## Radio station ramps up

Seventeen community organisations across Victoria will share in bushfire recovery grants to build, upgrade or repair important local facilities.

Minister for Emergency Services, Jaclyn Symes, joined Memberfor Eastern

Victoria, Tom McIntosh, to announce the latest recipients to share in more than \$660,000 in Bushfire Recovery Grants for Community Facilities, delivered by Bushfire Recovery Victoria.

The successful projects

will improve facilities at community halls and encourage community connection through new and improved sporting areas and gardens.

In the North East, the volunteer-run Upper Murray Community Radio Inc will receive \$29,000 to co-locate the community radio station with the local community hall.

“Community radio stations play a vital role broadcasting emergency information and connecting communities before, during and after emergencies,” Ms Symes said.

The project includes refurbishment works at the Walwa Memorial Hall and expanding coverage across the district.

“We have listened to local communities about projects that are important to them and we are investing in communities so they can build resilience for future emergencies,” Ms Symes said.

# Royal memories recalled

The death of Queen Elizabeth II last week has revived recollections of royal connections for several residents of Mt Mittamatite Lodge aged care facility.

An Englishman and a Royalist his whole life, former Tintalra Hotel owner, Alf Wilson was absolutely devastated when he heard of Queen Elizabeth's passing.

"My wife called me in the morning to tell me the Queen had died and I just

blubbered," he said.

Alf (86) never actually met the Queen but he did come within 20 feet of her while enlisted in the British Army during the 1960s.

Alf was in the 44th Heavy Anti-aircraft Artillery and the Queen was doing the rank and file and he was close enough to see her.

"I love the Queen, I swore allegiance to her twice," he said.

"It was her presence and the fact that she was

a lovely lady and always smiling.

"She was just an absolute treasure."

A decade earlier, on the other side of the world, a young Keith Owen saddled up his best horse for an occasion that had captured the entire nation.

Keith and a young friend rode from Surrey Hills in Melbourne to Kooyong to see the young Queen Elizabeth on her first visit to Australia - the first visit by any reigning monarch.

Faced with huge crowds, Keith (94) said they had a very good view from horseback.

"We dared not push through the crowds and annoy the police, we just used the better elevation we had on the horses to get a good view," he said.

"We thought very kind thoughts of her, she was our future. We were very impressed with her, she was a lovely looking girl and charming to the crowd."

If there was anyone with a front-row seat to Royalty, it was 83-year-old Jim Guttridge.

Jim was a mechanic, and in 1963 he recalls being employed to look after the Queen's five Rolls Royce vehicles, with one kept in each of the state capitals.

He was tasked with keeping them in tip top shape for whenever they were needed.

Although he never met Her Majesty, he did meet her husband, Prince Phillip, the Duke of Edinburgh.

"He was very good to me, he encouraged me to keep working and keep trying," Jim said.

"We were driving in the car and then we got out and had a walk."

Jim says he doesn't remember how but he knew a lot about Rolls Royces.

"They were a beautiful car, mainly the beautiful body but the engine was the same as all cars."

They didn't know each other then but two of Mittamatite Lodge's residents - Joyce Moloney (92) and Olive Button (98) - were both among the huge crowds that lined the streets of Wagga in February 1954.

The Queen was in Australia to thank the nation for its support during WWII and to the delight of thousands headed into the regions.

She and her husband spent two and half hours in Wagga in what has become remembered as the most important day in the town, ever.

"We saw her walk," Joyce said.

"Everyone lined up along the road to see her. We couldn't get a good look but we did catch a glimpse.

"We all took food and everyone was eating out of

picnic baskets while they waited."

Olive, who is two years older than the Queen, said that day was "a very long time ago."

"All the school kids were lined up and I remember she looked lovely," she recalled.

And while 101-year-old Vera Bailey recalls seeing the Queen on her visit to the Upper Murray and the Snowy Hydro Scheme, it was on February 18, 2020 that she received a letter, celebrating her 100th birthday.

"Someone said I'd be getting a letter from the Queen and I said 'I'll just have to wait and see' and I did!" Vera said proudly.

The letter arrived in the mailbox. Her Majesty didn't ask for a response, nor did she receive one but Vera was delighted.

"I thought 'fancy me getting a letter from the Queen'," she said.

"I felt very sad when she passed away because I felt I had some connection to her.

"She was a wonderful lady who had people's concerns at heart.

"She was a person who cared, a very gently lady, very modest and she wasn't seeking any fuss."

As for King Charles III, Alf says he likes him.

"He's a 'good lad' and will make a good king. He's learned a lot," he said.

# Detector prevents disaster

The occupants of a Cudgewa North house escaped injury or worse last Friday morning thanks to a smoke alarm that alerted them that the residence was on fire.

The incident occurred at around 7am at a house on the Cudgewa North Road. A man sleeping in the house was woken by

the alarm and vacated the building along with his young child.

