
The bush festival plays a vital role in the Upper Murray community and it is greatly appreciated that it is recognised as such by government and supporting bodies.



Challenge competitors will take part in demanding tests of skill including a vet and gear check, stock handling, packhorse, bareback obstacle riding, horseshoeing and cross country riding.

Only the top ten competitors will take part in the daring final events - brumby catching (pictured) and stocksaddle buckjumping.

These will determine who will leave Corryong with the prestigious Modern Man from Snowy River title. There is also a Junior and Ladies section as well as a Striplings Challenge.

After a tough year of bushfires and coronavirus lockdowns, causing the cancellation of the 2020 Man From Snowy River Bush Festival, Corryong hosted a successful event last year - and all indications are the 2022 version will be even better!

The bush festival proudly celebrates our Aussie bush heritage for four days in the heart of the high country and the showcase event this year will be the 26th running of the MFSR Challenge.

The entertainment features musical acts on the live stage, headlined by Frankie J Holden and Wilbur Wilde and extends to a fraternity of highly talented bush poets, artists and photographers through to the dust busting action of the rodeo on offer.

This year's event will mark 26 years since the inception of the festival in its current format.

The iconic Man From Snowy River Challenge will once again be the main attraction, where 70 of the country's highest calibre of riders come together to compete for the ultimate accolade.

Local horseman, John Mitchell, is shooting for four titles after a hat trick from 2016-18 and is likely to have keen competition from his brother and former champion, David.

Other notable locals among the competition are Lachie Whiteley, Wendy Sheather, Brad Pierce, and



former junior challenge winner Travis Bandy.

Reigning champion, Morgan Webb will be defending his title in his quest for a third challenge title

In the women's division, Emma O'Shea will be striving for an amazing eighth consecutive victory.

The festival also pays homage to 'Banjo' Paterson's *Man From Snowy River* poem in a live re-enactment, with crowds watching 'in very fear' as mountain horsemen take on the steep and winding mountains in pursuit of 'the colt that got away'.

The dust busting action of the rodeo on Saturday evening showcases the best rough stock the country has to offer.

The festival will also feature a ute muster, kids party, street parade, bush markets, Aussie bush idol, bushman's whip crack competition and working cattle dog championships.

"The authentic nature of our festival, the spectacular scenery, the variety and high calibre of competition, entertainment and friendly

locals are the fundamentals that bring thousands of wanderers to Corryong," said festival co-ordinator, Jenny Boardman.

"To make sure you don't miss out on anything, purchase an official souvenir program."

Young guns show skills

It's not only the adults who get a crack at competing in one of the most prestigious challenge competitions in the country, - the kids also get a run!

Featured on the Sunday in the main arena will

be the running of the Striplings Challenge where riders aged between 10 and 14 years will compete in a 'mini challenge' that includes elements of all the preliminary events of the Open Challenge.

"We are very excited

to be continuing an event that encourages the younger generations both to be actively involved in their community and one that requires them to learn specialised horsemanship skills," said events coordinator, Maureen

"It's a fantastic starting block for them to begin their Challenge careers."

The event was won last year by Jessy Fox.

There is also plenty of room and time for other

poets and first timers to also 'have a go'.

The competition is keen particularly The Man From Snowy River recital. The first round has been judged pre-festival with three finalists reciting Banjo's famous poem on Friday at 6pm in the Lions Youth Hall.

Catering at Banjo's Block during the festival will be capably supplied by Kim and Greg in their Melting Madness Food van.

The festival will also host the Victorian Bush Poetry Championships

humorous 'Corryong

been judged before the festival.

Performance sections include traditional, modern, original serious and humorous and yarn sections which are woven around the festival core events. The 'Matilda' and 'Clancy's Choice' awards are presented to the Victorian Female and Male Overall Performance Champions.

Frankie J and Wilbur also bring to the stage their incredible skills and broad experience as allround entertainers, honed through their work in all the other areas of their long and successful careers.

The final act on the Friday is Blake O'Connor

who is bringing his exhilarating electric show to bush festival.

Having won Star Maker in 2019, last year Blake took home the prestigious Best New Talent of The Year Golden Guitar at Tamworth .

He has performed in Nashville, the UK and all across Australia making Blake a seasoned songwriter, guitarist and performer.

The entertainment continues on the Saturday night when Jade Gibson and The Viper Creek Band perform.

A North East native, Jade has spent most weekends over the past 10 years traveling all over the countryside, sharing her stories and songs. In 2022, Jade is hitting the Australian festival scene starting at Tamworth where she was a Toyota Star Maker finalist.



Relive 'The Man's' Ride



The Man From Snowy River Bush Festival is proud to again present the stirring re-enactment of Banjo Paterson's iconic poem at Thowgla on Friday at 10am (follow the signs from the western end of town).

The re-enactment of Banjo's famous poem 'The Man From Snowy River', is located in the Thowgla Valley with the mountains as the backdrop and the stage is set for an event not to be missed.

The re-enactment pays tribute to the men, women and horses of the past.

Bring your chair, sit back, relax and enjoy the pre-performance entertainment as the early settlers set up camp in their summer mountain hut.

Gates open at 8am and Guy McLean and his bullock team will entertain the crowd. At 11am Khancoban Station's Riley's Ride® group is welcomed, as the horsemen and women arrive from their epic journey.

The ride traces the last journey of legendary Upper Murray stockman, Jack Riley, who reportedly met Banjo Paterson in 1890 and is locally regarded as the inspiration for his famous ballad.

It is held to commemorate Jack Riley's life and

the part he played in the early days of this district and also to laud the efforts of those who selflessly sought to rescue him under harsh conditions.

After their arrival, the iconic poem then comes to life with an exceptional display of mountain horsemanship with the show beginning around 11.30am.

Jack Riley is buried at Corryong Cemetery and a granite headstone has been erected in his memory.

In 1995 the Upper Murray celebrated the centenary of the publication of Paterson's 'The Man from Snowy River and Other Verses' with a festival which has developed into an international event.

The final journey

More than 40 riders have rolled their swags and saddled up and are currently making their way from Tom Groggin Station, through the spectacular scenery of the Snowy Mountains and down to Corryong in time for the 2022 Bush Festival.

Known as 'Riley's Ride' the event is an essential element of the bush festival.

It traces the last journey of legendary Upper Murray stockman, Jack Riley.

This annual ride is held to commemorate Riley's life and the part he played in the early days of this district and also to laud the efforts of those who selflessly sought to rescue him under harsh and trying conditions.

Instigated in 1989, the ride offers spectacular views and the chance to meet people from far and wide, many which hail from different walks of life but share a love of the Australian bush and horses as well as deep respect for the pioneering families of the area.

It is a challenging ride and a character building experience, so congratulations go to the riders and organisers for another fantastic year.

Over the four day trek riders travel on average about 30kms a day and spend between five and eight hours in the saddle each day.

To book a place on the 2023 ride you can enrol at this year's Man From Snowy River Bush Festival. Bookings and a deposit will be taken on the Sunday morning of the event - contact the Festival Office.


