## Tilley talks big bucks for roads

Potholes and crumbling pavement are putting motorists lives at risk and the Upper Murray is a prime example, according to the Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley.

As part of their election policy the Liberal Nationals have pledged \$10 billion over the next decade to a statewide road maintenance blitz.

Under the plan, the current annual road asset management budget will be increased from around \$600 million to \$1 billion per annum.

"This includes investing \$10 billion over the coming 10 years in road maintenance funding, delivering longer-term contracts to promote innovation and give contractors certainty to invest in better equipment," Mr Tilley said.

"The state of the roads is only second to health in the minds of people in the electorate.

"We all drive these roads, we know how bad they are.

"There are points on the Murray Valley Highway at the bottom of Keelangie Hill where you have to slow to 40km for a massive hole.

"The flat section of the Shelley-Walwa road is a hotch-potch of fixes that get washed away very time it rains.

"Look at the Up River and Gooramadda roads near Rutherglen, the temporary fixes on the Beechworth-Chiltern Road - it's a disgrace.

"I've even had people who have lost control after hitting potholes on the Hume Freeway near Wodonga," Mr Tilley added.

"Labor cut the road maintenance budget by 10 per cent when it came to government and our roads have never recovered.

"In 2017, the Auditor-General warned the Labor government of the



poor state of Victorian roads and the lack of accountability for funding but they have cut a further \$200 million over the past two budgets."

Mr Tilley said safe

roads save lives and money on costly repairs.

"Roads budget cuts have never made sense as we watch our road network fall into a state of disrepair," he said.

"The Labor government has neglected Victoria's road network, ignoring the genuine concern of road users across the state, in both the city and the country."

## Summit centres on our region

More than 60 Visitor Information Centre (VIC) staff and volunteers from across the North East were welcomed to Corryong on Tuesday for the annual High Country VIC Summit.

The visitors participated in familiarisation tours running across the Upper Murray followed by lunch with guest speakers Chris Mirams, Ian Cesa and David Paine.

The unique offerings of the Towong Shire were on full display with more than 25 businesses and community organisations promoting their goods and

services throughout the day.

Towong Shire Council mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead, said that the event was the perfect opportunity to showcase our region and encouraged attendees to spread the word about the Upper Murray being an outstanding tourist destination.

"Bringing together information centre staff and volunteers at the summit was a great opportunity to share insights into the recovery of the tourism sector post-pandemic," he said.

"It also provides us with a great opportunity to showcase Towong Shire and all we have to offer.

"We thank all the businesses who were a part of making this event such a success!"

Participants left with plenty of reasons to return to Towong Shire including some incentivised vouchers provided by several local businesses.

The 2022 Summit was the first time the event had been held in three years due to the pandemic.

## Flooding expected

Emergency services are urging communities in northern Victoria to prepare for a significant flooding event as heavy rainfall is expected today and tomorrow.

The Bureau of Meteorology is forecasting peak rainfall totals of 60-100mm across much of Victoria.

Victorian State Emergency Service Chief Operations Officer, Tim Wiebusch, said residents need to plan travel according to the conditions and advised to avoid travelling today in particular, if possible and not to drive through floodwaters.



## Doors open to better education

Country Universities Centre Owens Murray's (CUC-OM) Corryong site was officially opened by the Federal Member for Indi, Helen Haines, last Friday.

The Corryong site is located at the Towong Shire's Corryong Innovation Space and has been designed with student requirements at the forefront.

High-speed internet, dual screen computers, bring-your-own device spaces, printing facilities are part of the CUC-OM space and students also have access to bookable quiet spaces for interactive lectures and online exams as well as kitchen facilities.

CUC-OM supports local students to study by distance at any Australian higher education provider and currently has more than 40 registered students who undertake courses at 18 different Australian universities and higher education providers in a multitude of courses including health, psychology, education.

Notably, 53 per cent of CUC-OM students are the first in their family to undertake higher education studies.

Director of Centre Operations at Country Universities Centre, Ashlee Jones said "The opening of a centre is an exciting time for communities and for CUC-OM it is the culmination of several years of dedication.

"We are grateful for the federal government's ongoing commitment through the Regional University Centres Program to tertiary education in regions.