Corryong CFA member, Ron Pynappels, spotted smoke from the fire while on his bus run and diverted to the property where he helped the tenant battle the blaze with a garden hose while waiting for CFA units.

Two fire appliances from Corryong and the Cudgewa and Tintaldra trucks arrived to find the lounge room of the weatherboard house well alight but quickly extinguished the fire. The room and ceiling were badly damaged.

An electrical fault in the lounge room was identified as the cause of the blaze.



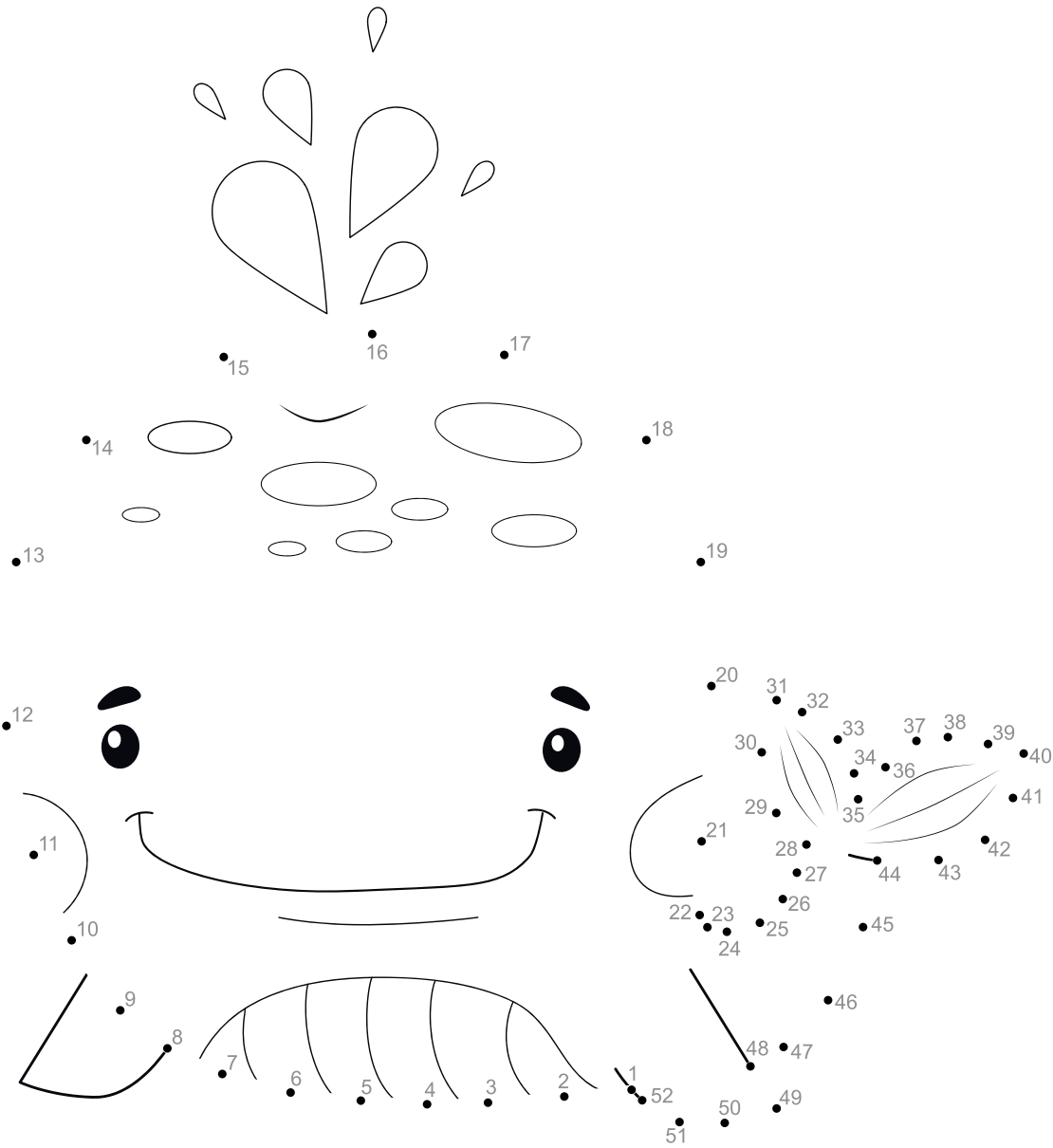

## Roy boy wasn't worried about royalty

When the late Queen Elizabeth II attended a VFL match at the MCG in 1970 many of the players were awestruck in her presence but not so Fitzroy player, Daryl Herrod.

The former Federal Football Club player was more interested in winning the game against reigning premiers Richmond than meeting the royal party of Her Majesty, Prince Phillip, Princess Anne and Prince Charles at half time. In a 2007 interview with the *Herald Sun* about the historic day Herrod said "We were told to clean up but I said 'Bugger that, I'm not worried about royalty, I want to win the bloody game'. I had a dirty old bandage on the hand I shook with.

