Local business changes hands

The retirement of the owners of The Greengrocer in Corryong has provided the opportunity for a fledgling market gardening co-operative to expand its services to the community.

Acres and Acres Co-op, comprising a network of local growers, has

signed a lease to operate the produce retail business to ensure an independent greengrocer retains a presence in the town.

The Greengrocer has supported and been an important asset to the Upper Murray community for the past 23 years. Steve and Julie Jarvis and their family have been a

constant presence not just in the fruit and vegie business but in so many other ways and have always had their doors open in times of need.

This was especially so during the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires and the pandemic lockdowns.

Adventurer killed in light plane crash

Emergency services have been attempting to retrieve the body of a pilot who lost his life when his aircraft crashed in dense bushland west of Lucyvale.

The light plane departed Mount Beauty Airport around midday on

Sunday but failed to arrive at its scheduled destination in Wollongong.

Communication with the pilot, named as Matthew Farrell of Tawonga, was lost at 12.41pm and the Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) then led an extensive search between Mt Beauty and Corryong.

The weather conditions in the area were very poor and visibility was limited.

The Victorian Police Air Wing located the plane wreckage in rugged territory shortly after 10am on Monday and confirmed that Mr Farrell was dead at the scene.

The crash site is inaccessible by foot making retrieval of his body difficult.

The amateur pilot was a successful photographer and film maker and accomplished paraglider, polar explorer, mountain guide, surfer and cyclist.

The crash is the subject of an air safety investigation.

Emergency response tested in dry run

More than 40 personnel from a number of agencies assembled at the new Tallangatta Incident Control Centre last Thursday to prepare for the upcoming bushfire season.

Forest Fire Management Victoria's (FFMVic) oversaw the inter-agency emergency training day at the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning's (DELWP) Tallangatta office and depot which involved the CFA, SES and Victoria Police in a simulated fire north west of Dartmouth.

The exercise was designed for emergency service personnel to gain valuable experience in effective communication and incident management procedures. Incident controller, Aaron Kennedy, said the simulation was an

opportunity for FFMVic incident management personnel to test their skills and knowledge in an emergency response.

"It was also a great opportunity to test the Tallangatta control centre which opened in April last year," he said.

"We rely on these exercises as part of our preparedness routine. We try to do this every year across the region.

"We had a full incident management team working through a range of scenarios and thinking about how we can protect life and property."

Deputy incident controller, Brett Myers, said the emergency response went far beyond the fire front and included a range of work such as Victoria Police managing traffic into and

out of risk areas, Towong Shire Council opening a relief centre for impacted residents to seek refuge and Regional Roads Victoria dealing with melted roadside markers.

"There's more to fighting the fire, than just fighting the fire," he said.

"The simulation had shown there were always elements of a response that could be improved on.

"Although it's training, it is actually quite real."

Mr Kennedy said fires were expected this summer, despite high rain totals.

"It might be a later start than normal but we know we'll experience grass fires particularly in our northern country," he said.

"And as forest fuels dry out, we know we'll experience bushfires."

Star pianist continues the grand tradition

As a singular treat for those attending the upcoming Strzelecki Exhibition in Corryong there will be a special piano recital by renowned musician Christopher Malek.

Malek is one of the finest international concert pianists of his generation and currently resides in Sydney.

Thanks to the poetic quality of his interpretation and extraordinary virtuosity, he is best known for performances of music of the romantic period, especially Chopin where he continues the grand tradition of the 'golden age' of piano.

Malek graduated with highest distinction for extraordinary artistic achievements from a special talents music high school in Warsaw, Poland.

He continued his studies at Chopin Academy of Music in Warsaw, Australian Institute of Music in Sydney and Vancouver Academy of Music.

A top prize winner at many competitions,



he won his first national contest at an early age of 10, which was followed by his debut with an orchestra. He received First Prize and Gold Medal at the Chopin Competition in Australia, First Prize at the International Competition in Poland, Second Prize at the International Chopin Competition in Europe, to name a few.

Since his early successes he continues to travel and perform around the world. Music

has taken him to more than 30 countries in Europe, North America, Asia and Australia. He made a number of archive recordings for radio and television, released CDs and DVDs and also played the title role of Frederic Chopin in a film about the composer.

In recognition of his achievements, he was awarded many government awards, most notably a Distinguished Talent Permanent Residency of

Australia.

