

The Upper Murray experienced widespread flooding following torrential downpours over the weekend with more than 100mm of rain falling in some areas in the 48 hours.

Council plan sets future direction

The Towong Shire's draft Council Plan 2021-2025 was recently endorsed by councillors and is now on public exhibition for community feedback.

The plan outlines the strategies and priorities that council will strive to deliver in the pursuit of the 10-year Community Vision - 'Towong Shire will be the ideal place to be: welcoming, vibrant and diverse communities with quality facilities and services.'

In developing the Vision and the Council Plan, comprehensive community engagement was undertaken including hands-on workshops in Corryong, Walwa, Tallangatta, Bellbridge and Mitta Mitta. These were supplemented by online and paper-based surveys.

Council has also relied on the feedback provided during the recovery consultation activities following the 2019/20 bushfires to develop the plan. More than 500 individual items of constructive feedback from community members were received and considered.

Towong mayor, Cr David Wortmann, is encouraging all Towong Shire residents to share their views on the draft

plan.

"Council was pleased to endorse the draft plan which includes many of the great ideas and constructive feedback that we heard from community members during its development," he said.

"We encourage everyone to take a look at the draft plan and share any feedback in a submission to council. The plan is developed once every four years and it plays a critical role in setting our direction and priorities for our council term."

Councils get unfettered funding

Local governments in the electorate of Indi have received their first 2021-22 quarterly payment through the Australian government's Financial Assistance Grant program.

Nationals Senate Leader and Senator for Victoria, Bridget

McKenzie, said the funding is untied, allowing councils to spend the grant according to their own local priorities.

"Local governments are vital to building safer and stronger communities," she said, "and that's why a total of more than \$5.9 million in quarterly payments have been distributed in North East Victoria."

"They are also an important delivery partner for the government's economic stimulus packages and play a critical role in our response to the pandemic."

Councils in Indi will receive the following quarterly payment:-

- Towong Shire Council - \$623,346
- Alpine Shire Council - \$541,702
- Benalla Rural City Council - \$564,119
- Indigo Shire Council - \$649,995
- Mansfield Shire Council - \$456,654
- Murrindindi Shire Council - \$648,733
- Strathbogie Shire Council - \$732,983
- Wangaratta Rural City Council - \$999,662
- Wodonga City Council - \$750,553

Assistant Minister for Local Government, Kevin Hogan, said "We know the early payment is a valued support to councils, particularly in regions that have faced the combined impacts of bushfire, drought, floods and Covid-19."

"Across the nation, local governments employ around 194,000 people and deliver a wide range of services in the cities, regional towns and remote areas of Australia."

"This support will continue to bolster Australia's economic recovery."

Water pump offer heats up

Mural will feature local landscape

The Man from Snowy River Tourist Association (MFSRTA) has engaged artist, Kirrily Anderson, to produce a mural to showcase the flora and fauna of the Upper Murray.

The association has been working with Kirrily over 2021 to workshop ideas on what should be represented in the mural.

"The devastation of our natural environment has affected us all and it was decided that we wanted to celebrate the great diversity of life which exists in the natural environment of the Upper Murray," said MFSRTA secretary, Cathy Ross.


"Kirrily has visited the area a number of times to see the effects of the Black Summer fires on our area and how the bush is regenerating.

The mural will be painted on the eastern wall of the High Country Trading Post in Hanson Street in Corryong.

"We would like to thank Donna Abbenate and Tom Young for allowing the use of the wall and Greig and Gladys Farrell for permission to access the adjoining block for the project," Cathy said.

The mural has been made possible with a CommBank Bushfire Recovery Grant.

The mural - inspired by the environment of the Burrowa-Pine Mountain

National Park - will be a representation of the local flora, fauna and natural features of the Upper Murray.

It will feature five key landscapes - alpine, moist gullies, rocky outcrops, dry slopes and waterways. The Cudgewa Bluff and falls and the Murray River will be featured along with more than 30 species of flora and fauna.

Many local school students will already know Kirrily from her work on a range of art recovery projects.

Painting of the mural is planned over the next month.

"We also thank the Upper Murray Farmers' Market for scheduling their October event (8th October) as a Friday twilight event," Cathy added.

"This will coincide with an official opening for the mural. We invite the Upper Murray

community to come and support the market on this evening as well as take the opportunity to have a closer look at the artwork and meet the artist."

