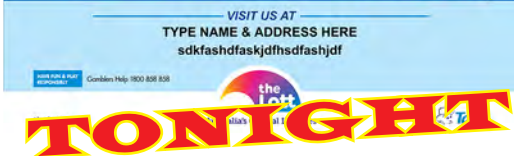
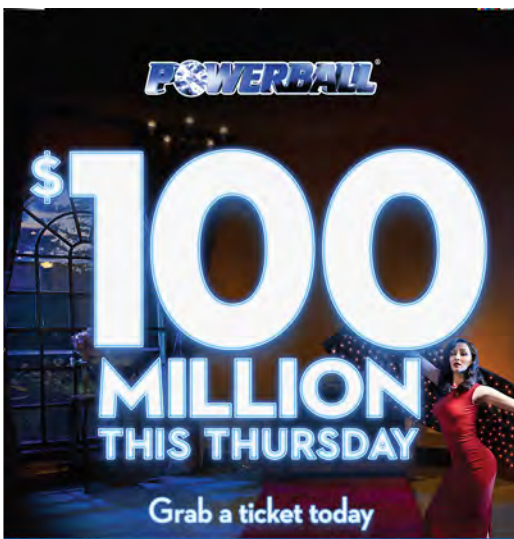

## Bridge works are running to schedule

Transport for NSW has advised that work on the new Towong Bridge is on track to be completed in mid-2023, weather permitting.

The onset of spring and warmer weather has seen an increase in momentum and progress of the new three-span bridge, following some challenges posed by cold temperatures, fog, flooding and variable river

levels during winter.

Transport for NSW and contractors Nelmac Pty Ltd, recently reached a significant milestone, completing the construction of 12 foundation piles each up to 15-metres in depth. They required installation of a steel casing 1.05-metres in diameter, followed by drilling out to the required depth, then installation of the steel reinforcing cage

and high strength concrete.

Focus on site has now shifted to construction of the reinforced concrete substructure elements, creating the platform for placing three spans of girders which will form the basis of the bridge deck slab.

Work is also being carried out away from the bridge site at Nelmac's concrete precast facility in Yackandandah to produce a total of 15 bridge girders. Each prestressed concrete girder spans up to 21-metres in length and weighs up to 30 tonnes.

The bridge girders will progressively be taken to site as the bridge substructure starts to take shape, with the initial span of five girders expected to be delivered prior to Christmas shutdown.

Work is also about to commence on the Victorian side of the Murray River.

This will involve the erection of a 20-metre-long steel and concrete retaining wall, needed in order to reinstate the eroded river bank.

In the new year, when the girders have been placed, crews will finish

work on cross beams connecting the girders together, pouring concrete deck slabs and kerbs, erecting steel safety barriers and carrying out roadwork to the bridge approaches.

In related news, motorists are advised of

changed traffic conditions on Batlow Road for safety improvement work to be carried out this month.

Vegetation at various locations between Jingellic and Gilmore will be removed or trimmed to provide a safer road for motorists.

Removing these hazards can reduce the risk of fatal and serious injuries from run-off road crashes.

Work will be carried out Monday to Friday between 7am to 6pm from Thursday 20 October and will take about four weeks

to complete, weather permitting.

Lane closures, traffic control and a reduced speed limit of 40 km/h will be in place.

Around 90 people braved wet and chilly weather to attend the recent Khancoban Long Lunch, a ticketed event hosted by Snowy Valleys Council (SVC).

Locals and visitors were treated to an afternoon of locally sourced food, drink and music in a relaxed and beautifully styled atmosphere.

Local business The Pickled Parrot catered the event, focusing on local and regional produce.

Diners indulged in a delicious array of

delicacies including Rockstock Deli's Wild Brumby gin-botanics smoked trout, Khancoban Kitchen's Major Clews rubbed lamb rump, Tallangatta locally grown lamb, Wangaratta pork, Corryong Bakery's slow cooked rolls, Obsession Wines' Tempranillo reduction, Wilgro Batlow's Pink Lady apples and Apple Thief Cider.

On offer at the bar was a curated selection of local products including beer and ginger beer from Tumut River Brewing Co., local wines from

Wondalma, Mount Tumarumba Vineyard, Courabyra Wines, Obsession Wines and Johansen Wines.

There was also local cider from Crafty Cider in Batlow and Elixir Gin distilled in Tumarumba by Ladbroken Distilling Co.

Justin Clancy, Member for Albury, welcomed diners with an opening speech and local artist Bethany Pike provided musical entertainment throughout the day.

An important aim of the event, as well as

highlighting local and regional produce, was to draw attendees from in and outside the Snowy Valleys region to Khancoban and drive tourism in the town following the 2019/20 bushfires.

The luncheon was popular with local people from across the region and

it also attracted visitors from Greater Hume, Narrandera, Albury, Hilltops and Wagga Wagga.

Council received a grant of \$27,000 from the Commonwealth government's Australian Trade and Investment Commission to host the event.

## Grant keeps the presses running

The Australian government has delivered a lifeline to newspapers across the country with the announcement of the outcomes of the Regional and Local Newspaper Publishers Program.

The *Corryong Courier* is one of 208 applicants which will receive a share of the \$15 million program, which forms part of the government's \$29 million local news and community broadcasting transition package.

Local newspapers are the backbone of so many regional communities right

across Australia, helping keep locals informed and connected.

One hundred and thirty-three grants were awarded to eligible regional publishers from the \$10 million available under Stream 1 and 78 eligible independent suburban, First Nations and multicultural publishers received a share of the \$5 million under Stream 2. Three applicants will receive funding under both streams 1 and 2.

