Haines slams housing call

Independent Federal Member for Indi Helen Haines has criticised the Labor government and the Coalition, after the major parties voted down her amendments to the Housing Australia Future Fund (HAFF) Bill moved by Senator David Pocock in the Senate on Dr Haines' behalf last on Wednesday.

"The housing crisis is the biggest issue facing regional Australia yet it is a complete blind spot for this government," Dr Haines said.

"Almost one in three Australians live outside the big cities, yet I

constantly have to remind this government about how the housing crisis is impacting people in regional, rural and remote communities."

Dr Haines said that the proposed amendments would have ensured the housing needs of people in regional Australia are clearly considered and required reviews of the fund's spending are in place to consider the extent to which the new laws meet those needs.

"Regional communities will continue to be overlooked unless laws recognise our specific

needs and agencies are required to be transparent about how money is distributed to meet those needs," she explained.

"Without these amendments there is no guarantee that the billions of dollars announced for housing will flow to regional Australia, and the communities where it is needed most."

Dr Haines had been working closely with Housing Minister Julie Collins and met with Prime Minister Anthony Albanese to speak about the need for the government's signature

housing policy to expressly include regional, rural and remote Australia.

"I went to the government in good faith, I worked constructively with them but it's clear they have no idea that addressing the housing crisis in regional Australia is different to addressing housing issues in the major cities," she said.

"I am shocked National and Liberal Senators from the regions did not back in this amendment."

"They need to explain why they voted against the interests of their constituents."

Voice vote helpers wanted

With the referendum confirmed for Saturday October 14th, the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) is looking for 30 people across the Indi region including Corryong, to provide their community the opportunity to vote locally.

During the referendum period, the AEC will become one of the nation's largest employers with 100,000 roles spanning a single day through to several weeks of work around voting day.

Street works get back on track

After a number of hiccups, work on the Corryong streetscape project resumed on Monday after a three-week delay.

“Recent weather events, contractor availability challenges and the necessity to provide additional design details to VicRoads have caused delays in the project’s proposed schedule,” said Towong Shire mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead.

“Despite these setbacks, we remain fully committed to delivering a streetscape that the Corryong community can be proud of.

“We are actively working to minimise further delays and expedite the construction process wherever possible. We constantly communicate with our contractors and VicRoads to ensure the project progresses as smoothly as possible.

We’ll be working closely with contractors and businesses to ensure that inconveniences to all users are minimised during works.

“The project’s scope is extensive, encompassing numerous enhancements that will significantly improve the quality of life in our town.”



The improvements include:-

- **Enhanced Safety:** The redesigned streetscape will prioritise pedestrian and cyclist safety, creating a welcoming and secure environment for everyone.

- **Economic Growth:** The revitalised streetscape will attract businesses and visitors, stimulating economic growth and job opportunities within the community.

- **Amenity and Liveability:** The project will enhance the overall appearance of Corryong, making it a more attractive

and vibrant place to live, work and visit.

Cr Whitehead has reassured the community council is doing its best to deliver the project.

“We anticipate that meeting the project completion deadline before Christmas is unlikely,” he conceded.

“Consequently, we are collaborating with the Corryong Business Network (CBN) to formulate a strategy to minimise disruptions during the bustling summer season.

“While we

acknowledge the inconvenience these

delays may have caused, it’s important to emphasise that the project is a vital initiative to transform our community’s heart and create lasting benefits for everyone who calls this place home.

“Once again, we ask for the community’s continued patience and support as we navigate these challenges together.”

Council staff and the project manager met with CBN members last night to discuss a strategy for the ongoing works.

People are required right across the country to help deliver the referendum but particularly in parts of Indi where historically it has been challenging to recruit the required number of workers.

AEC State Manager, Nye Coffey, who oversees the operations in Victoria said now that the referendum date has been confirmed, he’s hoping people will get involved in helping to deliver the first referendum in 24 years.

“This is a chance for people to earn some extra money, help deliver the vote for the community and be a part of the first referendum this century,” he said.

“There are a few specific areas that we urgently need people to work with us.

“If we can’t recruit people locally, we’re hoping people from neighbouring towns may consider travelling a short distance to help give all Victorian communities the opportunity to vote locally,” he said.

The areas in need include Corryong and the Murrindindi and Alpine Shires.