Herrod was a product of the Assumption College football factory and played seven games with Geelong before transferring to the Lions where he added another 47.

One of his Fitzroy teammates was Bill Sykes, the former Nationals politician who represented the seat of Benalla in the Victorian parliament from 2002 to 2014.

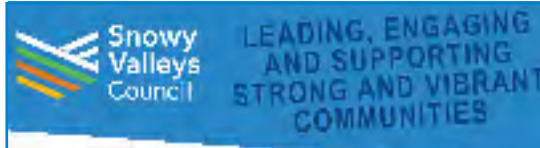

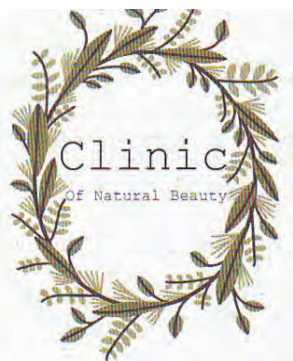

## Roos rule the roost

Tumbarumba reinforced why it is the Champion Club in the Upper Murray league for 2022 by winning the senior football and A grade netball premierships on Saturday, both victories coming against Cudgewa.

Despite the threatening weather, a large crowd of

mainly partisan supporters cheered the Roos on to their first football flag since going back-to-back in 2012 and 2013.

The key to a win was always going to be which forward line functioned the best and the Roos sent Quinn Rooney to

Kylin Morey who was returning from injury and Isaac Lampe lined up on league goalkicking winner Nick Brockley, who was noticeably hampered by an ankle injury as the game went on.

At the other end, the Blues were relying on Kade Small and Darcy McKimmie to put the clamps on the Roos' sharpshooting trio of Dan Hitchens, Tyler Lampe and James Crozier with support from Jack and James McNerney.

The decided favourites flew the gates from the first bounce but Hitchens set the tone for his day by missing a relatively easy shot.

Soon afterwards, play was stopped for a couple of minutes when Henry Waters was cleaned up with a heavy bump and left



the field.

Cudgewa's Michael Voigt then scored the first goal with a clever snap against the run of play.

The Roos got back on track with Jacob Read controlling the ruck and then setting up as a midfielder and eventually Tyler Lampe kicked their first goal around the 10 minute mark, courtesy of a 50m penalty. He then followed up with another major to give his team some breathing space.

Waters came back on, giving the Roos a lift but Hitchens missed another chance before atoning late in the quarter with another major.

The Roos ball use was much cleaner than the Blues who were more prone to kicking off the ground and trying to make it a scrap with captain Jim Waters, Mitch Palmer and Connor leading the way.

Tyler Lampe goaled in the first minute of the second term and then Preston Hussell marked strongly and hit up Henry

Waters who goaled much to the delight of the large crowd.

Read, the best-on-ground medal recipient, was giving his on-ballsers some silver service at the stoppages and they were taking full advantage to pump the ball forward. It was becoming evident that the Blues defenders were being stretched by the Roos three-pronged attack and Crozier sent through their third consecutive goal and a blowout looked on the cards.

However, Cudgewa started to get more of the ball halfway through the quarter with Craig Lieschke, Mitch Pynappels and Darcy McKimmie creating opportunities and although their delivery was still haphazard, Jake Vinge and Morey goaled late in the term to reduce the margin to 22 points at the long break.

The Roos opened the quarter as they started the match including Hitchens missing from in front but Crozier made up for that

with a breakaway goal. Just as the floodgates seemed about to open again as the rain set in, the Blues applied the blowtorch with some physicality and hard nut Luke Bloom was ruffling a few feathers.

Morey then stepped up and stemmed the flow with a clever goal and followed up minutes later by beating three opponents and getting a 50m penalty to goal. The elusive forward then grabbed the Sherrin out of a ruck contest on the forward flank and snapped successfully from the 50m arc. Read had a shot that hit the post and on the rebound Brockley swooped on a loose ball to post his only major for the day to get the Blues within 10 points.

At this stage the Roos would have had memories of Cudgewa's late charge in the second semi final to get within eight points at the finish.

However, the Blues proceeded to turn the ball over in attack and two

quick passes later Lampe had the ball in his hands, dodged two defenders and kicked truly to halt the assault.

Cudgewa attempted to rally once more at the start of the final quarter but the first major went to Jim Waters who led with his head to win a free kick 20 metres out. Play see-sawed as the showers set in and Hitchens missed another shot on goal but redeemed himself a minute later, booting a major off the deck at the 20 minute mark to extinguish the Blues' hopes.

As time expired, Crozier ran onto a loose pill to post a six-pointer followed almost immediately by another to Lampe who then crowned a great game with his sixth goal after a team mate stumbled 10 metres out to spill the ball into his path.

In the blink of an eye the Roos were out to a six goal margin just as the siren sounded and the celebrations began.