The Minister for Communications, Michelle Rowland, said

"Local news is critical to so many communities across Australia.

"I'm proud to announce the recipients of the Regional and Local Newspaper Publishers Program to more than 200 publishers right across our nation."

The editor of the *Corryong Courier*, Mark Collins, said "This grant eases the financial pressure on small country newspapers such as ours and means we won't have to pass the increased cost of newsprint onto our advertisers and readers."

# First tunnel completed

Snowy Hydro is celebrating the completion of excavation for its first tunnel for Snowy 2.0, with the Lady Eileen Hudson tunnel boring machine (TBM) reaching the location of the new underground power station cavern.

The 11-metre diameter TBM has excavated 2.85km to create the main access tunnel at Lobs Hole in the Snowy Mountains, where a workforce of more than 2,200 people are building Snowy 2.0 - the 2,000 megawatt pumped hydro expansion of the mighty Snowy Scheme.

Snowy Hydro acting CEO, Roger Whitby, said the tunnelling achievement was a significant milestone, with Snowy 2.0 set to underpin the nation's transition to renewables.

"Snowy 2.0 will not only provide on-demand, quick-start generating capacity for the National Electricity Market (NEM), but a massive 350,000 gigawatt hours of energy storage," Mr Whitby said.

"This is our first new major tunnel excavation in decades, since construction of the original scheme and it gives us access to the site where we will create the enormous cavern 800m underground that will house our power station.

"The TBM Lady Eileen Hudson and our teams from Snowy Hydro

and contractor Future Generation Joint Venture have done a great job to complete this critical tunnelling task.

"However, there's no slowing down," Mr Whitby added.

"Work across the project continues to move ahead rapidly and this tunnel boring machine is now being dismantled so it can be moved to the Talbingo adit where it will be reassembled with some new components for excavation of the 6km tailrace tunnel."

While dismantling of the TBM conveyor belt gets underway in the main access tunnel, drill and blast activities are ongoing to excavate cross passages and tunnels to gain access to the power station complex, which

will include a 251m-long, 52m-high machine hall cavern and 223m-long, 46m-high transformer hall cavern.

The new work fronts associated with the powerhouse will create further employment opportunities on this clean energy mega-project.

The Snowy 2.0 project will link Tantangara Reservoir (top storage) with Talbingo Reservoir (bottom storage) through 27kms of tunnels and a power station with pumping capabilities.

This will enable water to be released for energy generation at times of peak demand and then pumped back to the top storage when there is excess renewable energy in the system, ready to generate again.

## Demerger response pursued

Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) has written to the NSW Minister for Local Government requesting that the previous recommendation of the Boundaries Commission to demerge the council be upheld.

SVC mayor, Cr Ian Chaffey, said he felt it was important to let the community know where the demerge process was up to.

"Following the Minister's decision to allow Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council to de-merge,

council voted to also pursue a demerger and we wrote to Minister Tuckerman announcing our intention to put forward a business case," he explained.

"At our September meeting a further motion was passed to write again to the Minister Tuckerman requesting that she uphold the previous decision of the Boundaries Commission, which voted 3-1 in support of a Snowy Valleys Council demerger.

"Councillors agreed that not having to put

together a new business case would reduce the financial burden and any further risk to the emotional health of the Snowy Valleys community."

Cr Chaffey says he has plans to meet in person with the minister next week and has also spoken with local MPs Justin Clancy and Dr Joe McGirr seeking their endorsement.

"I look forward to following up on our letter to Minister Tuckerman in person and speaking with her directly regarding our request," Cr Chaffey said.

## Justice will be served

Derryn Hinch says his candidates' strong advocacy record and experience will be key to the campaign prospects of the party he leads in the November 26 state election.

The former senator will stand for the Legislative Council South-Eastern Metropolitan region with running partner, Mohit Dweivedi.

He said his Derryn Hinch's Justice Party had also re-endorsed MPs Tania Maxwell and Stuart Grimley, first elected in 2018, to re-contest the Legislative Council regions of Northern Victoria and Western Victoria, respectively.

Strong running mates John Herron will support Ms Maxwell in Northern Victoria and Simone O'Brien will support Mr Grimley in Western Victoria.

Mr Herron, a Navy veteran from Riddells Creek, is an experienced lawyer with a Gisborne and Kyneton practice and father of Courtney Herron, who was murdered in 2019 in a vicious attack in Melbourne's Royal Park by a perpetrator later found not guilty because of mental impairment.

Ms Maxwell said she had worked hard to improve safety and justice for Victorians in the past

four years by challenging Labor legislation and the adequacy and fairness of government infrastructure and services funding in regional communities.

A Parliamentary Budget Office costing prepared for Derryn Hinch's Justice Party shows 2022-23 investment in regional Victoria falls almost 20 per cent short of the government funding committed to metropolitan Melbourne projects and services.

"My approach to government policy and doing business in Parliament has been shaped by my experience as a victim-survivor of sexual violence, my background in youth work and an earlier career in remote mining communities," Ms Maxwell said.

"I have also been involved in the 'Enough is

enough' community safety campaign in the North East that I helped to lead in 2016.

"To put it simply, I have fought for fair, just safe communities for the past four years. I reiterate these goals constantly in everything that we do, every working day, not only for victims of crime but for people in all parts of my enormous electorate.

"Derryn Hinch's Justice Party MPs tend to call it as we see it.

"It's hard work to tackle the tough issues, the issues so often on the margins and deliver what's fair, just and safe for the people and communities we represent.

"We're making gains to deliver effective support for victims of crime, and equality and fairness for female firefighters."
