Video service enhances health help options

Given the geographical challenges for people living in the Upper Murray and the need for timely, specialised and appropriate emergency health care, Corryong Health has been approved as an early adopter of the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department (VVED).

The VVED is a statewide virtual emergency

department operating 24 hours per day and seven days a week with daily specialist medical cover between 8am and 11.30pm and overnight nursing/ nurse practitioner cover from 11pm to 8am.

Consultations take place over video call with access to broader emergency medical teams including emergency physicians, pediatricians,

nurse practitioners and other specialists.

"This service will be used in partnership with our existing GPs, nurses and My Emergency Doctor," said Corryong Health CEO, Dominic Sandilands.

"Corryong Ambulance isalso using VVED.

"This service is not intended to replace existing health care

services or facilities but rather to complement them to enable greater access to our Emergency Department (ED), thereby extending the breadth of emergency services and responsiveness.

"Therefore, patients presenting to our Urgent Care Centre (UCC) will be receiving high quality care with access to a broader range of services.

During consultation the patient will receive clinical assessment, medical advice, treatment and where required, local referrals to appropriate services for ongoing management.

The patient or their medical treatment decision-maker will be provided with a brochure containing information about their consultation and recommended management.

An electronic feedback form will also be sent to their nominated email address.

Corryong Health will be given a discharge summary and other relevant treatment information post consultation.

The VVED clinician will complete medication chart and transmit this to the UCC/ED for use to administer medications.

If any prescriptions are required after the consultation, **VVED** scripts will be sent directly to the pharmacy closest to the patient or sent electronically to the patient (where possible).

The pharmacy dispensing the prescription will be responsible for management and clinical governance of the dispensation. The prescription should therefore be managed in line with relevant dispensing regulations.



The project has been given a huge impetus with a recent successful environmentally-focused grant allocation from Border Trust.

"The prime purpose of the morning was to display what a beautiful resource we have on public land right at our very doorstep and its potential to be developed







New bin rolls out

Thousands of Victorian households will be able to recycle more efficiently and divert tonnes of waste from landfill via the roll-out of the four-bin waste and recycling system.

Member for Northern Victoria, Jaclyn Symes, announced that Towong Shire Council receive \$40,377 for the introduction of kerbside drop off FOGO (Food Organics and Garden Organics) glass and service in May 2024. to achieve four stream services. The council will also update the landfill bin lid colour to red from light green.

The Victorian government is introducing a separate glass service to all local government areas by 2027 and a food and garden organics collection by 2030. By separating glass, Victoria will be able to recycle more glass into new products and recycle more materials from the mixed recycling bin.



Cudgewa veteran Greg Wheeler turned back the clock to kick

Tumbarumba is primed Ominously, neither played to win its first premiership in close to a decade when it takes on Cudgewa in Saturday's grand final but the Blues have a point to prove after losing the 2019 decider when hot favourites and the loss of the last two seasons because of the pandemic.

The Roos went backto-back in 2012 and 2013 and have been the dominant team this season, only losing one match to Bullioh back in round eight.

They have had the wood on Cudgewa in their four encounters to date but had a close shave in the second semi when the Blues stormed home only to fall short by eight points with the Roos' dual attack of Tyler Lampe and Dan Hitchens kicking 11 of their team's 16 goals.

Cudgewa will need to put some work into curbing the influence of the two sharpshooters but has had little success in this regard in three of their four clashes in 2022. in the Roos 72-point round 11 win, although the Blues were also down in strength

Cudgewa showed in the preliminary final that they are capable of racking up a big score and a shootout may be their best chance of turning the tables on the flag favourites if they can win enough midfield ball to feed their forward line containing the league's leading goalkicker Nick Brockley and wily veteran Greg Wheeler. The Blues will also hope Kylin Morey returns to the side to add some firepower but they will sorely miss the injured Ben Hall's opportunism at the goalface.

The onus will then fall on the Blues' onballers Craig Lieschke, Jake Vinge, Jack Ross and Luke Bloom to get first use of the Sherrin and push forward in support.

However, the Roos boast a potent combination around the stoppages in equal best and fairesr

winners Jacob Read and Jim Waters along with proven performers Connor and Quinn Clayton Rooney.

If the Blues are within a couple of goals at the last break they could spring a surprise but with the week's rest and at home, the cards are stacked in the Roos' favour.

Tumbarumba make it a double celebration when it takes on Cudgewa in the A grade netball decider.

There have mixed results between the two combatants this season including a draw in round 6 and the Blues were comfortable winners in round 11 by 12 goals. However, the Roos turned the tables in the second semi with a surprising 67-44 scoreline and the Blues will need to regroup to reverse that result but their greater finals experience and dual attack of Kirby Hillier and Sophie Greenhill may just get the job done.
