Standing close to me at the service was a German couple we'd known many years earlier when Mark was serving with the Commanders'in-Chief Mission to the Soviet Forces in Germany. Silent tears were trickling down their cheeks - clearly they had never thought they would live to see the day when Germany would begin to reunify. Reunification Day or Vereinigungs Tag came less than a year later on October 3, 1990.

Meanwhile other events intervened.

On August 2, 1990 Saddam Hussein's forces invaded Kuwait and Mark and his Regiment began to prepare for departure to Al Jubayl in Saudi Arabia.

On German Reunification Day I wrote telling my mother Elyne: 'Early on Sunday morning Mark and I took the kids out to see the tanks being loaded onto tank transporters which were then to take them to Bremerhaven. It was pouring with rain but it all seemed to work like clockwork and within no time at all it seemed the tanks were flying out of the barracks gates.' Later the pipers had piped the tanks onto the ships.

After Mark's departure in October for al Jubayl and in the weeks leading up to Remembrance Day 1990, I recall thinking about my father Tom as he would have experienced and understood the uncertainties in war we were experiencing. For the last seven months of 1941 leading up to the fall of Singapore on February 15, 1942 Tom served in the headquarters 8th Division AIF in Malava.

Being a lone parent with Mark away I was

busy but as I was living in Germany with our children, I was concerned with local developments. By Christmas 1990, I was wondering what was done about disarmament in the Eastern Bloc and where we would next see Kalashikov assault rifles? I didn't have to wait long for an answer.

Three years later Mark was serving with the United Nations in Bosnia and eight years later he would return to Sarajevo to serve as Chief of Current Operations with the NATO-led Stabilisation Force.

Rather than bringing peace, the fall of the Iron Curtain lit fuses in other trouble spots. Risks of terror attacks were increasing, culminating with 9/11 in New York and continuing through the following decades with the 2003 Bali bombing and countless other attacks. Heightened security was becoming a feature of many commemorations.

It has taken me years to distill memories of some of the landmark events in our lives and to incorporate them in a rich tapestry of personal remembrance. In the last two years we have all had our challenges with the summer 2020 bushfires and Covid with its lockdowns, restrictions, border closures and the loneliness that isolation from loved ones has imposed on so many of us. We've all had to adapt to cope and support our families and communities.

#### Notice of 1080 Baiting Programs on **National Parks Estate**

As a neighbour to Bogandyera Nature Reserve, Clarkes Hill Nature Reserve, Jingellic Nature Reserve and/or Kosciuszko National Park, the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) advises that NPWS will be continuing to undertake ongoing 1080 baiting programs in all of these reserves from November 12, 2021 until May 12, 2022. These ongoing programs will include the use of both baits and canid pest ejectors that contain 1080 poison.

As a component of the ongoing program aerial baiting involving the deployment of 1080 wild dog baits, this is planned to occur within these reserves. Should the weather postpone this operation, it will be undertaken on a suitable day

Please be aware that 1080 baits and ejectors are particularly lethal to domestic dogs and cats and as such you must ensure that pets and working dogs do not enter these reserves. In the event of accidental poisoning seek immediate veterinary

These activities are aimed at controlling wild dogs and foxes in accordance with the Upper Murray Wild Dog Management Plan and are being undertaken in conjunction with other stakeholders of the Upper Murray Wild Dog Working Group.

#### **Treatment prevents severe cases**

Wodonga (AWH) announced the commencement of the newly formed Covid Day Centre at Albury Base Hospital, which will provide Sotrovimab infusions.

Sotrovimab is intravenous treatment which significantly reduces the need for hospitalisation in Covidpositive people at risk of developing a severe infection.

Speaking on the singledose antibody treatment, AWH's Infectious Diseases Physician, Dr Justin Jackson, explained that Sotrovimab mimics the natural antibodies produced by our immune systems when defending itself against Covid-19.

has from entering host cells," he explained. "This is an important new weapon in our fight to protect people who have poor immune systems

and become infected with Covid from developing severe disease." First approved by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) in August this year, an initial 30,000 doses are being

ordered by the Australian government. "Sotrovimab administered to Covidpositive patients early in the illness - within five days of symptom onset," Dr Jackson explained. "It is extremely

#### important to identify people early in the course of infection because that is when the virus is most active and when we have the greatest chance of preventing progression to an inflammatory response,

lung damage and the need

for hospital admission."

The medication is only available to those who are not likely to have their own antibodies to fight infection and are at high risk of progression to severe disease. This includes those who are immuno-suppressed or who are not vaccinated or

only partially vaccinated.

The AWH Covid Community Program assesses patients for eligibility via phone consultation. Important risk factors include being overweight, over 55 years of age, having diabetes, kidney disease, organ transplants or being on immuno-suppressive medication.

As the treatment needs to be administered through an intravenous (IV) infusion, AWH has created a dedicated area where patients receive the Sotrovimab infusions.

To date community members have had access to the treatment which takes approximately two hours, allowing for 30 minutes of infusion therapy and 60 minutes of post-infusion observation.