"In conjunction with the support from the Commonwealth government and the Towong Shire, the site in Corryong provides an essential service to improve the futures of communities within the Upper Murray region."

The CUC concept is to provide students with better and equitable access to quality higher education so that they may remain in the local area, connected

with the community and contributing to a prosperous future for our region.

"We hope that a facility such as CUC encourages people to obtain university qualifications and stay in the region, therefore providing local businesses, schools, and health facilities with the qualified staff they so desperately need," commented CUC-OM Chair, Mr John Joyce.

Assistant Minister for Education, Senator Anthony Chisholm, said RUCs allow regional students to have the support of their family and community while studying at any Australian tertiary education provider.

"The Australian government knows how valuable it is that local students can benefit from the world-class services and infrastructure as they access a high-quality Australian tertiary

education," he said.

"Regional students are half as likely to get a higher education degree, compared with their citybased peers and should have the same opportunities when exploring options within higher education.

"This is why government is committed to ensuring that all Australians can access high quality education regardless of where they live.

"The centre also empowers school leavers and mature learners who are helping to address the skills shortage in regional Victoria through upskilling, which in turn will strengthen regional economies."

Local students are already experiencing what CUC-OM has to offer, with all three sites in Wangaratta, Mansfield and Corryong now open.

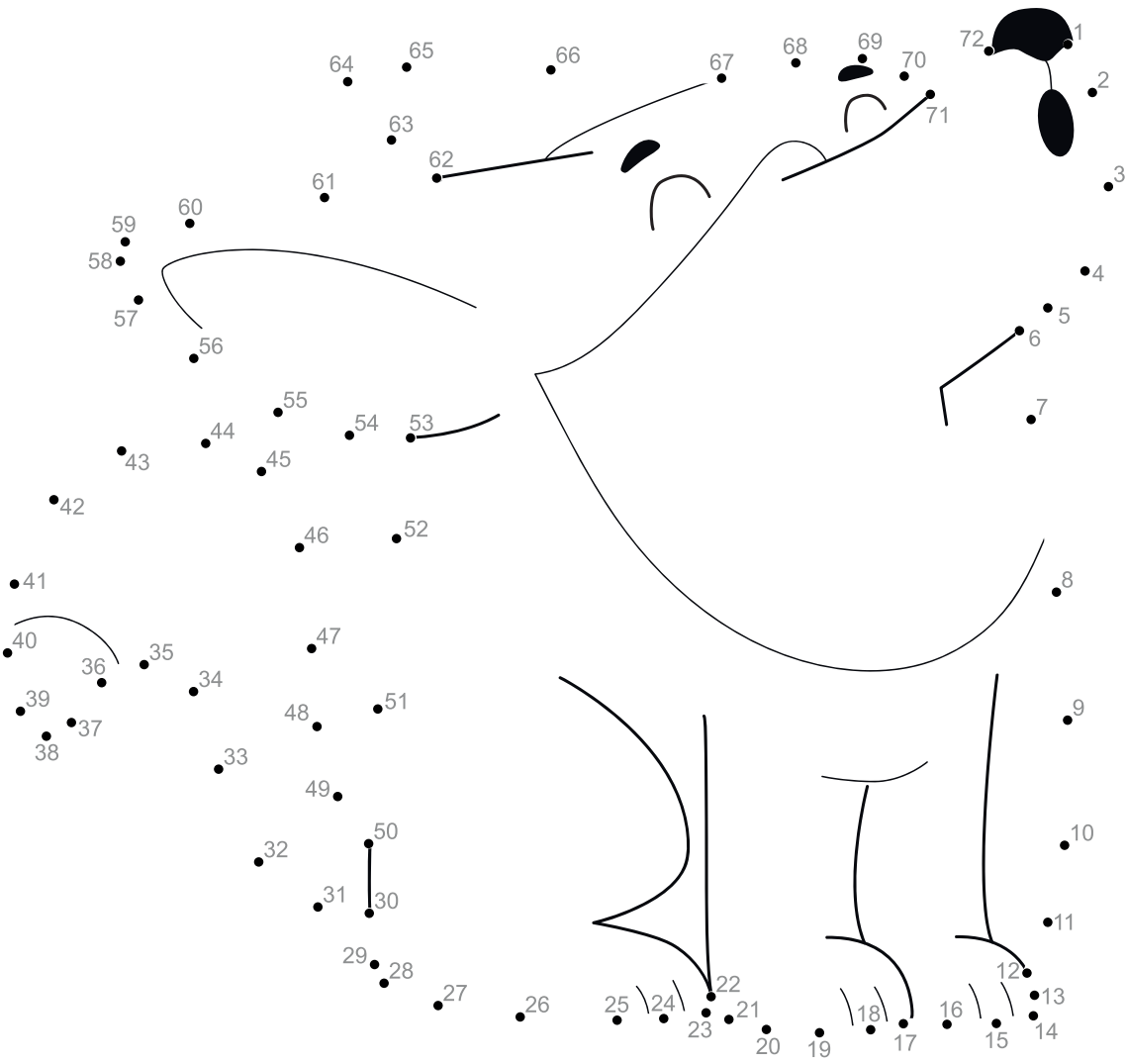

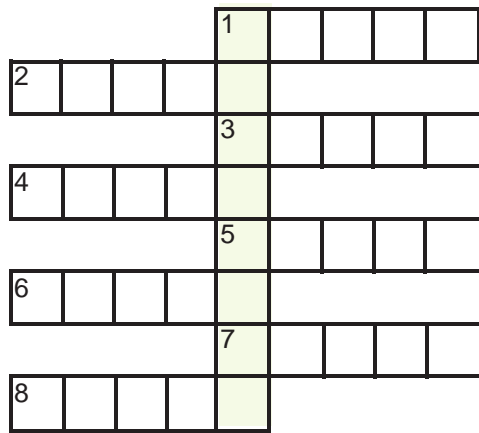

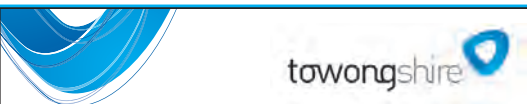

Despite Australia's economically challenging times, the National Ping Pong-a-Thon has raised \$270,509 to date and is on track to achieve the goal of \$400,000. The events all over Australia occur in garages, sports clubs, schools, business offices and churches - all with the common goal of saving one life at a time.

Numerous charities throughout South East Asia are the recipients of these funds. They continue their mission of supporting both