Malek will be appearing during the Strzelecki Exhibition in Corryong which will be on Thursday October 6th (1.30pm to 4.00pm) and Friday October 7th (10am to 4pm) at the Corryong & District Memorial Hall - a part of the Royal Historical Society of Victoria History Month.

His Classical Music Recital will commence at 2pm and admission is free.

After the fires, Steve and Julie ran a pay-it-forward campaign where donors could purchase a fruit and veggie box or vouchers and donate them to affected families.

They have also allowed their shop to be used by local sporting clubs and not-for-profit organisations for fundraising and donations and stored equipment for them.

"It was humbling when they approached us through local real estate agent John Carkeek to ensure the local community retained an independent greengrocer," said Jacqui Beaumont

from Acres and Acres.

"A full-time retail outlet was not in our master plan but we scrambled and put everything we had into trying to find a way to make it happen and after much consultation and the support a Vic Health Food Hubs Grant, we pulled it off!

"Bricks and mortar premises will allow us to service many more people in the community, particularly those not online who prefer to buy face-to-face.

"We will also be able to stock many more fresh products from local producers within the North East. This will help support local jobs, new

arrivals, fair prices and healthy eating."

Acres and Acres started operating from the Hanson Street premises this week and volunteers will learn the business from Steve and Julie over the next couple of months.

"We will be conducting community consultations to find out what you want and need in your local community-owned greengrocer," Jacqui added.

"With this knowledge we will refurbish and stock whole foods, speciality items and much more.

"The Acres And Acres team is extremely excited to add another string to our bow."

What's going on in your neighbourhood

Recently we have been getting some comments on our social media posts which have made us realise that there are lots of people in our community who do not know what we do, how we do it or why we do it.

In response, we have decided to run a series of posts and articles which address the queries we get asked most often.

The Corryong Neighbourhood Centre (CNC) exists to support the Upper Murray community. We welcome feedback and are always looking for ways to improve our services and better meet the needs of the community.

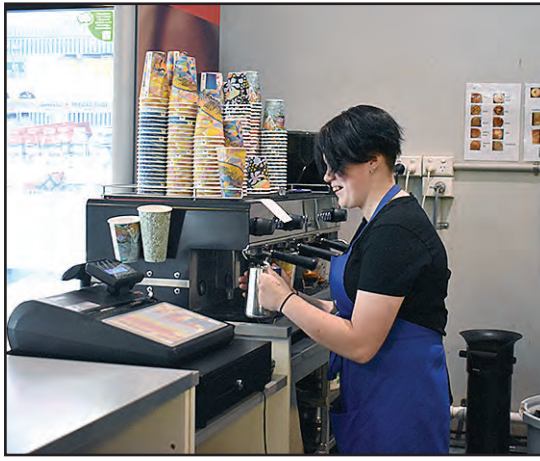
Let's start with what everyone is asking at the moment. Why is the bakery not open all weekend anymore?

There are two reasons why we have needed to reduce the bakery opening hours on the weekend to just Saturday until 1pm.

The primary reason is because we just cannot get the staff we need. We are in desperate need of at least one additional qualified baker. Gary Hogg is generously staying on past retirement to cover the Saturday baking requirements, a new adult baker is starting an apprenticeship next month and we have fantastic baking assistants but otherwise we have only one qualified baker.

We are also at least two reliable, experienced front of house staff short as well. We have juniors available to work on the weekends but not enough to cover both days and no-one to supervise them.

This is not just a question of giving the existing staff more hours. All our workers are doing as many hours as they can



and the CNC supports avoiding burnout and maintaining a good work and life balance.

The second reason is cost. The bakery is currently manned by at least two staff for 15-20 hours per day or approximately 55 paid hours per day – and it's still the quietest time of the year!

On the weekend, the penalty rates for this many hours make it completely unviable to operate without a significant profit buffer to cover the shortfalls. That profitability just does not currently exist.

We have endeavoured to stay open through thick and thin to provide a vital service to the community but the reality is that, like everyone else, our costs have increased enormously – including a 26 per cent increase in payroll costs, largely because we have taken great care to support our workers through the conflicting demands on their capacity to work and health issues all arising from the stresses of the past few years.

This, combined with a 16 per cent drop in sales over the past 2 years (rather than the 15 per cent annual growth we experienced for the preceding five years), has resulted in a very different financial landscape and has forced us to reduce or eliminate anything which does not

at least break even – and that includes Saturday afternoon, Sunday and Public Holiday trading.

We are making every effort to secure more staff and get things back on track and will open again on weekends and public holidays when and if it is sustainable to do so.