Mr Nye said they are looking for staff who are good with people, have an eye for detail and most importantly, they need to be political and issue neutral.

“No previous election work experience is necessary and full training is provided,” he said.

“You do need to be able to take an impartial and neutral approach to your work. In keeping with the AEC’s commitment to integrity, it’s absolutely essential that people working on the referendum are able to remain impartial on the issue.”

On a two-day visit to the Upper Murray this week, the Minister for Emergency Services and Attorney General, Jaclyn Symes, said that she was impressed with the progress the Upper Murray community had made with its recovery from the 2019/2020 Black Summer bushfires.

The Member for Northern Victoria inspected various works at Cudgewa including the new community playground, the Avenue of Honour at Tintaldra and several projects in Corryong including the golf course and Memorial Hall during her visit.

“I spoke to members of the various recovery committees and it was evident that their dedication and commitment had resulted in many projects coming to fruition,” Minister Symes said.

“The sense I got was that the recovery committees have done a magnificent job and it may be time to wind them down.

“However, there is sustained interest by communities in still having some sort of group to build on the work done so far.”

Extending the region's vision

In the third and last instalment, Upper Murray Incorporated (UMI) is championing innovation opportunities to develop the region.

Post bushfire recovery, agriculture remains a priority for UMI and the Agricultural Recovery Working Group has now become focused on areas identified in the Upper Murray 2030 Vision Plan.

Diversity enables resilience and the vulnerability of farmers relying solely on the stability of standard beef or milk prices is a catalyst for this group to investigate what options are worth exploring.

Research and consultation with experts

The future of the local beef industry must be secured.



from the beef industry have indicated that the Upper Murray region provides some of the best

grass-fed beef in Australia and there is an opportunity to value add. Some farmers are also interested in integrating 'on farm' processing as part of a broader business proposal.

Diversification into horticulture and the branding of Upper Murray cropping and produce is also part of the scope.

The working group will seek funding to develop an agricultural business plan that will explore different initiatives by researching, testing, and showcasing value adding and diversification opportunities and building on past experiences. It will also describe how the Upper Murray brand can provide a return on investment in local agricultural products.

On the tourism front, enhanced visitation experiences were identified as key to creating unique and sustainable tourism products during the 2016 consultation for the 2030 Vision plan.

The four areas identified were nature-

based activities; bike trails; high-country culture; and practices and farm gates.

Working with both Snowy Valley and Towong Shire Councils, UMI has been instrumental in projects including the Great River Road and its sculpture trail, which will soon have four new artworks added, the tourism guide and the Upper Murray Tourism Expo.

In 2022, UMI worked extensively with renowned marketing company US+US to create an authentic Upper Murray identity (pictured) that would help us stand out in a competitive industry without compromising the integrity of our extraordinary part of the world.

This included the update of the tourism guide already available and the Upper Murray website which will be launched very soon.

Meanwhile, UMI has agreed to be a partner in an exciting project called 'Innovation Upper Murray', that builds on

the substantial work in the Upper Murray 2030 Vision and the Community Recovery Plan.

Using a new place-based strategy in regional development and supported by Upper Murray Community Recovery Committee, Towong Shire Council, the Victorian Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action and RMIT University, the project's ambition is to champion exciting innovation opportunities derived from our region's unique strengths.

'Innovation Upper Murray' kicked off in February 2023 and an update on the initiative's progress will be available in the next few weeks to encourage further community contribution to develop the next steps.

From UMI's perspective, 'Innovation Upper Murray' is a unique opportunity to identify and support the implementation of projects that will help the region realise the 2030 Vision Plan.

The pong serves up justice

Corryong's annual Ping-Pong-A-Thon event last weekend returned to a 24-hour marathon format, with more than 30 men playing table tennis and being sponsored by generous donors.

That country spirit saw a total of \$7026 raised to support the fight against human trafficking.

Fathers and sons; school mates; grandfathers mentoring young men; men of all ages from 3 to 80 took up bats to fight one of the greatest injustices of this age.

Two participants - Michael Cremona and Craig Stephens (pictured) - stood tall playing the full 24 hours.

Many of the men had recently seen the movie 'Sound of Freedom' which confronts the reality of human trafficking through the true story of one man's fightback to rescue trafficked children.

