Charity ramps up services

A local food pantry provider for needy and disadvantaged people is now able to offer more support services now that it has found a permanent home.

Corryong FoodShare Services began operations in 1995 as Corryong Food Pantry and was located at various sites before undergoing a name change and relocating to the former Scout Hall in Donaldson Street in 2005.

Following reformation of the 1st Corryong Scout Group in 2019 FoodShare was on the hunt for a new home once again.

After a number of stebacks including additional site works and bad weather, it relocated to the former Girl Guides' block in Harris Street and eventually installed a transportable building on the property.

The 'Commander' building was donated by the community of Villers-Bretonneux in France after the 2019-20 Black Summer Bushfires. The project also received funding from the Rotary Club of Albury (\$50,000) and the

Australian government's Stronger Communities Program (\$15,000) to fit it out the premises including upgrading of the existing equipment and installation of larger commercial refrigeration and freezer units (some donated) and stainless steel kitchen equipment and stock shelving. Other support was provided by Border Trust and the Towong Shire Council and Indigo Power.

The new FoodShare premises now feature six cold storage food appliances, offices and amenities including a kitchen and meal area for volunteers.

FoodShare has been fully operating from the new building for two weeks and has a complement of around 10 volunteers.

"We are receiving deliveries every fortnight to provide pantry services for our 130 clients," said FoodShare co-ordinator, Rev Carol Allen.

"Since the 2019-20 bushfires and pandemic lockdowns our client numbers have increased



by 350 per cent and remained around those levels following the increases in the cost of living in recent times" she said.

"The new premises allow us to stock more supplies to cope with this extra demand."

More office space also allows the premises to be shared by other agencies including financial counselling services from Anglicare and Upper Murray Family Care and housing and other assistance from the Salvos.



Heed the 'Call of the High Country'

The Man From Snowy River Bush Festival Elyne Mitchell Photo Story Awards hopes that you will find great pleasure in creating your entries for the 2024 Awards.

This year's theme is 'The Call of the High Country'. Entries open on 1 December, 2023.

Elyne was a great admirer of A B ('Banjo') Paterson. As she was the inaugural Patron of the Bush Festival, it seems fitting that we use a theme that complements both Elyne's and Banjo's legacies.

Paterson and Elyne Mitchell were among many writers, artists and photographers who heard and many who continue to hear, 'The Call of the High Country'. The Man from Snowy River Bush Festival proudly promotes High Country writers, poets, artists and sculptors in the event's Art and Photography Exhibition.

Elyne Mitchell only wrote one anthology of photo stories - A Vision of the Snowy Mountains (1988). She enjoyed the experience so much that she regretted not having started writing photo stories earlier in her long writing life. She loved the inspirational interplay between her photography and her writing and she was always keen to inspire enthusiastic like-minded people.

We hope that you will take a photograph that inspires you to write about your interpretation of 'The Call of the High Country' and what it means to you. The Photo Story Awards invites you to summon up your creative energies and take a step into the bush-covered hills and mountains. Remember the person who climbs the highest, sees farthest...on a good day! 'The Call of the

High Country' suggests venturing into the unknown and gaining new perspectives of the surrounding world. The theme promises something different, something out of the ordinary and perhaps even something mysterious, thrilling or even a bit scary. Or perhaps like Elyne you

want to find wildflowers among twisted snow gums or mountain streams and waterfalls or to hear the song of the birds and of the wind weaving around the hills.

letting imagination run free, please remember the awards' judges. They are the most discerning part of your audience and will be looking at the quality of the composition of your photo(s) and for originality and perceptive qualities in your writing. They will be looking for attention to detail and grammatical accuracy. Please remember that your photograph should be eye-catching and that the photograph and your written component should complement each other. It is important to avoid distressing your viewers with your entry or entries.

You don't have to climb Mt Kosciuszko!

You might just choose some high ground close to your home as your High Country. Remember if you are venturing into new country make sure you do your research about the

local conditions. Check the weather. Make sure you are wearing adequate clothing and have sufficient food and drink. Most importantly, ensure that someone else knows where you are going and when to expect you to return. It is always best to go bushwalking with a friend or friends.

There have been

enquiries about whether entrants can use inspiration from their artwork in their photo stories. Art is a wonderful form of inspiration for writing. Entrants may photograph their artwork and write their entries from the photograph. It can then be copied and pasted into the entry above the writing component.

Ensure you use a high resolution photograph. The photograph and the written component must be the entrant's own work. If they want to submit an entry inspired by someone else's artwork, for example a sculpture, the entrant

must photograph the work and acknowledge the artist or sculptor.

The written component can also be presented as poetry. Do not submit other people's work claiming it as your own, even if someone has given you permission to do so. Please remember the awards are about you and your work.

The Photo Story Awards has two categories - one for juniors under eighteen and the senior category for those over 18 years of age.

You may find that over the next few months you might create a number of potential entries. You can submit up to five pieces, so choose your photo stories carefully and submit before entries close towards the end of February 2024.

Keep an eye on The Man from Snowy River Bush Festival website for confirmation of the closing date for entry and for notification of the receipt of your entry.

The Photo Story Awards took off after the 2020 Black Summer bushfires and pandemic. For some people creating photo stories became a hobby that brought great pleasure.



Local pools prepare to open

Community pools in the Towong and Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) areas will open to the general public for the 2023 swim season in coming weeks.

Pools at Khancoban, Batlow and Tumbarumba will be open from this Saturday, 11 November.

SVC Director of Infrastructure and Works, Duncan Mitchell, said recruiting qualified pool supervisors and lifeguards had been challenging again this year and there had been some early concerns that the Batlow Pool may not have been able to open as planned.

All five of the SVC pools have seen extensive upgrades over the last few years thanks to government funding, including new and improved swimming and water play facilities for younger children, solar and blankets to aid water

temperature regulation, new shaded and entry areas and accessible amenities.

Pool fees have been reintroduced for the season several different with options available including daily admissions, family day tickets, single, family, and concession season passes, and after-hours access.

Enthusiastic swimmers can also apply to council for annual passes and after-hour access cards that can be utilised across all council pools during opening hours.

The Khancoban pool will be open for the season from 1pm-6pm.

The Corryong and Tallangatta swimming pools are scheduled to for the summer open

season on Saturday, 18 November.

Operating hours for both locations will be:

• Weekdays: 3:30 pm -7:00 pm

• Weekends: 2:00 pm -7:00 pm.

In response community requests, extended hours will also be trialled during the peak Christmas and New Year period. From 20 December to 8 January operating hours for week days and weekends will be 9am - 12 pm and 2pm - 7

If council receives sufficient suppor during this trial period, it will extend the hours to better serve the community.