Scott Thompson from Parks Victoria and Lyn Coulston from Upper Murray Landcare will also be in attendance to talk with people about the local flora and fauna.

"We plan to have some

food, music, face painting, casual seating and music to encourage people to stop, relax and reflect on the beauty of the Upper Murray," Cathy said.

Kirrily's artwork will also feature at a special exhibition at Albury's MAMA art museum over summer. This exhibition has been inspired by the effects of the Black Summer fires on the

Alpine areas including Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park.

"The tourist association is excited that following on from the exhibition in Albury, the artworks will be brought to Corryong's Davis Cottage for a special exhibition from Friday 11th March to Sunday 20th March, 2022," Cathy advised.

Students connect through creativity

After a challenging year in 2020 following the Black Summer bushfires and the pandemic, students from both Corryong College and Tallangatta Secondary College recently came together to reconnect and reflect through creative recovery.

Both schools are now home to vibrant, brightly coloured large-scale murals created by the students with the assistance of a professional street artist.

The project was brought to life thanks to a \$30,000 contribution from St Vincent de Paul Society and co-ordinated by Towong Shire Council's Youth Services Officer.

Council engaged 'Juddy Roller', an award-winning street art network, to help find an artist to create the murals and they recommended Melbourne-based artist, Damien Arena, who specialises in street art and large-scale murals.

Both schools put forward a brief of what

they would like to see included in the mural design, which Damien used to create a concept.

He then spent three days at each school workshopping the concept with the students and painting the mural together.

The artworks celebrate Towong Shire's rich history and flora and fauna as well as highlighting the emergency services organisations that supported the community throughout the bushfires.

The project gave students the opportunity to create something meaningful for themselves, their school and their community and will be able to be enjoyed for generations.

Towong mayor, Cr David Wortmann, thanked all of those involved in the project.

"I'd like to say a huge thank you to St Vincent de Paul Society for supporting our schools by contributing funds to bring the project to life," he said.

Lorna was born at the Corryong Hospital on August 5th, 1939; the elder daughter of Herb and Ruby Short and sister to Ruth Smedley. Lorna lived the early years on the family property at Indi.

Along with her sister Ruth, they rode their ponies some seven miles to school at Upper Towong.

In later years she travelled by bus to Corryong High School, then to Wangaratta Technical School where she completed a course in dressmaking. Lorna then returned home to work for Bacash Bros doing alterations to merchandise as needed.

Lorna married Trevor Crawford at All Saints Anglican Church Corryong in 1958.

They had five children -

Stephen, Leanne, Narelle, Sandra and Kerri. Lorna was very proud of all her family, their partners, 12 grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

Lorna had a very busy life, making a lot of the children's clothes and supporting them in all their school and sports activities.

At age 60, Lorna was still a competent horse rider and along with her sister Ruth, they completed Riley's Ride in the Man from Snowy River Festival.

Lorna was an outstanding athlete and netball player. She was invited to compete in an athletics carnival in front of royalty at Benalla in 1954, when the Queen and Prince Phillip visited Victoria. Lorna received



1st prize in the U15 girls and the silverware sits proudly on the mantelpiece of her home.

She was an active member of Red Cross, indoor and outdoor Bowls, Corryong Tennis Club and All Saints Anglican Church, serving 50 years with the Mothers Union.

Lorna loved watching her grandchildren and great grandchildren play their sport.

She had a creative flair

with dressmaking and knitting. In later years she excelled at mass producing colourful coathangers. Her family's days will be brightened every time they open their wardrobes!

Lorna enjoyed the family holidays beginning with caravan trips to Tathra, Torquay and Crowdy Head. Along with Trevor, they had some great trips within Australia to Sydney, Brisbane, Darwin and Kununurra to visit their daughters and families who had moved away for work.

In later years, Lorna's adventurous spirit took her overseas to New Zealand, Scotland and a wonderful trip to Israel and Jordan where she swam in the Dead Sea.

Perhaps the highlight was in 2002, with the

support of her daughter Kerri, Lorna experienced the amazing sights of Africa and Egypt on an eight-week trip which they both enjoyed immensely.

Lorna had a passion for gardening. Over the last few years, her health was tested and her family took some comfort that she spent her last few hours tending to her garden and doing what she loved.

BUSHFIRE RECOVERY BULLETIN

This bulletin provides regular updates and stories about bushfire recovery both in our local community and across Victoria's fire-affected areas.