men and women caught in the illegal web of human slavery, with some groups focusing particularly on cyber crime while others establish businesses to teach skills and empower transition to paid work.

## Minister hears from councils

Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government, Catherine King, visited Indi recently, speaking with representatives of eight of the nine local councils, including Towong Shire, in a meeting organised by Federal Member for Indi, Helen Haines.

Minister King is responsible for multi-billion dollar infrastructure funding decisions and gave local government representatives in the North East insight into the development of the new government's first budget to be handed down in October.

"I met with Minister King early in this term of Parliament to make the case to her about the need for investment in our region," Dr Haines said.

"I was pleased that she accepted my invitation to meet with local councillors, and that we were able to have the meeting in the beautiful town of Bright.

"Local government plays a vital role in delivering infrastructure for our region and in regional development and roads, so it was crucial they were able to get this access to the Minister.

"When there is a new government with new processes and priorities, councils need to know how best to work with the government to achieve their goals and this meeting allowed councillors to get this insight."

Dr Haines said a major issue raised by council representatives was funding for roads.

"Particularly with the wet conditions we are experiencing, it is becoming more difficult for councils to keep up with maintenance of roads," she said.

"While the federal government has committed to Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program funding to councils for now, I want to see funding transparency and certainty for our councils in this

area so they can plan appropriately and keep our communities safe on the road."

Councillors and the Minister also discussed how major projects would be funded by the government, NBN and mobile phone funding and funding for local hospitals, including Albury Wodonga Health and Bright Hospital

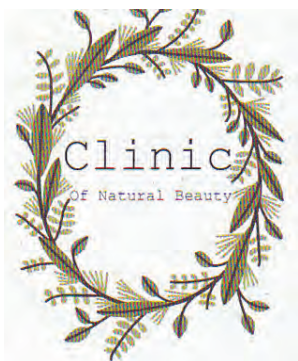

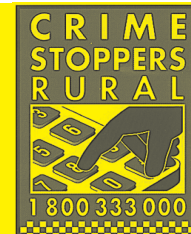