Chief Relationship Officer of Ping-Pong-

A-Thon, Matt Maudlin, often hears, "Surely it's not happening in Australia because we're Western, we're advanced. It can't be happening, right?"

"Wrong, it's definitely happening here!" he said.

"Not only is the number of slaves worldwide double the population of Australia (more than 50 million and rising) but there are also humans being trafficked in and around our country."

The Pong's newest partner, HerSpace, is working to educate, engage, rescue and restore men and women in Australia who are trafficked in country areas onto farms as forced labour and in urban homes as domestic slavery, as much as those exploited through prostitution and forced marriages.

How do you eat an elephant? In the same way, Matt says the only way to avoid being overwhelmed by the enormous issue

of modern-day slavery is "to take one bite at a time. We're not naive," he continues.

"We're not for a moment pretending that \$4M completely changes slavery around the world but we always say that, as an individual, I can't do everything but I can do something. And my something just might be everything to one individual."

Pong organisers thanked Corryong IGA for supplying barbecue food, Corryong Courier for promotion of the event, CNC for the loan of a TV, Corryong Memorial Hall for the loan of an extra table tennis table and Cudgewa North Pastoral Company for display of the Pong banner on a large water tank.

"The people of the Upper Murray have again shown tremendous support," said organiser Craig Stephens said.

"We thank you all most

sincerely on behalf of some of the world's most vulnerable people who, one person at a time are finding their voices and

their freedom."

Student heads off for new experiences

Corryong College student, Pippa Galbraith, jetted out of Australia on Saturday for a visit to Nepal.

Pippa takes up the story:

Now, you might be thinking "wow that's pretty cool but why and how is she going! You're 16, in Year 11 and have never been overseas before!"

Well, in 2021, I went on Bogong Future Makers Camp, alongside all the other Year 9s in my class. I enjoyed Bogong so much that I applied for an extension camp called 'Murray Meander'.

I was accepted into MM and in September 2022, I set sail and paddled the Murray for 17 days. I made some of my closest friends on that camp and created memories I still reflect on to this day.

In January this year,

I was scrolling through Instagram and saw that Outdoor School had made a post advertising their 2023 extension camps. "CEDA NEPAL 2023" caught my eye. I applied, not thinking I would get in. Months went by and I still hadn't heard anything so I assumed I must not have been accepted, then an email came through telling me that I was. I was ecstatic!

In July, I went on a pre-camp where I got the chance to meet the other students attending. I left for Nepal with eight other students from around Victoria and three teachers.

In Nepal, we are going to be attending Kathmandu University High School, working with Rotary in a remote medical camp and attending homestays. We will also do a nine-day trek, adventuring through



remote Nepalese villages, meeting and talking to locals along the way. I am really nervous because I

have never been overseas but I'm also incredibly excited to challenge myself with this trip!

Council submits new business case

Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) has submitted its de-amalgamation business case to the Minister for Local Government.

The submission included a copy of the University of Newcastle's Report – Snowy Valleys Council - Evidence Regarding Advantages and Disadvantages of De-amalgamation and an overview summary.

SVC mayor, Cr Ian Chaffey, said that the submission was necessary to provide certainty for the

community and council staff.

"The stress levels of the community and staff warrant that the de-amalgamation proposal be determined promptly," he said.

"Council is of the opinion that Professor Drew's report clearly articulates the views and concerns of a significant

number of residents and ratepayers."

In July this year, Cr Chaffey and deputy mayor Trina Thomson met with the Minister for Local Government, Ron Hoening, to advocate for a de-amalgamation and they were advised to use the statutory pathway provided by the current Local Government Act.

Heard at court

The following matters were dealt with at the Corryong Magistrates Court last Friday.

A 41-year-old Corryong man had a matter of obtaining property by deception adjourned to December.

Two Corryong men - aged 34 and 49 - facing charges of serious assault and affray had the matter adjourned to December.

A 65-year-old Corry-

ong man pleaded guilty to exceeding the speed limit between 10 and 25 kms above speed limit.

A warrant was issued for the arrest of a 35-year-old La Trobe man for failing to appear in regard to a criminal damage matter.

A 39-year-old Corryong man had a matter adjourned to a contest in December in regard to multiple offences including theft and breach of an intervention order.