Bushfire Recovery Victoria proudly works in partnership with council and the local community to support bushfire recovery.

SHORT-TERM MODULAR HOUSING

It's important that while you rebuild, you and your family have safe and suitable accommodation. There are temporary housing options available in Victoria.

Short-Term Modular Housing is one option available for those who lost their primary place of residence in the 2019-20 Victorian Bushfires. The program is flexible and aims to get people back on their land.

The Short-Term Modular Homes come in standard designs that accommodate most temporary accommodation needs. The design can be customised to meet specific needs such as mobility access requirements. BRV will work with recipients of Short-Term Modular Housing to understand and respond to specific needs.

To date, our Short-Term Modular Housing Program has delivered 57 high quality modular homes allowing them to stay connected to their communities while they rebuild.

30th September 2021 is the cut-off date for new registrations for Short-Term Modular Housing.

If you're residing in a Short-Term Modular Housing unit, the registration cut-off date doesn't affect you.

If you've registered for Short-Term Modular Housing and are waiting for it to be processed, the registration cut-off date doesn't affect you and your application will continue to be processed.

If you need to discuss your temporary housing options or are unsure whether you meet the criteria, BRV can consider your circumstances.

SUPPORT FOR REBUILDING AFTER BUSHFIRES

Rebuilding after a bushfire is a big job. Everybody has different circumstances and will make different choices, and that's okay.

We know that not everyone wants to rebuild straight away, and it is important that support is available when people need it.

The Rebuild Support Service (RSS) is a free one-stop-shop that provides support to people who are rebuilding.

Delivered by Towong Shire Council, the RSS has been designed for you to access at any stage of your rebuild.

Access:

- Dedicated planning and permit information, support, and legal advice.
- Advice from building experts.
- Information on financial assistance options.
- Information about other services you may be eligible for.

How the Rebuild Support Service (RSS) works

1. Register with the RSS. Simply contact your local RSS, either through the details provided below or by visiting your local Recovery Hub and you will be registered.
2. The RSS provides you with relevant support and advice from experts in their field to assist progression of your planning permit application.
3. Being registered with the RSS means you will also get to access other relevant and available supports you might not know about but may be eligible for, such as types of financial support.
4. The RSS will keep in regular contact with you through the rebuild process. The RSS is here to support you throughout your entire rebuild journey.

Draft Council Plan now on exhibition

The draft plan was endorsed by Council at its meeting on 25 August and is now on public exhibition for community feedback.

The plan outlines the strategies and priorities that Council will strive to deliver in the pursuit of the ten-year Community Vision.

Feedback from five community workshops as well as online and paper-based surveys and the bushfire recovery consultation has been used to develop the plan.





Firewood collection season opened

The Spring Firewood collection season is now open across Victoria, subject to pandemic restrictions.

Under the current rules, if firewood is essential for home heating or cooking people can travel to the closest designated firewood collection area as long as physical distancing requirements are followed.

Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVIC) Deputy Chief Fire Officer, Aaron Kennedy, said "It's important that people only collect firewood from designated collection areas in state forests or parks where collection is allowed and stay within collection limits.

"You may collect up

to two cubic metres of firewood per person per day and up to 16 cubic metres per household per year. This prevents households stockpiling large volumes of firewood and denying others a supply.

"Some designated firewood collection areas may not open at the beginning of the season for various reasons, including firewood supply or accessibility due to wet conditions.

"It should be remembered firewood is an unpredictable and finite resource and this is why we strongly encourage people who rely on firewood for heating and cooking to plan their firewood needs and explore all energy

options.

"If you are collecting firewood for essential heating or cooking, make sure you follow the public health advice by staying 1.5 metres away from others and wearing a fitted face mask," Mr Kennedy advised.

"Firewood collection from roadsides is managed by local government agencies and usually requires a permit. Residents are encouraged to contact their local councils directly for further details.

"Illegal firewood collection has negative impacts on forest health, wildlife habitat and the sustainability of firewood resources that local communities rely on.

"Where firewood supply is limited, priority access will be given to particular sections of the community such as local residents, traditional owners and those who depend on firewood for heating. This is managed at a regional level, so local factors can be accounted for."

Firewood collection maps are available online at www.ffm.vic.gov.au/firewood/firewood-collection-in-your-region. Financial assistance is available for people on low incomes who purchase firewood - for information visit www.ffm.vic.gov.au/firewood/energy-concession-and-support. The collection season will close on Tuesday November 30.
